SUBJECT: Adopt Resolution No. 2025-51 Authorizing the City Manager to Execute a

Community Resilience Center (CRC) Sub-Recipient Agreement Between the City of Coachella and the Coachella Community Resilience Center Partners

Listed in the Executed CRC Grant Agreement Dated July 18, 2025

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council considers adopting Resolution No. 2025-51 authorizing the City Manager to execute a Community Resilience Center (CRC) Sub-Recipient Agreement Between the City of Coachella and the Coachella Community Resilience Center partners listed in the executed CRC Grant Agreement dated July 18, 2025.

BACKGROUND:

On July 18, 2025, the City of Coachella entered into a standard agreement with the Strategic Growth Council (SGC) for the Sub-Recipient Agreement Between the) grant award in the amount of \$10,00,000. The CRC Grant Agreement is strictly between the SGC and The City and not its partners. As part of the administrative process required for executing the CRC Grant Agreement, the City was required to enter into sub-recipient grant agreements with its partner organizations to memorialize their roles, responsibilities, and funding allocations in order to implement key components of the Coachella Community Resilience Center programmatic projects and plans. The sub-recipient agreements must be executed prior to the start of any grant-funded work.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

City staff is recommending that the City Council authorize the City Manager to enter into sub-recipient agreements between the City and its Coachella Community Resilience Center partners. The sub-recipient agreement outlines conditions for beginning work, reporting requirements, payment provisions, invoicing, monitoring and oversight, recordkeeping, compliance, insurance, non-performance, and other conditions. The term of this agreement is July 18, 2025 to March 31, 2029.
