DILLON ROAD OVER WHITEWATER RIVER (aka Coachella Valley Stormwater Channel) BRIDGE POSTING SIGN GUIDANCE & UNDERSTANDING BRIDGE WEIGHT LIMITS

The purpose of this document is to help the traveling public and road users

BACKGROUND

You may have noticed that the signs indicating maximum weight limits crossing our bridges have recently changed. They used to have three truck images with numbers next to those images' silhouettes which indicated the maximum gross vehicle weight (GVW) allowed to cross over those bridges per truck type. The units of the numbers represent tons (T).

CALIFORNIA STANDARD LEGAL RATING



These illustrations show legal truck loads in California, which control weight limits for:

- Short- (Type 3 Unit),
- Medium- (Type 3-S2 Unit), and
- Long- (Type 3-3 Unit) span bridges, respectively.

The "T" refers to weight in tons, and "K" refers to weight in kips (1,000 pounds or 907 kilograms).

However, the existing **Dillon Road Bridge over the Whitewater River no longer has the design capacity** to carry to standard legal truck loads. Thus, the **legal loads have been reduced** as shown in the previous page.
