WHEREAS, Maria Serrano was born in Tecolotlan, Jalisco, Mexico, had seven children and immigrated to the United States in 1967; and

WHEREAS, Maria was a lifelong resident of Coachella, was a founding member of the United Farm Workers, a veteran, a close collaborator of Cesar Chavez and had a deep devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe; and

WHEREAS, Maria dedicated her life to fighting for the rights and dignity of farmworkers; and

WHEREAS, in 1976 she co-founded the Justicia y Libertad committee which has since incorporated as the non-profit Indio Housing Corporation and she served as Vice President for 1984-85; and

WHEREAS, Beyond her advocacy with the United Farm Workers, Maria also worked closely with the Indio Police Department during a narcotic bust at the farmworkers camp off 42nd Street, helping to clean up the streets and improve the community's safety and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, her work and influence will not be forgotten, and her legacy will continue to guide and inspire future generations.
