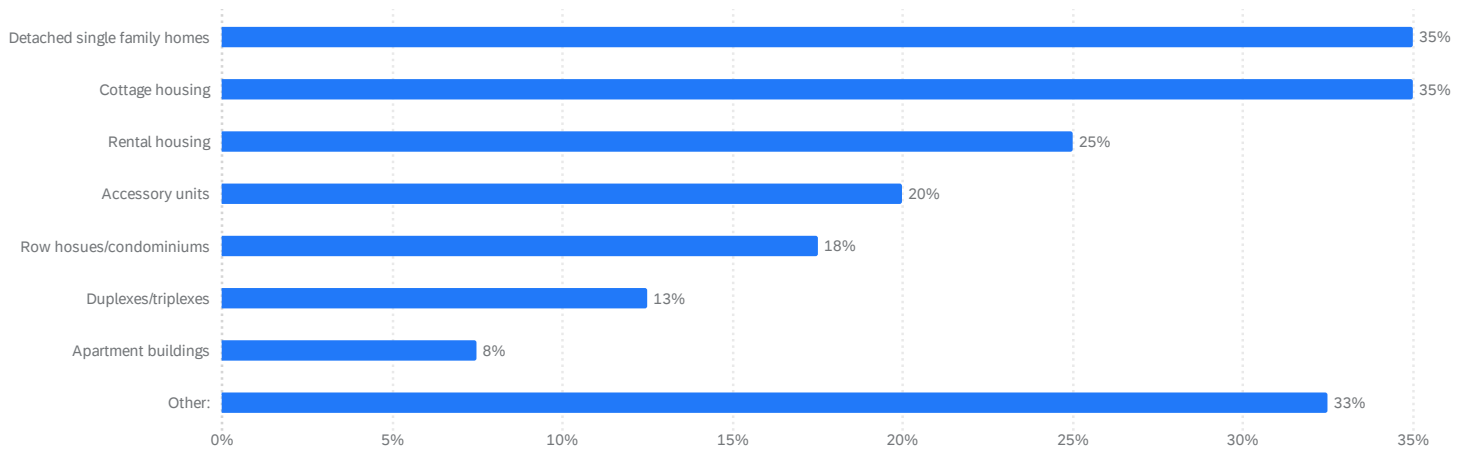

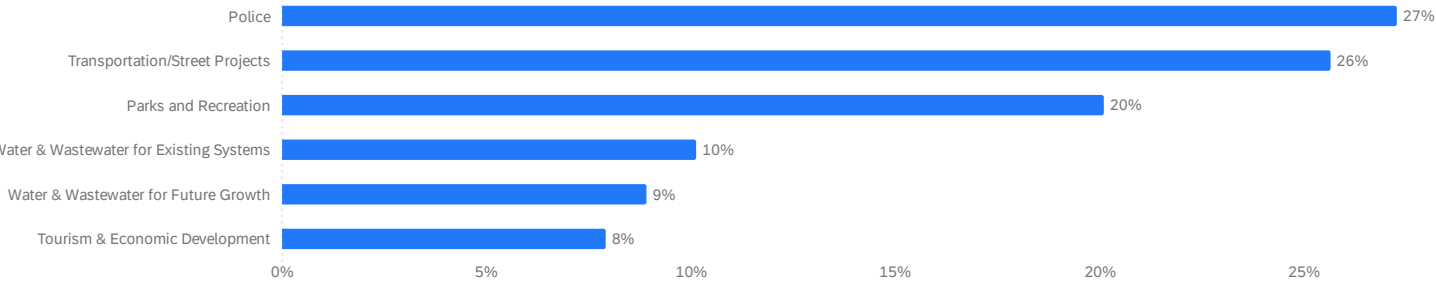

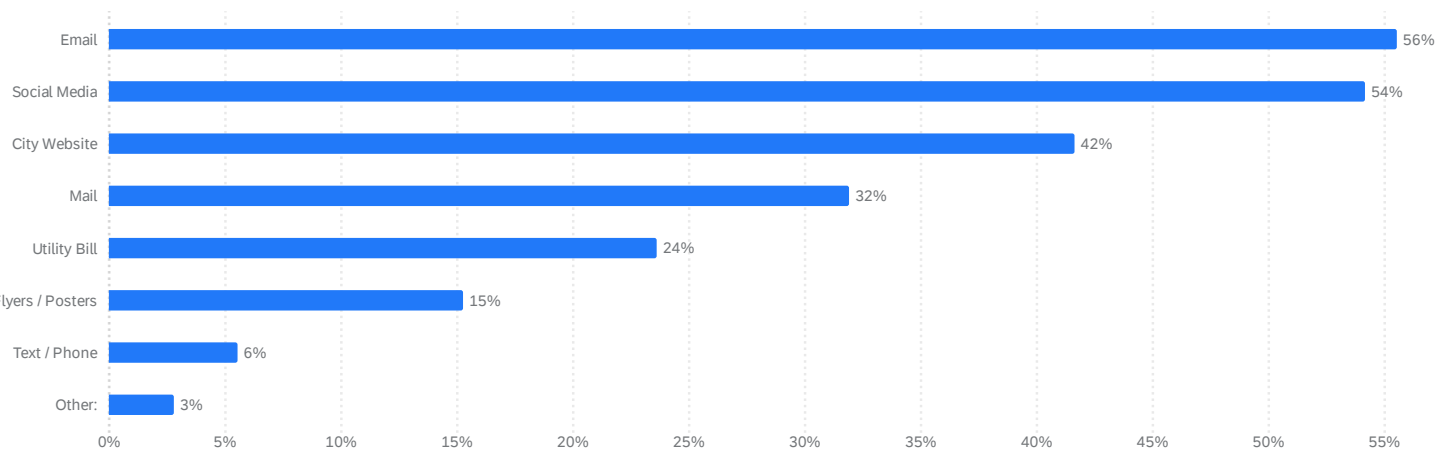
Average Desired Budget Allocation of Services 77 ⓘ

It makes me very sad to see our beautiful farm land being swallowed up by expensive homes. This type of progress is already ruining the small town charm of Coburg. Especially when those with big dollars come in and tell the rest of us long time residents how it's going to be done. One example is the new "mimosas" restaurant. Everyone in my social circle wanted a hometown café like we used to have, not another high nose, expensive restaurant. Budgets are tight for many of us and that is a hard pill to swallow.
