TOPIC: Pavement Preservation Sealcoating Project Agreement

REQUESTED COUNCIL ACTION

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "I move to approve the agreement with Paverite USA for pavement preservation Seal coating project in the amount of \$38,500."

BACKGROUND

As part of the pavement preservation plan, the staff identified the west side of Coburg for the seal coating portion of the preservation work. The project includes the contractor installing a commercial-grade slurry pavement sealer. They will secure the area of slurry seal with safety barricades, secure and cover drains per requirements, and set up a staging area. Contractor will clean the affected asphalt areas with blowers and powered brooms, and they will sweep with a vacuum truck to remove remaining debris. They then will install a slurry coat and supervise the drying process to ensure proper curing. Only one company returned a proposal to the RFQ that was sent out in June of 2023. Paverite USA presented a proposal for \$38,500. Paverite USA has until September 29, 2023, to finish all preservation projects.

This Crack Sealing Project will help preserve the integrity of the older asphalt streets and prevent major cracking in the future. **However, the** project does have the potential for medium to heavy traffic impact. We will work with the contractor and the residents that will be impacted by the activity.

BUDGET

The engineers estimated cost of the total preservation work is \$50,000. Paverite USA's proposal is for \$38,500 for the Crack Sealing portion of the project.

RECOMMENDATIONS AND ALTERNATIVES

The alternatives for City Council include:

1. Approve the contract as drafted. The contract will become effective immediately, and

end with final completion of the project.

- 2. Adopt an amended contract. Council may make suggestions for contract changes.
- 3. Do not accept the proposal.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

Once proposal is approved staff will start the public involvement process by letting residents know what to expect during the sealcoating process.
