Coburg Police Department Highlights

2025 Community Outreach

The Coburg Police Department enjoys a strong working relationship with the citizens of Coburg, surrounding cities and neighboring agencies. This is maintained by working with the public and partnering agencies through community outreach programs. The Coburg Police Department utilizes positive community policing practices such as bicycle helmet reward coupons, positioning of the radar/speed trailer, Shop-With-A-Cop, drug take back programs, Community Shred Day and National Night Out. Additionally, Coburg PD takes part in community events such as movie night and concerts in the park. Law enforcement/traffic enforcement is provided for other events as well, such as the Holstine Hussle, Coburg Light Parade, Antique Fair and The Coburg Car Classic.

Officers have also assisted other neighboring agencies, such as the Junction City Police Department and the Lane County Sheriff's Office with providing assistance with their Shop-With-A-Cop event and the Veneta Light Parade.

Operation Oregon Nights 3 – Sex Offender Sweep

On December 17, 2025, a team from the Coburg Police Department joined a task force made up of local law enforcement agencies, federal law enforcement and state police in an effort to contact sex offenders in the local area and bring them into compliance, issue warnings for registration, and arrest offenders who are not in compliance. The Coburg Police Department task force completed 12 checks which resulted in one arrest for Failure to Register as a Sex Offender, one citation in lieu of custody for Failure to Register as a Sex Offender, two warnings, six registrations and confirmation that two of the non-compliant offenders were deceased.

Chief Larson and Officer Wilson Commendation

The Coburg Police Department strives to maintain a positive relationship with Coburg citizens in emergent situations and in day-to-day common public needs. Recently, Chief Larson and Officer Wilson came across a couple in need of assistance while unloading a classic car. A note was sent to city administration and reads as follows:

“Recently My lady friend and I were in the process of offloading my 1969 Chevrolet Nova from a flat bed trailer. We were obviously having some difficulties and it was observed by

Chief Larson and his deputy Wilson as they were driving by on patrol. They quickly came to our aide and assisted us. This was greatly appreciated by friend and I. We really appreciated their observance of our situation and quick offer to assist. We would like to say many thank you's to them for their help."

Quarterly Trends

- **Agency Assists** – Personnel availability, including full staffing, has not only affected the Coburg Police Department, but almost every single public safety department within the state of Oregon. As winter weather makes its way into local commutes, there is usually an uptick in responding to vehicle crashes and/or injured pedestrians, due to poor weather.

The Coburg Police Department works hand-in-hand with the Coburg Fire Department, ODOT, Public Works and other law enforcement and fire service agencies to ensure calls for service are handled, even when staffing is short. This decreases the average response time for first responders and reinforces a positive and collaborative working relationship with regional public safety partners.

- **DUII Enforcement**– Throughout the year, Officers from the Coburg Police Department are equipped to handle DUII drivers. Generally, the winter months can be the busiest for DUII enforcement due to several factors. These include high profile sporting events, Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years. We combat this by utilizing our DUII grants which assist in paying overtime for officers who are out specifically targeting DUII drivers. Also, the Coburg Police Department displays a vehicle near city hall which has been involved in a DUII crash which results in the loss of life.

Police Statistics for Quarter Ended December 31, 2025

Coburg Police Department stats are divided into the following seven categories.

1. **Traffic/person stops**

Traffic stops, person stops, truck inspections,

2. **Patrol/business checks**

3. **Person Crimes/calls for service**

Assaults, rape, sex abuse, all other sex crimes, subject down, fight, menacing, all domestic violence crimes, welfare checks, harassment, runaways, suicidal subject, deceased subject, peace officer hold (POH Mental hold) etc.

4. **Property crimes/calls for service**

Theft, unlawful use of a motor vehicle, unlawful entry into a motor vehicle, alarms, criminal mischief, motor vehicle accident, fraud, criminal trespassing etc.

5. Society crimes/calls for service

DUII, reckless driving, unlawful possession of a controlled substance, disorderly conduct, illegal camping, assist public, all dog and animal issues, suspicious vehicle, speeding vehicle, suspicious conditions, abandoned vehicle, traffic hazard, ATL drunk driver, disabled vehicle, city ordinance violations, prowler, etc.

6. Warrant arrests/fugitive from Justice

7. All other crimes/calls for service

Citizen contact, assist other agency LCSO, OSP, Coburg Fire Department, follow up investigation, VIN inspections, training, court, special assignment, stop sign down, etc.
