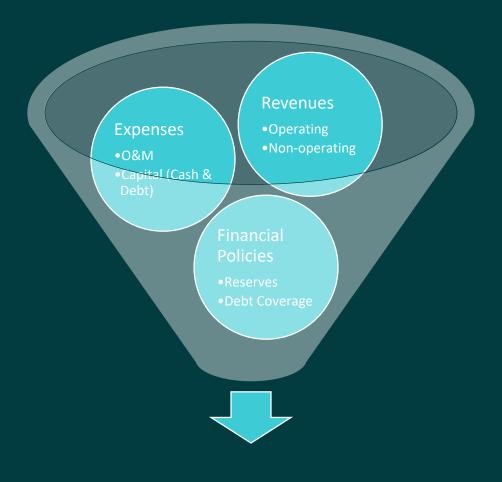

# Financial planning determines how much revenue we need to maintain a fiscally responsible utility

- Promotes financial sufficiency for the short- and long-term
- Accounts for future system needs
- Balanced by appropriate financial policies
  - Financial sufficiency
  - Debt service coverage
  - Capital project financing
  - Cash Reserves

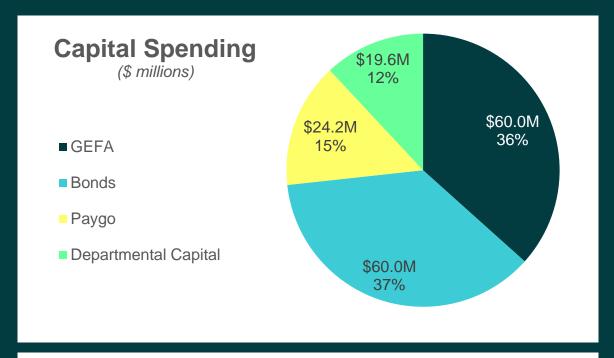
Capital spending focused on renewal of aging infrastructure and regulatory compliance

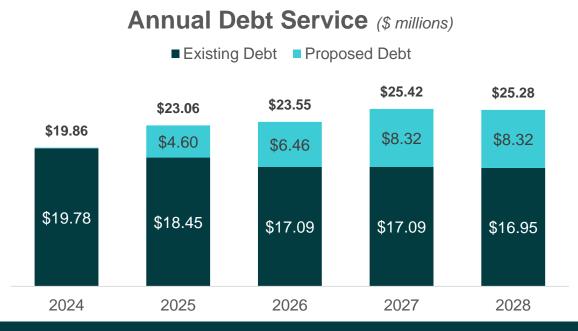

## Total Capital Spending

- Over \$150 million in capital investment by 2028 is required to maintain safe, reliable services
  - Long-term planning underway for SCWRF
- Proposed debt payments aligned with the retirement of existing debt





# Recent operating cost increases due to inflation and supply chain pressures are included in the financial forecast

#### Financial Plan Summary

- Extra \$50M bond issued in 2026 due to inflationary induced capital cost increases
- 4.95% rate increase in 2024
- Projected 7.95% rate increase in 2025
- Future years assume 4.95% rate increase across the board
  - Reviewed annually

#### Customer Assistance Options

- Existing Low Income Credit Program
  - Provides a monthly \$8.50 credit for qualifying residential customers (281 participants)
- Federal Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)
  - Temporary assistance administered by Enrichment Services
  - Amount of assistance is based on household size, income, and composition
  - > 1,700+ payments since Dec. 2022 for over \$1.1 million

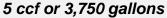
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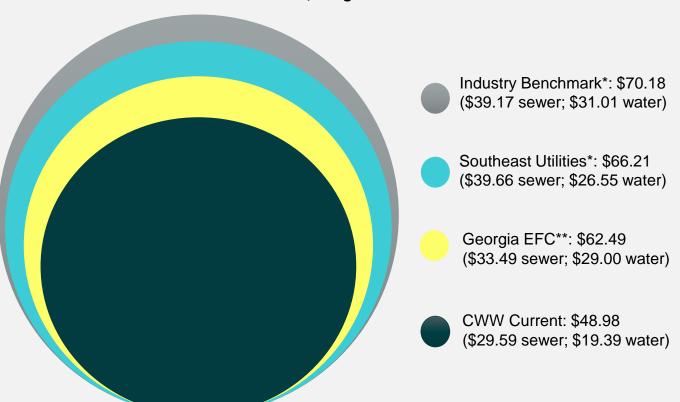


#### **Historic Rates and Benchmarks**

- CWW customers pay \$15-20 less per month compared with regional and national averages
- According to industry benchmarks, annual rate increases since 2012 have been over 5.0%
- CWW rate increases (including this year) have been less than 4.0% historically

#### **Customer Bill Benchmarks**





CWW service is less than 2¢ per gallon!

- Based on 2023 data from approx. 450 utilities collected by Raftelis.
- \*\* Georgia rates based on 2022 data from 376 utilities collected by UNC Environmental Finance Center.

#### **Proposed Rate Changes**

 Proposed 4.95% rate increase needed to provide safe and reliable drinking water

 Increase will add approximately \$2.42 to most customers monthly bill and less than \$3.29 to over 80% of customers bills

#### **Monthly Residential Customer Bills**

Water, Sewer, and CSO

Less than a \$3.29 per month increase to over 80% of customers

#### **Sample Residential Customers**



5 Ccf (3,750 gal)

Over 50% of residential bills are for 5 Ccf or less

8 Ccf (6,000 gal)

Approx. 80% of residential bills are for 8 Ccf or less

#### **Key Bill Comparison**

Water and Sewer

5 Ccf or 3,750 gallons residential bill – Proposed CWW Rates



Note: Rates for comparison communities are current as of September 2023, but do not include increases they may implement in 2024.

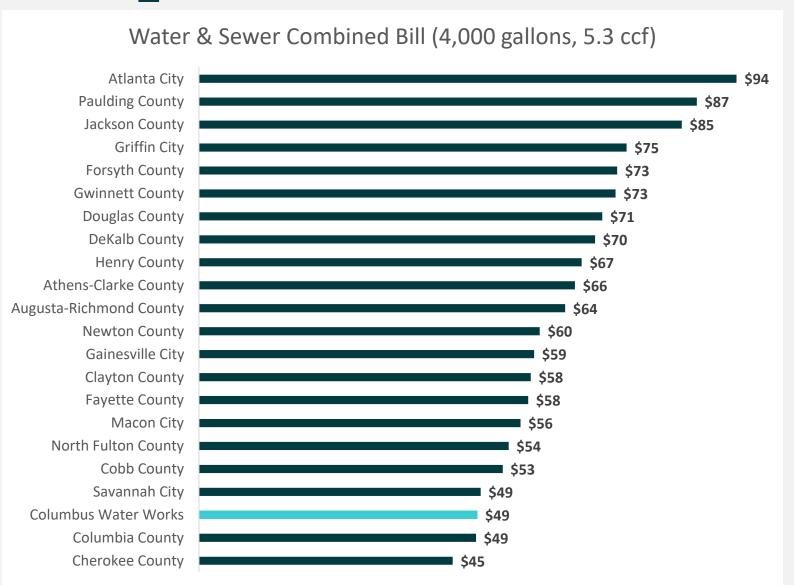

#### Peer Utility Comparison - Statewide

A 4,000-gallon bill in Columbus is lower than almost all its peers in Georgia

\*Data from survey is presented in gallons which is why the total bill is slightly higher than the bill presented on slide 22.

### **Summary of Changes Ahead for Your Water Bill**

- We are proposing an across-the-board 4.95% rate increase which will take effect on January 1, 2024
- Increase will add approximately \$2.42 to most customers monthly bill and less than \$3.29 to over 80% of customers' bills.
