AGENDA SUMMARY:	Approval is requested to apply and accept if awarded, and amend the Multi-Governmental Fund by the amount awarded up to \$300,000 from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The grant funding will be utilized to conduct Brownfield Assessments of properties and cleanup activities within the south and midtown areas of Columbus.

Recommendation: Approval is requested to apply and accept if awarded, and amend the Multi-Governmental Fund by the amount awarded up to \$300,000 from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The grant funding will be utilized to conduct Brownfield Assessments of properties and cleanup activities within the south and midtown areas of Columbus.

Background: The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has announced the FY 2024 Request for Brownfield Assessment and Cleanup Grant Proposals. Community Reinvestment has worked with Terracon to develop a grant application which was submitted to EPA on November 8, 2022. We were notified that were not selected as a recipient of the grant. However, we were encouraged to reapply for funding for the same activity and the same amount. The rewritten application will be submitted by November 13th, 2023. If awarded the Brownfield Assessment Grant could provide up to \$500,000 to conduct environmental studies and perform hazardous cleanup activities on properties located within Columbus, Georgia. The assessment will provide the City with information on the number of potentially environmentally contaminated properties that exist within the boundaries along the south and midtown areas of Columbus, as well as provide resources to mitigate potential hazards. This will be our first step in developing a plan for remediation in order for the properties to be redeveloped for future uses.

<u>Analysis:</u> If awarded the City could receive up to \$500,000 to conduct assessments of the properties within the south and midtown areas of Columbus to determine how many may be environmentally impacted. The report will be a useful tool for redevelopment purposes. On the back end of the funding, it could be used to potentially remediate some of the potentially identified environmentally contaminated properties.

<u>Financial Considerations</u>: There will be no financial impact. There are no match requirements for this grant.

<u>Legal Considerations:</u> The City Attorney will review all grant agreements prior to obtaining the City Manager's signature.
