As noted in the attached, the purpose of the supplemental payment is to provide additional Medicaid reimbursement to ensure access to ambulance services for Med enrollees. The supplemental payment is in addition to the claim payment a provider receives when submitting FFS (fee for service claims for ambulance services. The program was recently approving the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). The program has been effective for services provided on and after January 1, 2020. Participation in the program is voluntary and requires the city to provide information to Myers & Stauffer LC (certified public accountants) each year as the program administ in the form of a survey instrument. Twice a year, the City would provide an intergovernmental trans (IGT) to the state of Georgia based on the results of the survey of Subsequently, the Georgia Department of Community Health with make a Medicaid payment to the City that includes both the transferred funds and the matching federal funds. 	rgia icaid e) ved ved rator fer ata.

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			 Since its inception, the City has elected <i>not</i> to participate in the program (thus foregoing those dollars).
