SUBJECT: Take the City

INITIATED BY: Columbus Office of Crime Prevention

Recommendation: Approval is requested to enter into a one-year contract with Take the City to award funding for Crime Prevention initiatives.

Background: Columbus Office of Crime Prevention has agreed to recommend the funding of \$10,000.00 to Take the City in effort to rescue, restore, and empower women who have been trapped in sex trafficking, addiction, and domestic abuse.

<u>Analysis</u>: Funds will be used to double the size of the current ministry, including the impact and reach – getting women off the streets and out of a life that includes crime.

<u>Financial Considerations</u>: These funds are appropriated from the Other Local Option Sales Tax, Crime Prevention Program and do not require a match.

Recommendations/ Actions: Approve the resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a one-year contract with Take the City to provide funding for mentoring and quality programming for MCSD children.
