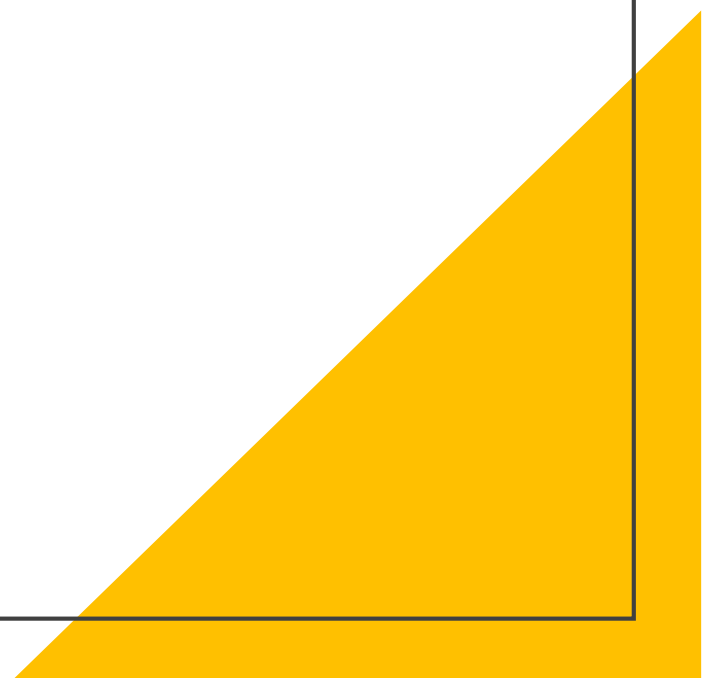


Standing Boy Creek State Park Update

Standing Boy Creek State Park

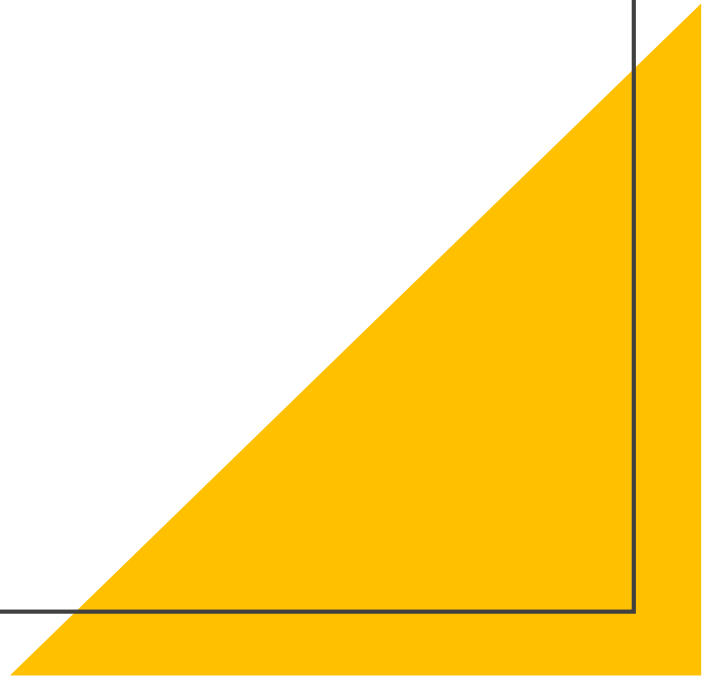
- 1,580 acres off the shores of Lake Oliver
- Located at 1701 Old River Road
- Owned by the State of Georgia
- Operated by Georgia Department of Natural Resources (DNR)
- Activities offered: Hiking, Mountain Biking, Hunting (Limited), Fishing, Birding

Standing Boy Creek State Park


- Standing Boy, Inc. (SBI) – 501(c)3 organization, Chair Blake Melton
 - Began discussions with DNR in 2015
 - Private funds to develop a Trail Network Master Plan
 - Private funds to begin implementation of the Master Plan
 - Presentation to City Council on August 13, 2019
 - www.standingboy.org

Draft Intergovernmental Agreement with DNR

- Under development
- Requires the city to be party to the agreement
- SBI will manage the park and trail system

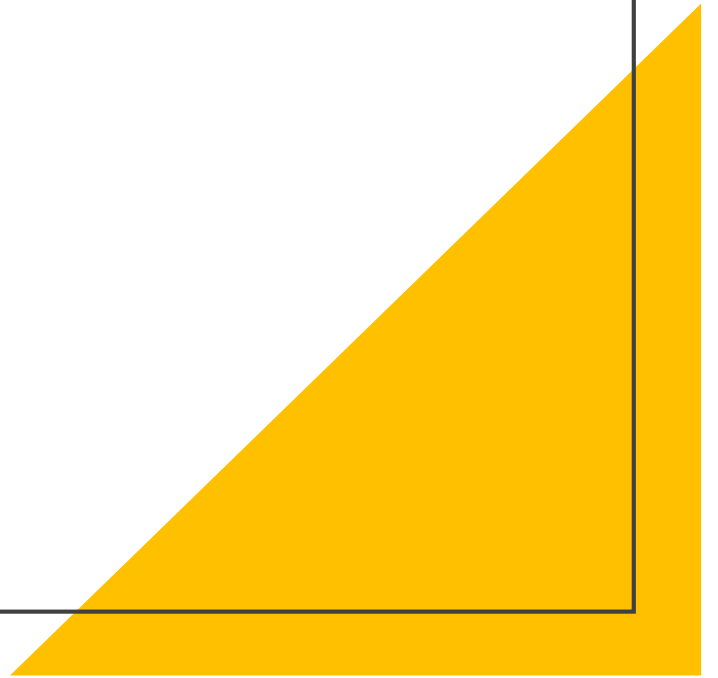


Key Factors in the Agreement

- Lease Term
 - Hours of Operation
 - Permitted uses of the park
 - Hunting
 - Parking Fees and Revenue
 - Responsibilities of the Parties
 - Participation of the Columbus Water Works regarding the Access Road
 - Liability and Insurance
