The purchase will be made via the City's existing annual contract for Pursuit Vehicle Buildout, PA13-0017A (Resolution #14-13), awarded to the vendor. Council approval is required because the purchase will be funded by OLost funds reallocation.

The Mobile Data Terminals will be placed in Fire and EMS Units and will be the direct line of communication for operations personnel with dispatch. These terminals provide real time call detail as well as location tracking. Personnel can access mapping data and hydrant location while traveling to a call. These terminals provide access to pre-fire plans and crucial data for decision making during emergency calls. Improved call tracking provides for improved dispatch efficiency and decreased response times. The Department's current terminals utilize old technology and often have connectivity issues with the new upgraded modems. Mobile Communications has recommended the upgrade of the units to maintain the connectivity of the terminals. The Panasonic Toughbook is the product recommended by CCG IT Department.
