

Current Fire Apparatus Inventory and Funding History

- E551 (2013) – Type 1 Pumper** First-out for all structural fires and rescue calls.

Funding History: A down payment was made using Strike Team funds, with annual loan payments made from General Fund revenues. The loan term was 10 years and was intended to revolve into a new apparatus purchase at the end of the term, maintaining a new first-out unit approximately every 10 years. In 2018, the remaining loan balance was paid off with Strike Team funds to reduce annual operating costs.

- E561 (2007) – Type 1 Pumper** Second-out for all structural fires and rescue calls.

Funding History: Purchased with Strike Team funds as a used Office of Emergency Services (OES) engine in 2025 to maintain adequate pumping capacity and operational standards. This acquisition was important in preparation for the City’s upcoming ISO audit.

- E552 (2002) – Type 1 Pumper** Reserve unit

Funding History: Purchased through a revolving debt loan with a 10-year term paid with general fund revenues. This revolving loan strategy was later continued and used to purchase E551 to maintain NFPA first-out replacement standards.

- E553 (2009) – Type 3 Wildland Urban Interface Engine** First-out wildland/veg fire.

Funding History: Purchased through a State grant program at no cost to the City’s General Fund.

- E556 (2019) – Type 6 Quick Attack Engine** First-out for non-structural fire responses.

Funding History: Purchased with Strike Team funds in 2020.

- T571 – (2020) BLS transport unit.**

Funding History: Purchased with Strike Team funds in 2020.

- T572 – (2007) BLS transport unit, reserve unit.**

Funding History: Purchased with Indian Gaming grant funds in 2007.

- C770 – (2018) Chief staff unit.**

Funding History: Purchased with Strike Team funds in 2018.
