

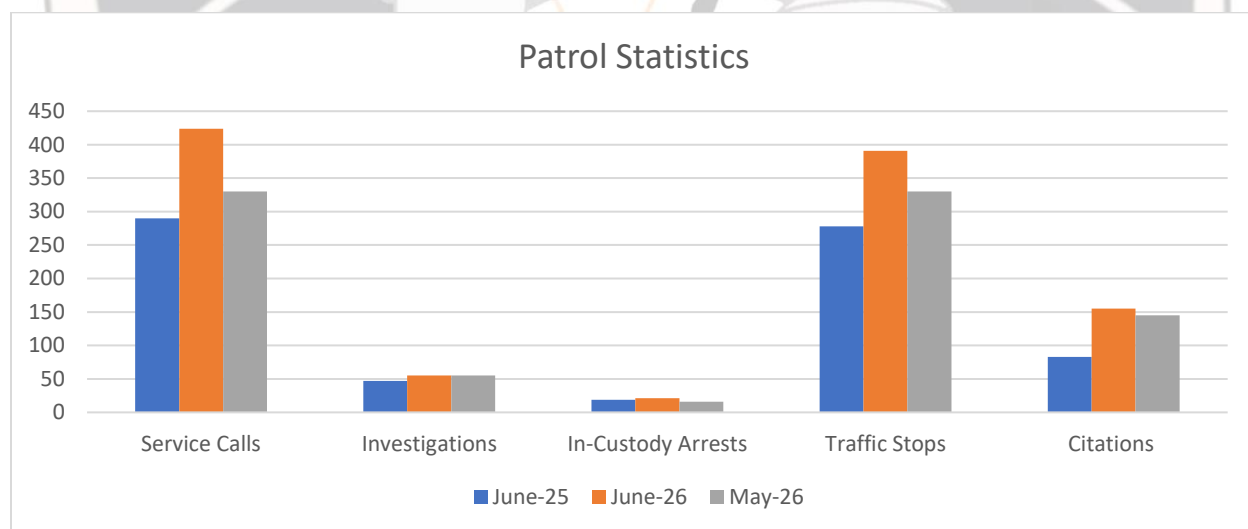

Monthly Statistics



- There were 424 calls for service for patrol officers with 27 agency assists. The call volume in June increased significantly from May by nearly 100 more calls for service. When you compare the statistics from the time of year in 2025, the increase is far greater. In June 2025, there were only 290 calls for service. Summer is definitely here!
- During the month of June, there were 21 in-custody arrests. There were 7 citations issued in lieu of the subject being booked in jail. There were 6 documented domestic violence related incidents resulting in 5 arrests. In June there were double the amount of domestic violence related arrests as compared to the month of May. There were 55 reports initiated.
- During the month of June, officers initiated 391 traffic enforcement stops. There were 155 citations issued. The citations were issued for various moving and mechanical violations. There have been an increase of citations issued for failing to stop at a posted stop sign as well as speed violations. There were 6 reportable traffic collisions, only 1 being with injuries. 'Hit and Run' collisions are not included in these statistics but instead are included in crime statistics. There were 6 DUI arrests.

- The Police Services Manager handled 83 calls for service during the month of May. These calls for service don't include telephone calls handled by the Police Services Manager. As a friendly reminder, the lobby for the department is open from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday and closed for the lunch hour. When the lobby is closed, police officers can still be dispatched to the police department to provide assistance.

Items of Interest

- COLUSA COUNTY FAIR/PARADE: This year the parade and fair went off without a hitch. The parade went smoothly thanks to the organization of the Lions Club. There were no significant incidents to report at the fairgrounds nor in the City of Colusa during fair weekend. Officers assisted CHP with foot patrols at the fair.
- FRAUD: There has been an uptick in various fraud related scams, some specific to crypto currency. Many of the recent scams involve someone pretending to be associated with law enforcement. Also, thieves will use email addresses that initially appear to be that of a well known organization/company such as Apple or PG&E however upon closer examination of the full email address will reveal the sender to be fraudulent. If you receive communications that you believe to be fraudulent and/or suspicious, contact the police department before sending any funds. Law enforcement officers don't collect financial debts.
- E-BIKES: The popularity of E-Bikes is on the rise and has been a hot topic on social media. Folks need to be mindful that as a rider of them, you must comply with the rules of the road. The same rules that apply to bicycles apply to E-Bikes. If you are under the age of 18, helmets are always required. Section 312.5 of the California Vehicle defines the various classes of E-bikes. Section 406 provides a definition of a motorized bicycle or moped while the definition of a motorized scooter is in section 407.5.
- DUI ENFORCEMENT: With the weather getting warmer, the fair around the corner, and all the summer festivities gearing up, be sure to have a designated driver should you partake in consuming alcoholic beverages.
- BOAT LAUNCH FEES: Please don't forget to pay your boat launch fees. Once you've paid for them, please remember to display the receipt in your vehicle (preferably on the dash). Officers will be checking for fees paid not just in the parking lot of the state park but also along Main Street and the other immediate surrounding areas.
