I. Fire/Rescue Incident Report (April 1 – April 30)

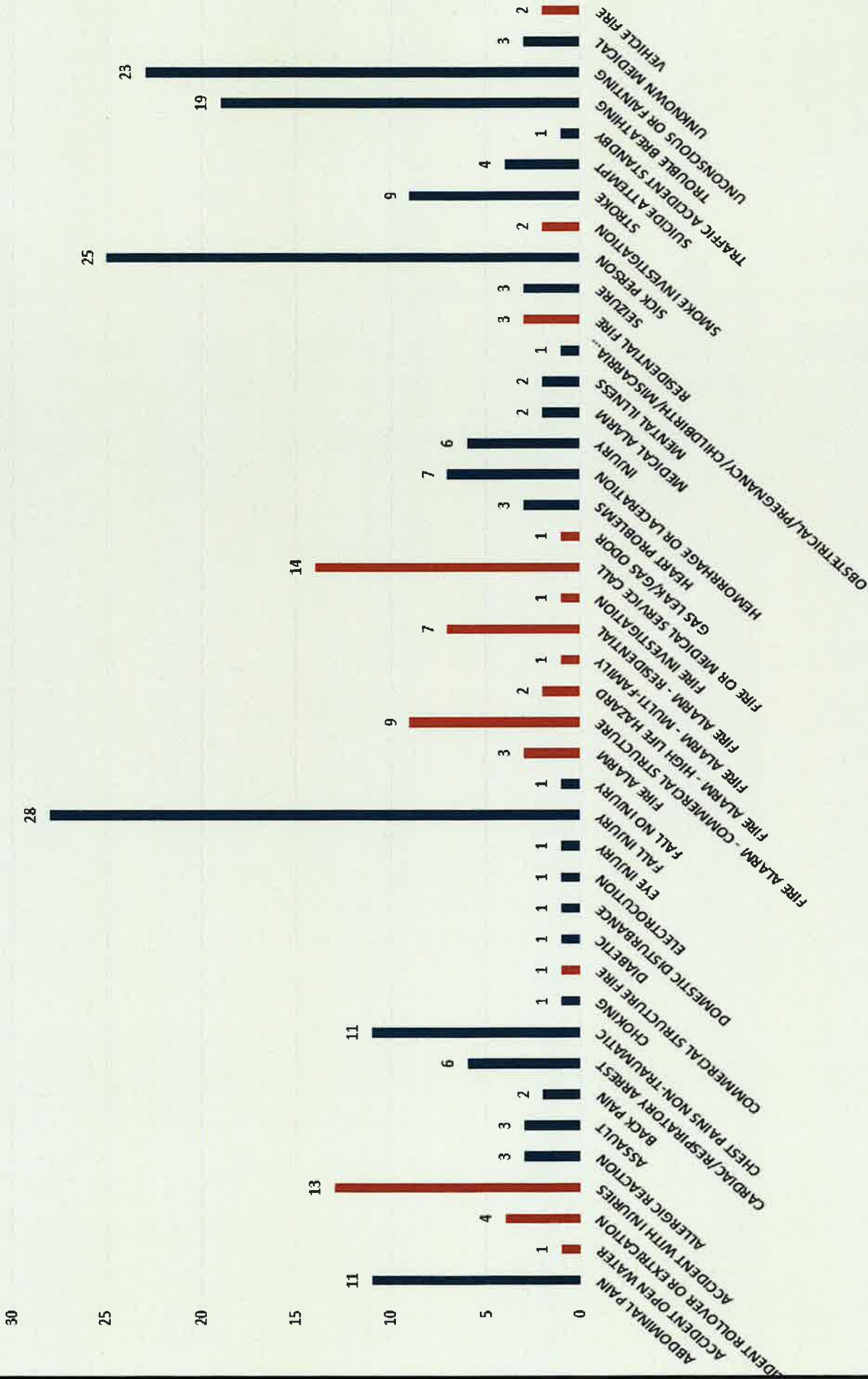
- a. Total Fire-Related Incidents 064

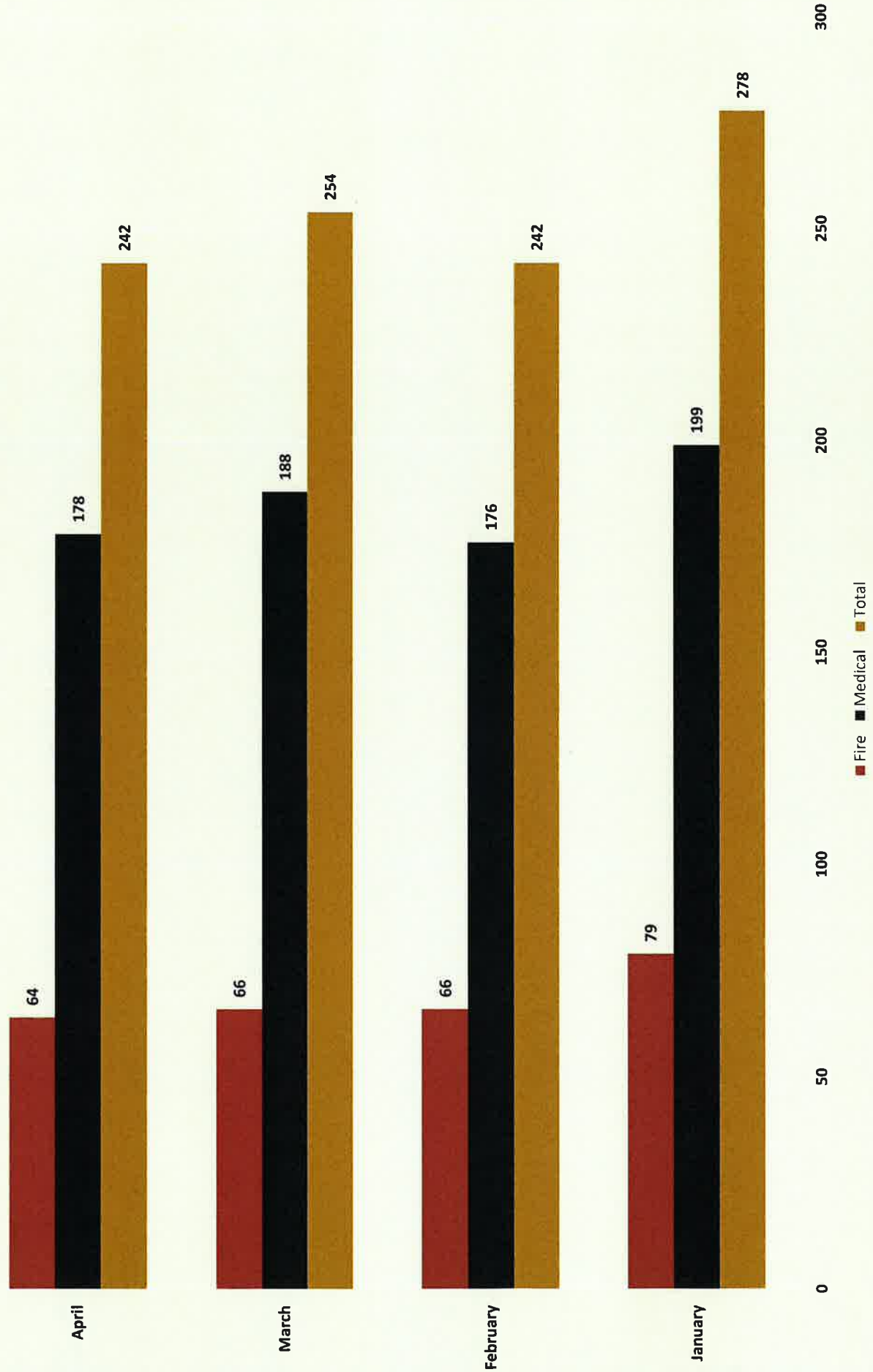

- The new rescue and new ladder truck are in the drawing phases.
- I attended the New Engine final inspection and acceptance test on April 18-21. Fleet Director, Victor Goizueta, and Driver Engineer, Joseph Boudreau, also attended the final inspection at the Pierce factory in Appleton, Wisconsin. Minor cosmetic issues were placed on the punch list and are being corrected. The installation of the anti-theft device is also being addressed.
- The purchase order was completed for the new hose. A partial order of in-stock hose is being shipped by Key Hose to BSO Logistics. The out-of-stock hose is being ordered.
