Rescue 228 - Frontline Unit was placed back in service July 9th

New Quint 28 Update: The vehicle is at Ten-8 to correct issues found while outfitting the apparatus. It is projected to be back at BSO Fire Fleet by Tuesday, August 11th. BSO Fire Fleet projects an approximate 2 ½ week timeline to complete the outfitting the truck with tools, hose, equipment, radios, traffic preemption and other items once it has been returned from Ten-8.

NEW Rescue 28 Update: The rescue vehicle was returned to Fire Fleet (6700 Powerline Road, Ft. Lauderdale) by the manufacturer with only some of the agree upon corrections completed. BSO Fire Fleet manager sent a detailed email noting what was corrected and the issues that remain. Matheny Fire and Emergency experienced an unexpected tragedy with the passing of their Service Coordinator, John Patfield which has delayed the process.

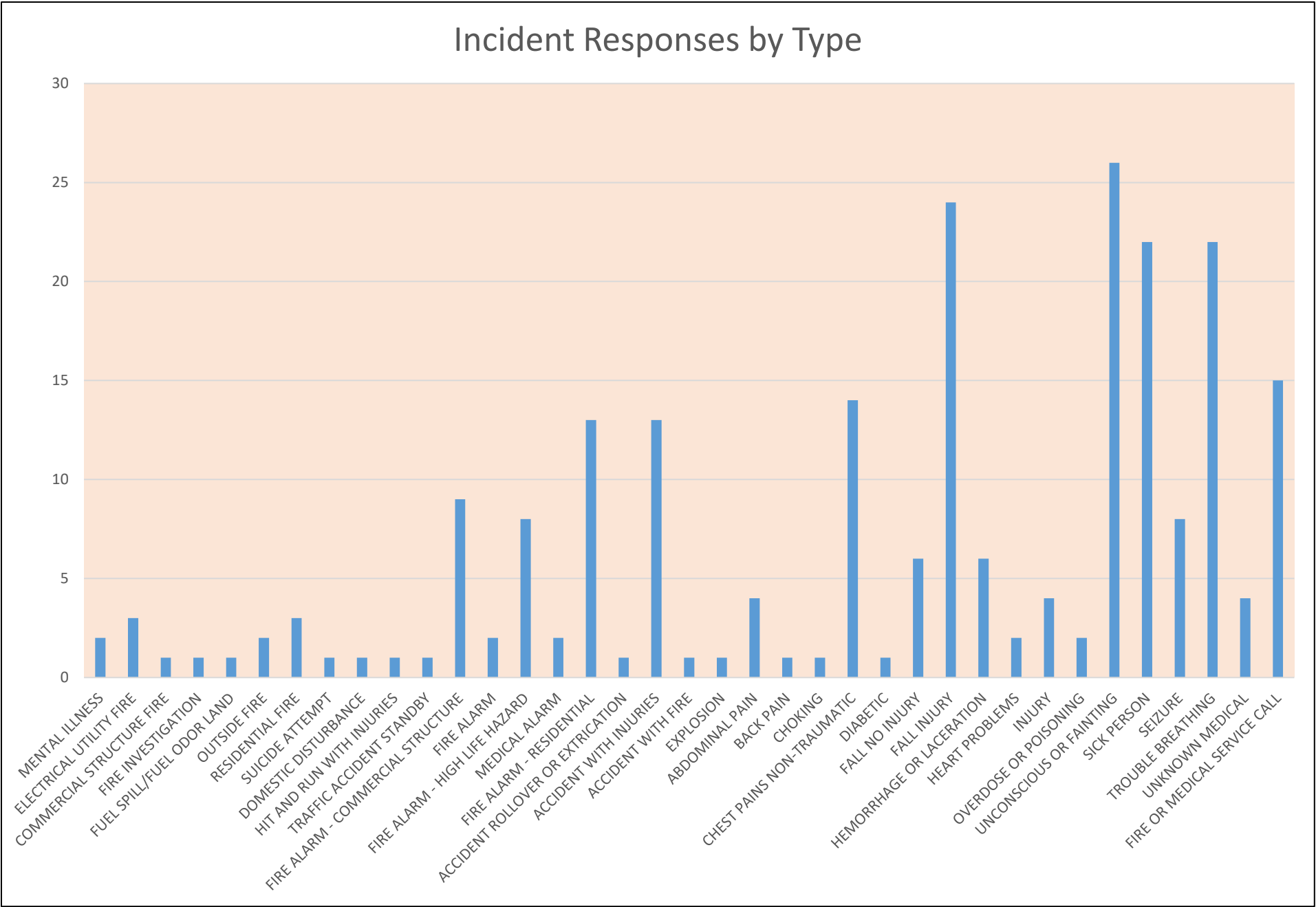

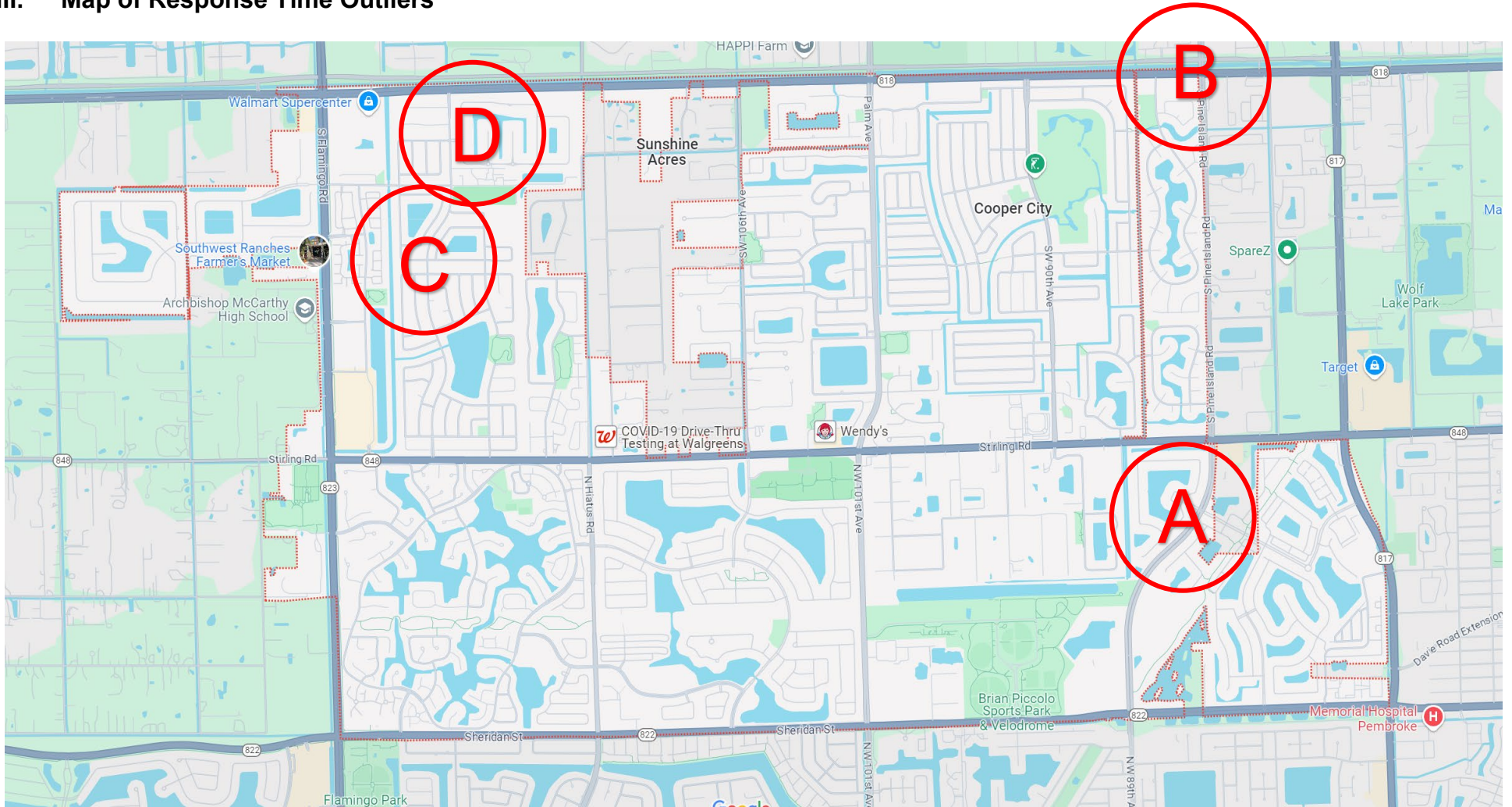
