TITLE: Resolution 25-26 (Administration)

DESCRIPTION: A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH EACH OF THE FOLLOWING THIRTEEN (13) FIRMS FOR ARCHITECTURE, GEOTECHNICAL, MECHANICAL/ELECTRICAL/PLUMBING, TRANSPORTATION & TRANSIT, CIVIL ENGINEERING, LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE, WATER/WASTEWATER/STORMWATER AND OTHER: 1) M.C. CITY MANAGER RECOMMENDATION:

The City Manager Recommends approval of Resolution 2025-26, to authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with thirteen (13) firms for architecture, geotechnical, mechanical/electrical/plumbing, transportation/transit, civil engineering, landscape architecture, water/wastewater/stormwater, and other services.

BACKGROUND OF ITEM:

The City of Cooper City issued a Request for Qualifications under RFQ 2024-1-PW to contract with various qualified consultants, from a wide range of disciplines, to provide general professional engineering services and similar services for various City projects, in compliance with the Florida Statute 287.055 known as the Consultant's Competitive Negotiation Act (CCNA).

ANALYSIS:

The RFQ was issued on November 1, 2024, and closed on January 21, 2025. Submittals were opened on January 24, 2025.

The services consist of a wide variety of disciplines, including but not limited to the following general categories: Architecture, Geotechnical, Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing (MEP), Transportation (Transit), Civil Engineering, Landscape Architecture, Water, Wastewater, Stormwater, and Other.

A Review Committee consisting of the City's Deputy City Manager, Utilities Director, and CIP Manager, met on April 1, 2025, to review and evaluate the 45 submittals (Exhibit "B"); after the evaluation process, the Selection Committee selected twenty-five firms to be short-listed. The City Manager selected and recommends thirteen (13) qualified consultants within their respective disciplines as presented in the matrix attachment, referred to as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by this reference.
