Subject: Fire Chief's Report – Commission Meeting May 13, 2025

The following is the Fire Chief's report for April 2025. The report highlights information pertinent to the city's fire safety concerns: Fire Rescue Incidents, Fire Apparatus / Station concerns, Fire Prevention, and Community Outreach.

There were four (4) extended responses. The longest priority 1 response, 10:52 was a result of units coming from a distance. The second delayed response of 10:02 was complicated by minor mechanical issues relating to air pressure. The third extended response time (9:02) was compounded by the lack of street lighting and obscured house numbers (referred to fire prevention for code compliance). The fourth extended response of 9:02 was due to distance and commuter traffic at that time of day.

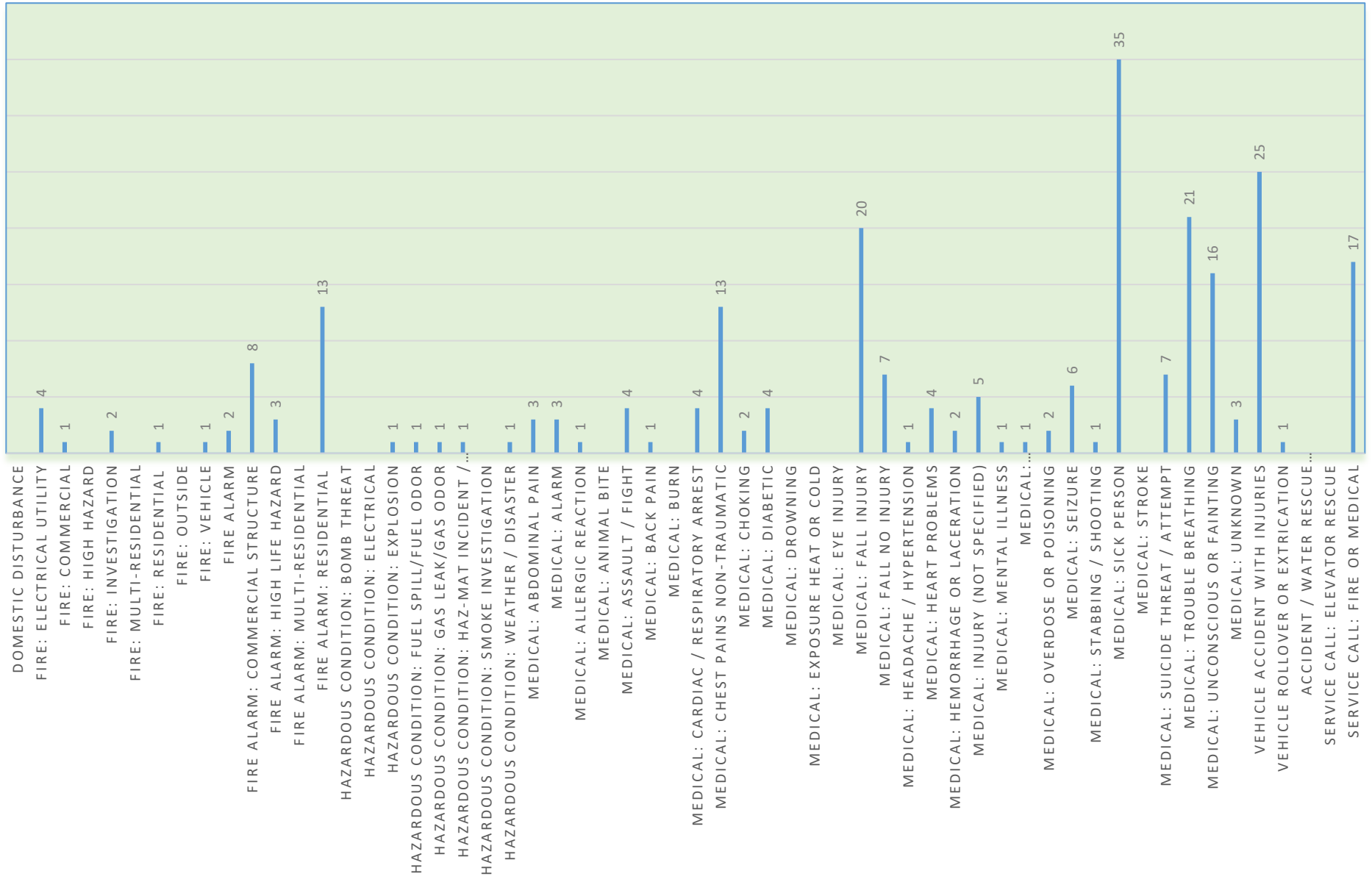

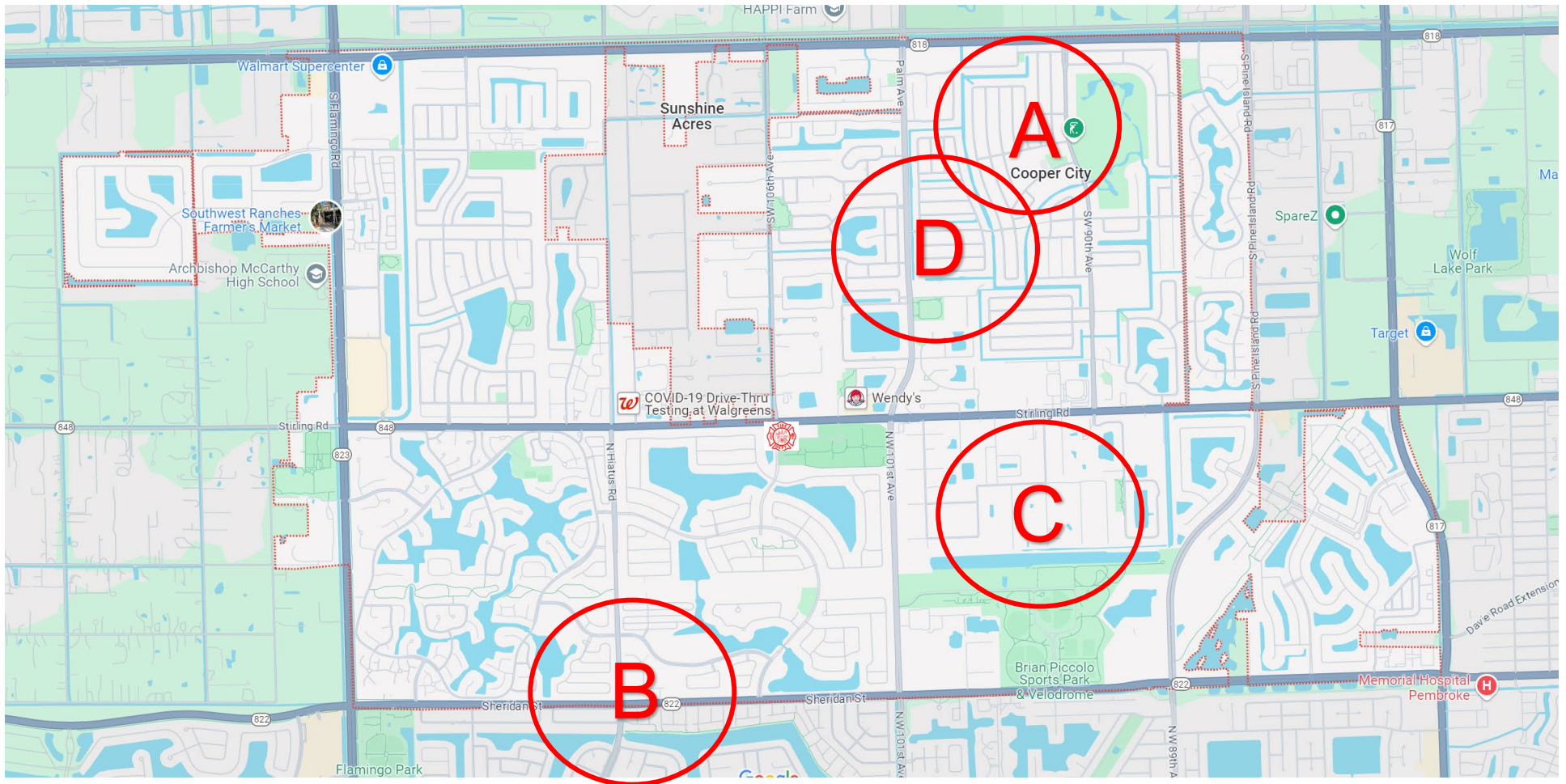
V. COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT
