



CITY COMMISSION ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION

TITLE: Resolution 26-32 - (Administration)

DATE: June 23, 2026

DESCRIPTION: A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, APPROVING THE SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLABLE MATERIALS PROCESSING AUTHORITY OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA; AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE OFFICIAL TO EXECUTE THE SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT; AUTHORIZING THE CITY CLERK TO PROVIDE A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION AND THE EXECUTED SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLABLE MATERIALS PROCESSING AUTHORITY OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RECOMMENDATION:

City Commission approval of Resolution 26-32 authorizing the Second Amendment to the Interlocal Agreement relating to the Broward Solid Waste Authority.

BACKGROUND OF ITEM:

The City of Cooper City is a participating agency of the Broward Solid Waste Authority. The City Commission has previously approved the Facilities Amendment to the Authority's regional solid waste disposal and processing framework.

On June 15, 2026, the Broward Solid Waste Authority transmitted notice that the Executive Committee recommended a revised Second Amendment to the Governing Board and that the Governing Board unanimously recommended its approval. The amendment must now be approved by the elected bodies of the participating agencies.

Because the City of Cooper City has already approved the Facilities Amendment, the Broward Solid Waste Authority has requested that the City place the Second Amendment on the City Commission agenda for approval as soon as possible.

ANALYSIS:

The Second Amendment includes two primary provisions:

1. It allows participating agencies to opt out of the Broward Solid Waste Authority in 2048.
2. It provides an additional opt-out opportunity in 2027, after the Request for Proposals responses from disposal and processing facilities have been received and the contract awards have been recommended.

The Broward Solid Waste Authority has advised that the 2027 opt-out provision is not contingent upon or tied to the Maximum Service Charges proposed by disposal and/or processing facilities.

Approval of the Second Amendment will allow the City to remain aligned with the participating agencies and the ongoing regional solid waste planning process while preserving the additional opt-out opportunities identified in the revised amendment.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no immediate fiscal impact associated with approval of the Second Amendment. Any future fiscal impact related to solid waste disposal or processing services will be evaluated as part of the applicable procurement, contract award, and implementation process.
