## **MINUTES**

## **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **ROLL CALL**

Present were Commissioners Shrouder, Meltzer, Pulcini, Green and Mayor Ross.

## **CHANGES TO AGENDA/EMERGENCY MATTERS**

City Manager Napoli advised we should ask for public comment before we start the budget presentation.

## PROCLAMATIONS/PRESENTATIONS

None.

#### **PUBLIC SPEAKING**

#### **Open Public Meeting**

Fernando Nunez, spoke on him helping the City and sporting event coming up in Orlando.

#### **Agenda Concerns**

Richard Dusharm, spoke on alternative ways to save money on the City's insurance plan.

Matthew Siber, Administrative Pastor from First Baptist Church of Southwest Broward, spoke on the fire assessment exemption for non-profits and the services his church provides.

Executive Pastor Paul Volan from The Pentecostals of Cooper City spoke on restoring the nonprofit fire assessment exemption and the services the church provides.

Commissioner Pulcini moved to bring forth a resolution at the September 13, 2021 First Budget Hearing to reinstate the fire assessment exemption. Mayor Ross seconded the motion.

Commissioner Meltzer advised the Resolution should go to the two public hearings with public speaking held and a decision then rendered.

Commissioner Shrouder advised the assessment is not a tax, but an assessment placed on the tax bill under non-ad valorem.

Discussion ensued on the exemption.

Commissioner Shrouder advised he wants to narrow the issue and we can use ARPA funds to help organizations who may have a hardship.

Mayor Ross spoke on memberships and collections reduced due to COVID-19. He recognizes the valuable work that the non-profit and religious organizations do in Cooper City.

Commissioner Meltzer states that he is disappointed in two of his colleagues that are process people.

Mayor Ross proposes creating a Mayor's taskforce that can collect information and facts that should be considered so that next year it can be truly addressed.

Commissioner Shrouder states that he would like to meet with the parishioners and see what their opinions would be on Cooper City funding it through another source.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Pulcini moved to bring forth a resolution at the September 13, 2021 First Budget Hearing to reinstate the fire assessment exemption. Mayor Ross seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote (4-1).

YES: Commissioner Shrouder, Commissioner Pulcini, Commissioner Green, and Mayor Ross

NO: Commissioner Meltzer

Jonathan Walmer, Executive Pastor of The Rock Church, spoke on the usage of their facility. He would like for the commission to reconsider the tax exemption.

Laurie Green, states she echoes everyone that came before her and asked commission to reconsider.

David Nall, spoke on the TRIM notices and the budget being placed on the website for public viewing.

Commissioner Shrouder inquires about a software to make items ADA accessible and put it on the website. City Manager Napoli advised we are looking into ADA compliant software.

Jimmy Goulet, spoke on Buddy's Bakery in the shopping center of Embassy Lakes and hopes the city can arrange some kind of grand opening for the shop.

Rabbi Pinny, discussed his growing members and that they do such good work in the city. Their money comes one hundred percent from the members of the congregation.

Commissioner Pulcini requested that both Resolution 21-35 and 31-6 be pulled from the consent agenda.

Commissioner Pulcini advised that all items with financial impact have the fiscal impact chart filled out on the agenda report.

Commissioner Shrouder would like the agreement for Resolution 21-35 to be executed in the owner's name and for Resolution 21-36 the notary needs to be corrected in the owner's name.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Pulcini moved to approve Resolution 21-35 to be executed in the owner's name. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (5-0).

**MOTION:** Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 21-36 with the notarization being corrected into the owner's name. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (5-0).

Consensus was reached for an opinion of title to be included on water and sewer agreements if possible.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Green moved to approve Resolution 21-37. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (4-0). Commissioner Shrouder was not on the dais.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Green moved to approve Resolution 21-38. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (5-0).

## **REGULAR AGENDA**

Motion to approve additional FDEM Grant dollars for wind impact resistant replacement windows and front doors at Fire Station #28 – Public Works

Commissioner Pulcini asked why the windows were not completed in 2019.

Public Works Director Ken Griffin said he believes there were not enough funds to pay for the windows. The City then made a request for additional grant dollars.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to establish a procedure to lock in prices.

Director Griffin advised we should estimate costs at the time the grant funds will arrive.

City Manager Napoli advised estimating with grants and inflation is crucial.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Green moved to approve additional FDEM Grant dollars for wind impact resistant replacement windows and front doors at Fire Station #28. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (5-0).

## Motion to approve a separate department for HR and Risk Management to include a director position – Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder explained we would have increasing needs with risk management and human resources with the potential police department and unionization. He would like to separate the HR Department from the City Clerk's Office due to the increasing needs.

Commissioner Green believes this is a step in the right direction.

Commissioner Meltzer advised we do need a separate department to take on the new employees if we take the Police Department in house.

City Manager Napoli believes this needed to take on potential new human resource needs.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve a separate department for HR and Risk Management to include a director position. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (5-0).

## Discussion and possible action on revising acting pay (as prescribed in the Personnel Policy Manual) – Commissioner Pulcini

Commissioner Pulcini advised interim directors and acting directors are sitting in positions longer than in certain situations. He would like to recognize the difference between a few days and months.

Mayor Ross would like to know the amount of days that will suffice a more than 10% increase.

Commissioner Shrouder advised this should be for a vacant director position as interim approved by Commission.

Commissioner Green advised in the federal level a vacancy in a supervisor level is handled by a process and the individual are compensated at the starting pay for that supervisory position.

MOTION: Commissioner moved for the city manager to recommend an interim to fill a vacant director position, and with Commission approval, that individual will receive the minimum of the range of the permanent director position. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (5-0).

#### **CITY MANAGER REPORT**

#### **Budget Transfer Notifications**

City Manager Napoli spoke on the transfer for the roof replacement for Utilities.

#### **CITY ATTORNEY REPORT**

City Attorney Horowitz had no report.

#### **POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT**

Captain De Giovanni spoke on school traffic issues. Parents were urged to arrive on time - not early - and to obey the traffic laws and posted signage. He reported that they began issuing citations this week for speeding and parking, stopping, standing rules in the city. Citations will continue to be issued. In regards to Code Enforcement, the commercial plaza initiative was successful. It is now in the maintenance phase of this project. The HOA initiative continues as well. The code enforcement city wide sweep was very successful with 27 warning citations and only five compliance citations issued. In regards to the crime report, news release will be updated. The man who broke into the flamingo townhomes was charged. In regards to community outreach, he reported that they are trying to relaunch the explorer program for the new school year and are looking to attract new participants. Lastly advised there are two vacancies, the community involvement position and one CSA with an applicant in process.

Commissioner Meltzer asked about running drones over the schools, which he stated was previously mentioned by Captain De Giovanni.

Captain De Giovanni reported as of today they were filming the school traffic in the morning and afternoon. Once they have all the footage, they will analyze it to identify better traffic flow solutions and compile a comprehensive list for each school.

Commissioner Meltzer asked if BSO is tasked with enforcing at the airport and Port Everglades. Captain De Giovanni confirmed. Commissioner Meltzer went on to inquire about when a car is parked at a terminal for more than a few minutes, what would happen.

Captain De Giovanni responded that at the airport there are people designated to move those cars along to the cell phone waiting area. Commissioner Meltzer suggested that the city needs that at schools. Captain De Giovanni states he is working with City Manager Napoli on a similar idea.

Commissioner Meltzer stated parents should not arrive early for pickup.

Commissioner Pulcini stated that COP members can sign up and assist with morning and afternoon drop offs.

Commissioner Shrouder thanked Captain De Giovanni and his team. He asked if there is a city ordinance that allows citations to be written. Captain De Giovanni answered yes.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on Renaissance Charter and cones being left out on the road and lane blocking. He also spoke on Franklin Academy using the security guard for traffic. He also advised Franklin Charter School is charging parents for late arrivals.

Commissioner Meltzer spoke on traffic congestion near Franklin Academy.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on a solution with obtaining an officer to work traffic.

Mayor Ross asked if we can address the concerns based on safety.

City Attorney Horowitz will look into options.

Consensus was reached to have the City Attorney look into options of having a traffic detail at Franklin Academy based on safety concerns.

Commissioner Meltzer requested a copy of the conditional use agreement.

Commissioner Shrouder would like staff to determine whether or not Franklin Academy is in compliance.

Captain De Giovanni has a recommendation he would like to share with City Attorney Horowitz.

Consensus was reached for staff to determine whether or not Franklin Charter is in compliance.

Commissioner Meltzer would like the City Manager to contact the school.

Commissioner Shrouder would like a letter drafted.

City Manager Napoli advised he will send a formal letter.

Mayor Ross spoke on traffic on Pioneer Middle.

Captain De Giovanni spoke on using the wrap around on Pioneer Middle itself.

Commissioner Meltzer spoke on potentially using the church near Renaissance Charter to help accommodate traffic issues.

Captain De Giovanni advised he made the recommendation to the school but it is ultimately up to the school and the church. Captain De Giovanni will speak to all parties if needed.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on the school zone on Flamingo Road as there are no walkers.

## **FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT**

Chief Bishop reported that there was a small fire in Embassy Lakes. Chief Bishop reported an increase in COVID calls. The call volume is up twelve percent from last month.

Mayor Ross asked the status of the apparatuses. Chief Bishop advised all apparatuses are in service.

Mayor Ross asked about replacement of the platforms. He advised Chief Bishop to have an answer at the next meeting.

Commissioner Shrouder asked for a shift roster and the cost to have the truck re-labeled with City of Cooper City Fire Rescue.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about the maintenance of fire hydrants and the difference from the past years. Chief Bishop stated that they start hydrants at the end of the year, but started early this year. All of the hydrants will be completed by the end of November.

The Commission took a ten minute recess.

#### **DISCUSSION ON FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022 BUDGET**

## Discussion on Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget - Finance

City Manager Napoli advised that they will go through a brief presentation followed by reviewing the budget.

CFO Sandra Bridgeman began the presentation and spoke on the 2021 general fund projections.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about the BSO pension costs not being included in the presentation.

CFO Bridgeman advised it is in the budget book. She spoke projections to date for fund balance.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about rollover expectations. CFO Bridgeman advised the report will be presented in September.

Commissioner Pulcini advised we have an ordinance that speaks to encumbrances and the report is be presented in August and September.

City Attorney Horowitz read Section 2.206 of the City Code that reads the City Manager is required to present a report to the city commission in August and September detailing all duly authorized appropriations that will be rolled forward into the next fiscal year.

Commissioner Meltzer advised the section might need to amended as now the budget is due early.

City Attorney Horowitz recommend adding the item to a future agenda for revisions.

CFO Bridgeman spoke on the citywide overview for funds.

Discussion ensued on the fire assessment fees.

Commissioner Pulcini advised ARPA monies can help the budget to assist in losses.

CFO Bridgeman spoke on major expenditure enhancements.

Commissioner Meltzer asked what methodology was used to determine the 4% merit.

CFO Bridgeman advised there are different anniversaries and not all employees receive merit.

Mayor Ross asked about the pavement expenditures. City Manager Napoli advised this is for resurfacing of Flamingo Road.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on additional potential savings.

CFO Bridgeman spoke on the beautification project costs.

Commissioner Pulcini asked if the analysis comparing the cost to do mowing in house opposed to bidding the item out was completed. City Manager Napoli answered no.

CFO Bridgeman spoke on operating expenditures and revenues by category.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about CDBG funds. CFO Bridgeman advised it is the senior transportation program.

Mayor Ross asked where the EMS charges are located.

Commissioner Shrouder what is comprised of the judgement and fines category as the numbers are increased over the actuals. CFO Bridgeman advised some fines are county that include traffic fines and others are from the City.

The Commission asked why there is in an increase for revenues in judgement and fines.

Commissioner Meltzer would like staff to do an analysis and bring back a more comparable number.

CFO Bridgeman spoke on items not included in the budget that could potentially be funded by ARPA.

The Commission went through the proposed budget book.

Commissioner Pulcini spoke on revenues for the SRO for Renaissance and asked if there will be an increase. He also spoke on the state shared EMS program and how it is hard to budget the amount. He also spoke on Recreation revenues and the potential of services not being at full capacity.

Commissioner Meltzer asked to be more conservative in the Recreation category.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on passport actuals for year to date for 2021 and 2019.

Commissioner Green advised we may need to adjust the numbers based on Covid-19.

City Clerk Sims advised she is comfortable with the numbers.

Commissioner Pulcini asked for a column for year to date actuals.

Commissioner Meltzer asked if we need to lower revenues for Recreation due to Covid-19.

Recreation Director Weiss spoke year to date revenue as of today.

Commissioner Meltzer would like budget revenues to be around \$350,000 and to revisit the department's revenues throughout the year.

City Manager Napoli understands the need to be more conservative but does not believe there will be a full shutdown.

Commissioner Meltzer would like to budget more conservative for revenues in Recreation.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on Optimist revenue.

Mayor Ross would like to revise the Optimist resolution.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to remove the cap on collection of non-resident fees. City Manager Napoli will bring forth a new resolution and increase nonresident fees.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about interest income being negative currently with \$50,000 being expected next year. CFO Bridgeman advised the investment account did not do well last year but currently it is recuperating. Commissioner Pulcini would like to budget less than what is proposed.

Commissioner Pulcini would like to take the interest income out of the general fund and put it in the special revenue fund for receipt of the ARPA funds.

Commissioner Meltzer would like to leave interest income at \$25,000 in the general fund.

#### **City Commission Department:**

Commissioner Meltzer would like to streamline the cellphone allowance at \$70.00 for all citywide.

No action was taken on the cellphone allowance.

Commissioner Meltzer would like to call travel a discretionary fund.

Consensus was reached to rename travel to discretionary.

Discussion ensued on the Auditor being moved out of the Commission department.

City Manager Napoli advised they will move the auditor out of the Commission department.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to create a separate department for the Internal Auditor.

Commissioner Pulcini spoke about a 26% increase in dues and memberships.

Consensus was reached to remove the United Way Gala and the Davie/Cooper City Chamber of Commerce Golf tournament.

Commissioner Pulcini asked if Commission will be under budget in Dues and Memberships. City Clerk Sims answered yes the previous budget had events that did not happen.

Commissioner Shrouder would like the money leftover to be rolled over to the next year. CFO Bridgeman advised the leftover funds typically move to fund balance.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to add a line item for contingency from unspent funds from the previous year and the Commission can decide what to use the funds for.

Commissioner Shrouder would like his salary and the balance left from travel to be rolled forward to contingency from unspent funds.

Consensus was reached to add a line item for contingency from unspent funds from the previous year and the Commission can decide what to use the funds for and to have Commissioner Shrouder's salary and leftover funds not spent from travel to be rolled over.

#### **Administration:**

Commissioner Pulcini advised the total budget increased.

Commissioner Meltzer advised wages increased.

City Manager Napoli advised it is due to the communications coordinator position.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if Quest Communications is necessary now that the City has a communications coordinator position.

City Manager Napoli believes the service is still needed currently in the future we can look into possibly moving those service in-house.

#### **City Clerk Department:**

Commissioner Meltzer advised salary increased.

Commissioner Shrouder advised it is more as one position is funded 30% from the parking lot fund.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested that instead of a part-time position in Clerk shift the parking lot tasks out have the fulltime position clerk only.

Commissioner Pulcini asked why we are purchasing desktops when we just purchased laptops. He also asked if we can use ARPA funds to purchase desktops.

City Manager Napoli advised we can use ARPA funds for laptops only.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if we can use docking stations to use laptops opposed to desktops. Assistant Finance Director Mazzie said it would require additional hardware and infrastructure. Commissioner Shrouder would like to explore the option of using laptops instead of desktops.

Commissioner Shrouder advised there is an increase to salaries.

Mayor Ross would like to move the merit to 3%.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to give merit discretion to the City Manager worth 2% and he can decide who received merit.

Mayor Ross would like to cut the merit to 3%.

Commissioner Shrouder agrees.

Commissioners Meltzer, Green and Pulcini would like to leave the merit at 4%.

Commissioner Shrouder would not like to compound the merit.

Commissioner Green advised we need to compensate employees that do a great job.

Discussion ensued on employees working during the pandemic and merit.

Commissioner Pulcini advised the process of merit and pandemic pay needs to be revised. He also advised the evaluation for merit needs improved.

Commissioner Shrouder advised the open pay plan is flawed. Commissioner Shrouder advised the senior administrative specialist with more years of service makes less than the administrative specialist in the City Clerk Department. City Clerk Sims advised based on policies if a person is transferred into a new department based on no disciplinary action and they fall within the same range they retain their salary. Commissioner Shrouder explained that need to improve the flawed system.

Discussion ensued on the merit percentages.

City Manager advised if we are not increasing salaries it will have a significant impact.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to move to a step plan.

City Attorney Horowitz advised there is process per statute pertaining to bonuses.

Consensus was reached for 3.5% merit.

Commissioner Meltzer would like to add an item to a future agenda discussion on employees who are capped and the pay plan in a whole.

#### Finance:

Commissioner Meltzer asked to be notified when the accountant position is filled.

Commissioner Shrouder would like the new accountant to be notified prior that they will be used on the Police transition.

Commissioner Meltzer asked about the maintenance contract increase. CFO Bridgeman advised it is IT related.

Commissioner Pulcini asked why desktops are being bought instead of using laptops. CFO Bridgeman will look into docking stations.

#### Legal:

Commissioner Meltzer asked about lobbyist costs.

Mayor Ross said he has seen the work and it is worth the cost.

Commissioner Meltzer would like more work to be submitted for the lobbyist to work on. City Manager Napoli advised a list has been sent.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to submit ideas to the auditor.

#### **Boards and Committees:**

Commissioner Meltzer does not support cutting board monies and he would like the Advisory Board Chairs to advise the Commission of their tasks.

Consensus was reached to fund the Boards to the amount they were funded in 2019.

Commissioner Green made a motion to continue the meeting to a later date. No second. Motion died.

#### Non Departmental:

Commissioner Pulcini asked that some items to be reallocated to the proper department.

Consensus was reached for the Finance Department to look into the items and reallocate them appropriate.

Discussion ensued on donations.

City Manager Napoli advised some donations can be made with ARPA funds and determine a criteria.

## **Community Development:**

Commissioner Pulcini asked about the Administrative Coordinator position that does business tax receipts funded by the building inspection services fund.

Commissioner Pulcini asked for the total for grant writing.

## Commissioner Green left the meeting.

#### **Public Works:**

Commissioner Shrouder asked to update the license check line to read CDL renewals.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about the hand held radios being given to park attendants and possibly public work employees.

Commissioner Shrouder asked why we pay for recycle carts. Operations Supervisor Tim Fleming advised it was Commission direction to use the blue bins.

Commissioner Meltzer asked to look into the Waste Management contract to see if there is a cost savings in using their recycle carts.

Mayor Ross asked about the reroof funds. Operations Supervisor Fleming answered it is for roof repairs.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about casual contract labor. Operations Supervisor Fleming answered it is for the LED light conversions and other contracts.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if we can do LED lights in house. City Manager Napoli answered some work cannot be done in house.

Operations Supervisor Fleming answered AC repairs, lighting, building doors and other repair contracts are taken out of this line.

Commissioner Shrouder advised there is a 60% increase and we need to have a savings.

Commissioner Meltzer asked why these were not included in the 2020 budget.

Commissioner Meltzer wants to look at items we can do in-house.

Discussion ensued on twp positions cut in 2019 in property maintenance.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on a chart from 2018 that does not show those positions.

Mayor Ross asked when we decide to use the contract for electric uses. Operations Supervisor Fleming answered it depends on situations.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to outsource property maintenance or do all work in-house.

Mayor Ross asked the savings on contracting out.

City Manager Napoli advised he will look into a savings.

Commissioner Shrouder does not want to outsource work when we have employees who can do the work.

Commissioner Meltzer wants to analyze taking more services in-house in all departments.

Commissioner Shrouder advised there is a large increase in contracted services and we need to analyze the situation.

Operations Supervisor Fleming advised we took in the HVAC maintenance in-house and ended the contract.

Discussion ensued on what was previously budgeted for HVAC maintenance compared to the cost of in-house.

Commissioner Shrouder advised there is a large increase in contracted services and we need to look at bringing services in-house or contracting all services out.

Commissioner Pulcini advised professional services in Parks and Streets increased 15% and 20%.

Commissioner Shrouder advised Parks should be separate.

Commissioner Pulcini said all the money allocated to Parks is not accurate as they do not just work in Parks.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about the increase in seed and sod. City Manager Napoli advised the fields were closed due to Covid-19.

Discussion ensued on field usage and increases.

City Manager Napoli advised the increase is due to the Beautification initiative and equipment.

Commissioner Pulcini explained the total Parks budget has increased greatly over the past three years.

Commissioner Shrouder and Pulcini would like to separate Parks from Streets.

Discussion ensued on resident and non-resident numbers for sports programming through the Optimist Club.

Commissioner Shrouder would like an update on nonresident numbers.

Commissioner Meltzer would like an analysis for costs on Parks and Streets separately. City Manager Napoli does not believe splitting the departments will save money.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to monetarily split the costs for streets and parks. Commissioner Shrouder asked if the park attendant's salaries have been updated.

City Clerk Sims advised that a revised pay plan will be coming forward for approval.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if Fleet Services is certified to work on the fleet that would become the city's should there be a potential Police transition and asked why there is a cell phone stipend in Fleet Services. He would like to request the records of the call logs related to the City.

## **Public Safety:**

#### **Police**

Commissioner Shrouder wants to discuss pension costs on a future agenda.

Commissioner Pulcini asked where pensions were budgeted last year as it was not list in Code Enforcement last year.

City Attorney Horowitz spoke on contract terms and the current litigation.

Discussion ensued on costs.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about budgeting for the police explorers and would like to add this to the budget.

#### Fire

Commissioner Shrouder would like to exercise the B2 clause and have 11 on at a time and obtain two more 9-5 employees.

## Recreation:

Commissioner Pulcini asked about vacancies. Recreation Director Stacie Weiss advised the facility coordinator position and the facility and recreation position.

Commissioner Shrouder asked to remove the program specialist position and move that individual to facility coordinator as the program specialist was just added a few years ago.

Director Weiss spoke on reorganization in the department.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about the cleaning contract. He also spoke on eliminating the 2 facility rec positions and making those 4 part-time positions. He would also like to reclassify positions and spoke on job duties being removed without pay being adjusted.

City Manager Napoli will look into coverage for converting positions to part time.

Discussion ensued on pressure cleaning and centralizing it.

Commissioner Shrouder also asked if lights for "Light Up Cooper City" can be done in house.

Operations Supervisor Fleming advised Public Works used to do the lights in house about seven years ago which took three weeks of staff time.

Commissioner Meltzer asked how many people total in-house worked on the lights. Operations Supervisor Fleming answered about five people for three weeks.

#### **Building Inspection Services Fund:**

Commissioner Pulcini asked about professional services at \$10,000. Community Development Director Carlos Vega explained these funds are for emergency purposes (should an emergency require additional staffing).

#### Road and Bridge:

Commissioner Pulcini asked about pothole filling costs and allocating wages to this fund.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about GIS funds and potentially using the county's GIS services.

Discussion ensued on pressure cleaning.

Mayor Ross wants an analysis on in-house pressure cleaning compared to contracting it out.

Commissioner Shrouder would like staff to pressure clean, mowing and maintenance work.

Discussion ensued on new signage.

City Manager Napoli advised this year we plan on painting the signs and in the future rebranding.

## **Tree Trust Fund:**

Commissioner Meltzer asked about additional contributions. City Manager Napoli advised the post office property potentially.

## Capital Projects:

Commissioner Meltzer asked about the loan payment and if it is possible to simplify the process. City Attorney Horowitz will look into the loan documents.

## 5-Year Capital Improvement Program:

Discussion ensued on MPO funds.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the pool is profitable. Recreation Director Weiss advised we have swim lessons and a swim team. Commissioner Shrouder would like to defund the aquatic program coordinator. Director Weiss advised she has an aquatic program specialist.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about windows for the fire department.

Commissioner Shrouder would like a job description for the aquatic program specialist.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about playground replacement and he also asked about a generator for the Pool and Tennis Center. City Manager Napoli advised it can be used as a recovery center.

### Parking Lot Fund:

Commissioner Pulcini asked that the storage lot facility rates be updated on the website.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on the increase in salaries. CFO Bridgeman advised a portion of an employee salary is being taken from the fund.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on the City Clerk's Office allocating funds for salary.

Commissioner Pulcini asked if pay is decreased when an employee is brought to a lower position.

Mayor Ross asked if the allocated salary increased from the parking lot fund.

City Clerk Sims spoke on the transfer of the parking lots to the City Clerk's Office.

Discussion ensued of increasing a salary and then removing duties and not reducing the salary.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on fixing issues regarding salaries. He would like to have a comprehensive review of salaries with a step plan.

Mayor Ross said we need to change the process.

Commissioner Shrouder advised we need to be more uniformed.

City Clerk Sims advised a pay study was in the budget for the next year but has since been removed for budgetary reasons.

Commissioner Shrouder would like the new HR Director to look at a study.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to see if video monitoring of the RV Lots can be transferred to dispatch at BSO.

## Storm Water Debt Service:

Commissioner Shrouder asked the utility foreman does. Utility Director Mike Bailey advised he does small jobs himself and oversees contracted labor.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about debt service principal and interest is the same as last year. CFO Bridgeman advised there is a schedule.

Discussion ensued on revenues increasing due to dry weather.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about maintenance structures increase. Director Bailey advised that it due to recoating a water tank and pump station.

Commissioner Pulcini asked about water meters not budgeted and asked that it budgeted for emergency. Utility Director Bailey will add them.
