MINUTES

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed for the loss of Commissioner Meltzer's mother-in-law Peggy Ann Mahank.

ROLL CALL

Commissioner Shrouder, Pulcini, Green and Mayor Ross. Commissioner Meltzer was absent.

CHANGES TO AGENDA/EMERGENCY MATTERS

Commissioner Pulcini asked to defer item 11 to be heard at the September 27, 2022 Commission Meeting.

PROCLAMATIONS/PRESENTATIONS

1. Education Advisory Board Presentation

Chandrally Mahajan, Chair of the Education Advisory Board spoke on The Official Cooper City Museum called Someplace Special. The museum will launch as a virtual museum and be phased into a physical museum. The Board would like to use the vendor CatalogIt that offers an online platform to provide an organized archive. The price for the vendor is \$799.99 for the annual museum subscription with additional fees for storage and users. The Education Advisory Board's vision is to host community gatherings, movie nights, annual volunteer and city employee award ceremonies and an art gallery. The Board is requesting \$1,536 annually on top of the Education Advisory Board's current budget.

Mayor Ross asked the Board's current budget. Ms. Mahajan answered \$4,000.

Commissioner Shrouder does not believe the funds should be a part of the Education Advisory Board's budget but be budgeted within the City.

City Manager Napoli said the Education Advisory Board worked hard on the project and it is a project the City can fund.

Commissioner Pulcini thanked the Board for their dedication.

Mayor Ross swore in Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley.

Commissioner Green asked about the windscreen code update recently passed. Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley advised the code was changed to not allow for screening besides at the law enforcement buildings. Commissioner Green asked why the facility needs the screening. Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley advised schools do have justification and a need for the screens. Commissioner Green said other schools may need the variance as well and he will support them.

Commissioner Shrouder said his intent on removing wind screens is due to aesthetic. He advised this property has a fence surrounding the playground and no room to plant hedges in lieu of a wind screen. This variance qualifies due to unique site characteristics.

Mayor Ross wants to the wind screen ordinance brought back at the next commission meeting as it has had collateral affects.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 22-33 contingent upon it being owner specific and that the current term stays in place. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

MOTION: Commissioner Pulcini moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR AGENDA

8. Motion to approve the purchase of a Fire Apparatus (1 Ladder, 1 Rescue) – BSO Fire

Commissioner Green asked the Fire Chief to speak on his recommendation. Fire Chief Harrington said he recommends the Pierce Ladder that carries a heavier load and has a larger waterway. For the Rescue he recommends the REV. Commissioner Green asked if the REV has the security lockers. Chief Harrington answered yes.

Commissioner Pulcini advised BSO recommended the 10-8 Pierce Rescue, he would like to know what changed to the current recommendations. Chief Harrington said the Fleet Manager did a side by side comparison. Commissioner Pulcini asked if the box is the same. Chief Harrington answered both boxes are aluminum and composite. Commissioner Pulcini asked if the E-1 has the dual air conditioners. Chief Harrington answered no but they are working on that.

Mayor Ross said when he spoke to the Fleet Director he was told the dual air conditioning will be on the apparatus. Chief Harrington answered the Fleet Manager wants to separate the AC to provide for longevity. Commissioner Pulcini asked if the vehicle proposed has the medical refrigerator and the stretcher lift station. Chief Harrington answered yes.

Commissioner Shrouder had concerns with spec'ing out vehicles instead of buying stock vehicles. He believes we were paying more than we need to but if the City Manager recommends the purchase he will support the item.

Mayor Ross said he went to see the truck and spoke to the Fleet Manager and several firefighters. He said everyone he spoke to supported the apparatuses. Mayor Ross asked what happens to apparatus 28 when we purchase the new vehicle. Chief Harrington answered they may be able to keep it as a spare.

Commissioner Shrouder said there are some contractual obligations that may need to be paid for by BSO with regard to equipment.

Chief Harrington said the vehicles recommended are a great fit for the City.

Commissioner Pulcini asked if the equipment on the rescue will be in the same compartment as the other truck. Chief Harrington answered yes.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if this purchase follows the procurement code. City Attorney Horowitz answered yes with the exception based on the City Manager and Fire Chief's recommendation in the best interest of the City.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve the purchase of a Pierce 75 and the Road Rescue from REV technical Center. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

9. Discussion on the Evergreen Solutions, LLC Scope of Work – HR

Rob Williamson, Project Manager for the engagement was available to answer questions.

Commissioner Shrouder advised we previously had a step plan and moved to an open pay plan so that the City Manager could have flexibility to hire someone at a higher rate. He would like to go back to a step plan.

Mr. Williamson said they can implement a step plan as an option.

Mayor Ross would also like an explanation on how that option will affect employees.

Mr. Williamson said his firm will make several recommendations to the Commission.

Mayor Ross asked if they will review the past studies. Mr. Williamson answered yes this is the information gathering phase. Mayor Ross asked for a time frame. Mr. Williamson answered around four months.

10. Discussion and possible action on Commission Meeting Procedures – Commissioner Pulcini

Commissioner Pulcini added the item to see if there are any updates that the current Commission needs and asked if an ordinance may want to be established instead of a resolution.

Mayor Ross asked City Attorney Horowitz the effects of changing to a Commission Procedures Ordinance.

City Attorney Horowitz advised currently we have a Commission Procedures Resolution. He advised ordinances are common but enforcement can be an issue. He does not have any specific recommendation but an ordinance can confirm the procedures with codification.

Mayor Ross said timing is everything and it should be addressed when the new elected body is established.

Commissioner Green said it may be better served to have something in place when a new elected body starts. He also believes there should be a mechanism in place for the governing body.

City Attorney Horowitz advised the public cannot be disruptive. They can be warned, flanked and removed from that particular meeting. He said it is more difficult to police an elected official.

Commissioner Green said the governing body should follow the same rules as the public. He asked if it is uncommon to have a mechanism in place for the commission.

City Attorney Horowitz said an article of censor is a process available.

Mayor Ross said timing is everything. He does not believe it is a pressing matter.

Commissioner Shrouder said enforcement is an issue. He said an option is cutting microphones and practically speaking an ordinance makes changes more difficult.

11. Discussion on Bulk Pick-Up Days – Commissioner Pulcini

Deferred to the September 27, 2022 Commission Meeting.

12. Discussion and possible action on adding the violation for parking over sidewalks as a \$25.00 fine in Section 13-82(c) of the City Code– Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder said the cost of violations are listed in a chart in section 13-82© anything not listed is defaulted to \$250.00. Parking on the sidewalks is not listed and he would like to define it as \$25.00.

Mayor Ross asked what happens for repeat violations. City Attorney Horowitz advised it depends what code is cited.

Mayor Ross would like to add a second violation at \$100 and a third \$250.00.

City Attorney Horowitz would like to confirm with the Clerk of Courts that these changes do not affect our current agreement.

Commissioner Shrouder said we need to have this done in phases as the new citation books were just printed. He said he would also like to define parking on the front lawn and Police Chief De Giovanni recommends \$100.00 for the first offense and \$250.00 for the second offense.

Direction was given to the City Attorney's Office to bring forth both recommended changes.

REGULAR RESOLUTIONS

13. Resolution 22-34 (Commissioner Shrouder) *Forthcoming*

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, URGING BROWARD COUNTY ANIMAL CARE AND ADOPTION DIVISION TO RECONSIDER THE INTAKE POLICY REQUIRING MUNICIPALITIES AND LAW ENFORCEMENT TO HOLD STRAY ANIMALS FOR A TIME PERIOD OF 72 HOURS PRIOR TO ACCEPTANCE BY THE COUNTY; PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder said Broward County Animal Care adopted a policy where law enforcement has to house the animal for 72 hours prior to the County accepting the animal. He would like support to have the County reconsider the policy. He would also like the Florida League to discuss the item.

Mayor Ross advised the League of Cities is aware of the matter.

Captain De Giovanni advised District 16 has housed dogs inside the station.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 22-34 subject to clean up by the City Attorney's Office. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 23, ARTICLE IV OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "DISTRICT REGULATIONS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 23-76, ENTITLED "SRL, SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL LIFESTYLE OVERLAY DISTRICT," TO PROVIDE FOR SUPPLEMENTAL BULK TRASH REGULATIONS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Pulcini moved to approve Ordinance 22-20. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)
