Subject: Fire Chief's Report – Commission Meeting July 11, 2023

The following is the Fire Chief's report for the upcoming commission meeting. This report will follow the same flow of my prior reports, which is aimed at highlighting information pertinent to the city's main public safety concerns: Fire Rescue Incidents, Fire Prevention, Community Outreach, Fire Apparatus/Station concerns, and CERT.

I. Fire/Rescue Incident Report

III. Fire Apparatus/Station Report

- The new ladder truck is in the drawing phases.
- The Wet-Down/Push-In ceremony took place on June 30, 2023. The event was successful and the newest apparatus in the fleet is Cooper City Engine 28 which is now in service at station 28.
- The new Rescue truck is getting ready to paint the chassis. I have sent the chosen paint scheme to the manufacturer. Production dates have not been provided by the manufacturer at this time.
- The electronic lock for the entrance door to station 28 will be a magnetic lock with a code pad to release it. The facilities department will be addressing its completion.
- Fire Hydrant flushing has started and will continue for the next several months until complete.

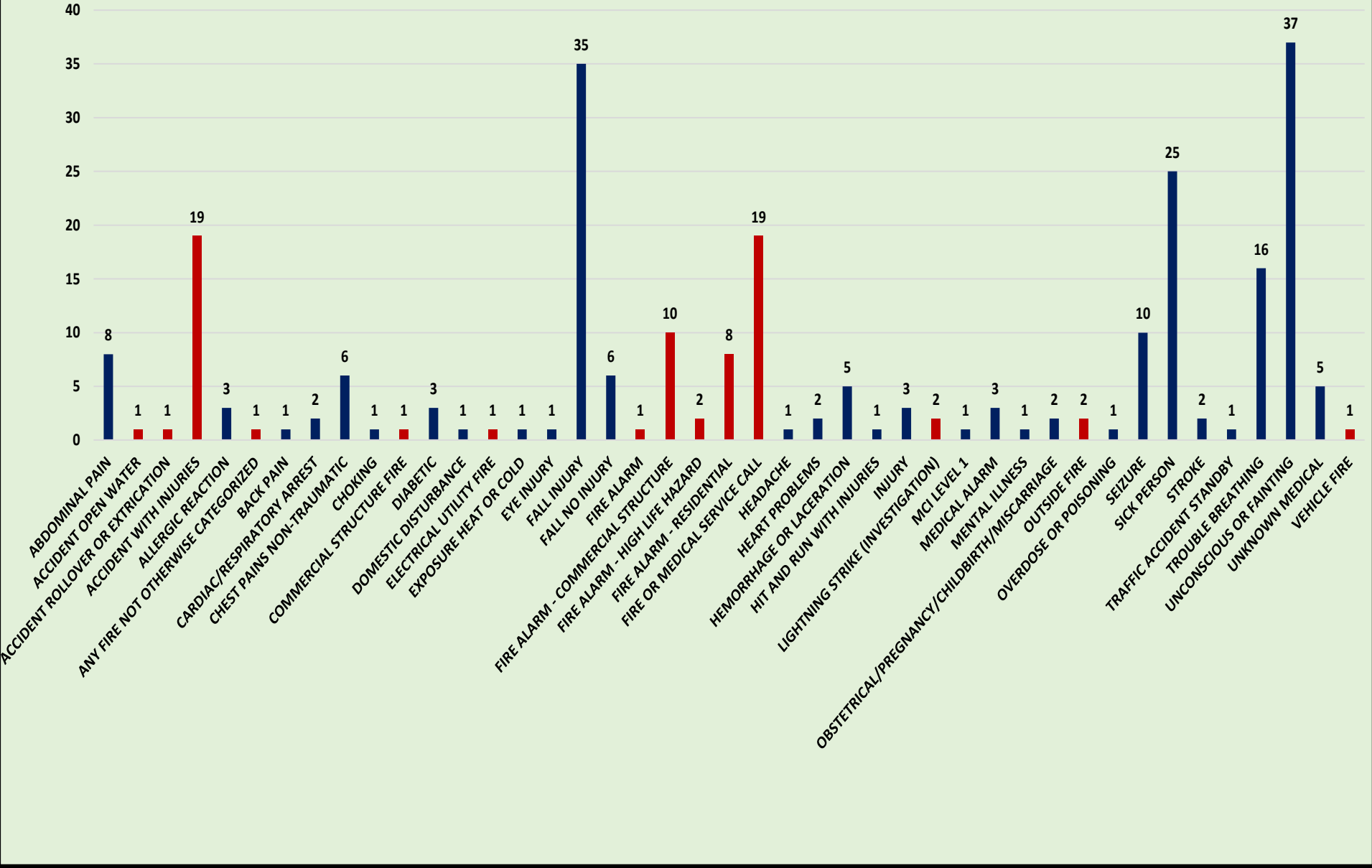

VI. Community Outreach Report

- DLE and Fire Rescue conducted a security walkthrough at Cooper City High School with school administrators on June 8, 2023.
- The BSO Life Safety Educators provided car seat installs for the community on June 21, 2023.
