Subject: Police Chief's Report – Commission Meeting July 11, 2023

As requested at the June 14, 2022, commission meeting, please accept this memorandum as advanced notice of my police chief's report for the upcoming commission meeting. This report will follow the same flow of my prior reports, which is aimed at highlighting information pertinent to the city's main public safety concerns: traffic / schools, code, and crime. In addition, a community involvement and vacancy update will be included.

I. Traffic / School Report

- a. **Summer School** is still in session at both Cooper City Elementary and Renaissance Charter. School zones remain active during summer school.
 - i. Renaissance: *June 12, 2023 – July 14, 2023* (no U-turn signs)
 - ii. Cooper City Elementary: *June 20, 2023 – July 27, 2023*
- b. **School walkthroughs** are being coordinated throughout the month of July to ensure all patrol deputies are familiarized with the layouts of the individual schools. Additionally, safety surveys are being completed at each location.

II. Code Report

- a. The **commercial plaza initiative** continues with weekly maintenance compliance sweeps. No major concerns or developments.
- b. **Short-Term Rentals:** On Saturday, July 1st, our Code Enforcement team conducted a proactive sweep of all known short-term rentals ahead of the

holiday

- i. **Eleven** properties are being cited for failure to post their permit.
- ii. **Eight** properties were found in violation of having no permit.
- c. **June Code Compliance Operation:** As shared in the previous report, Code conducted a proactive sweep for quality-of-life issues *June 27th – 29th*.
 - i. Despite inclement weather each day, a total of (48) new code cases, to include parking concerns, were addressed. Most cases resulted in compliance; however, eight violations were issued for non-compliance along with thirteen sidewalk parking violations.

III. Crime Report

- a. **Technology Plan Update:**
 - i. **LPRS:** Currently, we are waiting on four FPL sites to be activated, plus the one site that is pending the county RLA.
- b. **Real-Time Crime Center Visitations:** As of current, we have hosted Miami Beach Police Department, Sunny Isles Beach Police Department, and, most recently, Delray Beach Police Department at our district station to showcase the city's RTCC. These departments sent representatives to learn how we accomplished this milestone to bring back important information and perspective(s) to their own city leaders.
- c. **Real-Time Crime Center Successes:**
 - i. **LPR Arrest on Stolen Vehicle / Active Intelligence –** On June 29, 2023, our deputies were alerted to a stolen vehicle entering our city near Sheridan and University. PSU along with road patrol quickly located and apprehended the driver with the aid of technology.

IV. Community Involvement Report

- a. **National Night Out Week –** this year our team will be hosting an entire week of events which will culminate into a National Night Out at the city's district police station (July 31st – August 4th). Get-the-Scoops, District Tours, Coffee with a Cop, and Crafting with a Cop events will be occurring to help us connect with the community and build upon our important partnerships.
