## MINUTES

## PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

## ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Katzman, Shrouder and Mayor Ross. Commissioners Mallozzi and Green were absent.

## DECORUM - City Attorney Jacob Horowitz

City Attorney Horowitz read the decorum policy as follows: Members of the Commission, staff members, citizens, and others are required to use civil and appropriate language when addressing the Commission or anyone present at the meeting and must refrain from using profanity, cursing, or exhibiting aggressive or threatening behavior. All comments should generally be directed to the presiding officer and not to individual members of the Commission, staff, or the audience. No personal verbal attacks toward any individual by either the Commission, staff, citizens, or others shall be allowed during any meeting of the Commission. Any persons making impertinent or slanderous remarks or personal attacks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Commission or who otherwise violates the decorum rules set forth herein shall be barred from further audience before the Commission by the Mayor, or by request of any member of the Commission unless permission to continue or again address the Commission be granted by a majority vote of the Commission members present.

Commissioner Katzman asked to move item 3 to be heard after Yard of the Month.

Consensus was reached to hear item 3 after the Yard of the Month presentation.

## **PROCLAMATIONS/PRESENTATIONS**

1. Commissioner Katzman presented Scott and Maya Glazer July Yard of the Month. Florida Nursey Mart presented the winning homeowner with a \$50.00 gift certificate.

2. Presentation of Cooper City's Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) - Keefe McCullough CPAs

Steven Emery, from Keefe McCullough and partner on the City's account was present virtually. He thanked the City for the opportunity to be the City's CPA. They did issue an unmodified opinion and the numbers within this financial statement are materially accurate, based on their audit. This is the highest level of opinion that they can express. During 2022 the City was notified to be the recipient of the certificate of achievement for excellence in financial reporting by for its annual comprehensive financial report for the year ending September 30, 2021. This is awarded by the Government Finance Officers

Association. They evaluated the overall presentation for the 2022 report. They believe that it incorporates all the required presentation components and disclosure requirements to once again receive the award. The City is up to date with all the required government accounting standard pronouncements. This year a new requirement GASB, 87, which massively overhauled the treatment for leases and took all of the City's operating leases and treated them as if they were capital leases are listed as a right of use asset and corresponding liability within the financial statements. The general fund is well capitalized. The City has about 3.7 months' worth of expenses from the general fund. The GFOA recommends about 3 months. They did not note any budgetary non-compliance. So the funds were spent in accordance with how they wanted them to be spent in accordance with the adopted budget and the various budget amendments. They did not identify anything as it relates to noncompliance with statutes grant agreement or noncompliance. They also did not note any internal controlled deficiencies or material weaknesses that they felt they were required to bring to the Commission's or to the Auditor General's attention. They also did conduct a single audit on the Federal and State funding and did not note any matters of non-compliance. They also advised no transactions for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance. There were about 25 journal entries posted to the record to make them materially accurate. He advised they did encounter difficulties due to turnovers in the City.

Commissioner Katzman said he believes the audit is required to be submitted to the state of Florida by June 30, 2023. He made a motion to have the City Manager submit the audit no later than noon tomorrow.

Interim CFO Barbara Hastings said they have several reports that need filed by June 30, 2023. The AFR to the State is more challenging as it is broken down sooner than the ACFR. She advised all the reports are filed before the deadline.

Commissioner Katzman wants to assure the reports are submitted on time. City Manager Eggleston said the reports will be filed on time and they have been working behind the scenes to assure the reports are submitted.

Commissioner Shrouder said in 2020 the City did not receive the GFOA award. He said they were not compliant with the investment policy and 25 adjusting journal entries is excessive. He also said the contract stated the audit would be completed by March 31, 2023 and the majority of the staff turned over in April. Mr. Emery said one of the issues that was holding up the financial statements was the new GASB 87 requirement and those reports were not available until May. Commissioner Shrouder said the City had to spend tens of thousands of dollars to finish the audit .

Mayor Ross asked what work was performed that was not included in the contract that the firm is now requesting an additional \$15,000. Mr. Emery said it is not uncommon to bill additional costs. Resources on their end should have took about four weeks but it took months due to staff delays. They also had additional work with the extra journal entries. Mayor Ross said if there was a delay no work was done. He asked if additional journal entries and delays were not accounted for in the contract. Mr. Emery said when they receive schedules from staff that don't agree they need to preform reconciliation. He also said journal entries are made frequently but not to the extent that they were made in the City. There were also more delays here than with a typical audit. Mayor Ross asked if the bid limited the amount of journal entries. Mr. Emery said when the bid was being written they did not anticipate the turnover in the course of the audit and the amount of journal entries posted. Mayor Ross asked for an itemization

for the amount requested. Mr. Emery said the \$15,000 was a flat estimate but he can itemize the expenses.

Commissioner Shrouder said he was in contact with the former City Manager and CFO and was told the audit would be completed in May. In 2019 the City had 0 corrected journal entries and today we have 25. Commissioner Shrouder said the City's books should have been closed in January. He advised he was lied to by the previous City Manager and CFO and this was completed only because the City hired consultants.

Commissioner Katzman thanked Mr. Emery and is pleased that we have no findings. He said on November 15, 2022 he remembers the body debating the award of the RFP to Keefe McCullough and one of the factors was cost. It was also mentioned then about the low amount of tenure and turnover in the City. He went back and reviewed the RFP and the scope was to deliver the audit. He asked City Attorney Horowitz if legally they are bound to pay more than what the contracted stated. City Attorney Horowitz said the short answer is, there's not a legal reason. We have a contract with this particular firm they performed pursuant to that agreement. We did go through a procurement process which happens to be a very specifically defined process under Florida Law. Price is one of the options for consideration as part of that process, and it was used in this particular instance. The RFP includes a scope of services and the vendor, the firm submitted proposals based on that defined scope that was in the RFP. If there is additional work not contemplated in the RFP then the auditor may have a legitimate basis to seek additional compensation, because that work wasn't contained within our initial bid specifications. If the additional compensation sought is related solely to work within the scope of services in the RFP then he would have a little bit of an issue with that from a procurement state.

Commissioner Katzman asked if the firm did any work outside the scope of work that was provided in the RFP. Mr. Emery answered yes, the level of consulting that had to go into ensuring that the financials were materially accurate is would be considered outside the scope of an audit. Commissioner Katzman said the firm won the RFP based on price so he having a hard time going above and beyond the amount in the contract.

Mayor Ross said the Commission needs to vote on accepting the audit and additionally accept the amendment to the contract with Keefe McCullough.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Katzman moved to accept the audit. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (3-0)

Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the amendment to the agreement with Keefe McCullough because staff was asking them to do they needed to perform.

Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the first amendment to the agreement with Keefe McCullough. No Second. The motion died.

Mayor Ross moved to amend to the agreement with Keefe McCullough for \$5,000 in full and final settlement.

Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion if Mr. Emery would be amendable to accept.

Mayor Ross said contractually he doesn't owe anything additional.

Commissioner Shrouder said he would rather table the item and have the firm come back with documentation to reconcile the additional funds.

Mayor Ross withdrew his motion.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Shrouder moved to table the amendment to the agreement with Keefe McCullough with direction to the firm to obtain additional information on the additional fee. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (3-0)

3. Broward County Transportation's (BCT) update on PREMO - Premium Mobility Plan Presentation - Mayor Ross

Aretha Douglas, the Assistant General Manager for Capital Programs for the Transportation Department advised she has been presenting at several municipalities the implementation of the plan approved by the Surtax Plan of 2018. The strategy of the Surtax was to implement and invest in a countywide network of premium transit services. The plan includes over 200 miles of new premium service, approximately 23 million annual ridership, an 100% electrified bus fleet, new intelligent transportation technology and localized aesthetic and architectural enhancements. The plan was to connect activities centers. The methodology was date driven and they had to meet certain federal guidelines. The four services that the program is built around is commuter rail, light rail transit, bus rapid transit and high frequency. She showed a map of existing and recommended network routes. She also spoke on the Broward Commuter Rail South project that provides a regional connection between Broward and Miami-Dade Counties, the Airport to Seaport Conversion Center that connects the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, Port Everglades, and the Broward County Convention Center. The Broward Boulevard LRT which will connect downtown Fort Lauderdale to 441 and the University Drive project will have 16 miles of Bus Transit along University Drive from Commercial Boulevard to County Line Road. The projects will be completed over a timeline and will cost \$4.5 billion dollars over the next 15 years.

Commissioner Shrouder asked the City's opportunity to receive funds. Ms. Douglas said they are looking at a new bus services that will run through the City. Commissioner Shrouder asked about the use of community buses in the City through the surtax funding. Ms. Douglas said she can look at options for the City.

Commissioner Katzman asked if the State has committed funding. Ms. Douglas spoke on the request of federal dollars.

Mayor Ross asked the difference between a light rail and commuter rail. Ms. Douglas said a commuter service is on a dedicated right-away with fewer stops and light rail has several stops.

Mayor Ross said he has not heard any connectivity involving Cooper City. Ms. Douglas said building promotes transit and this is the first attempt at the project. Adding service on Griffin Road is also possible. Mayor Ross wants to assure Cooper City is not overlooked and has not seen education showing the pros of giving up cars and using transit.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if there is any plans to use the surtax funding to help the synchronization of signalization. Ms. Douglas said the County's Traffic Engineering Department does have fiber optic projects.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Katzman moved to approve the consent. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (3-0)

# 6. Motion to approve the first amendment to the agreement with Keefe McCullough – Administration

The item was discussed during Item 2.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Shrouder moved to table the amendment to the agreement with Keefe McCullough with direction to the firm to obtain additional information on the additional fee. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (3-0)

## 7. Discussion and action on the adoption of a policy for municipal vehicles - Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder said he drafted a municipal vehicle policy and asked his colleagues opinion.

Commissioner Katzman said in Section 4(b) we can strict personal use is strictly prohibited. In 5(f) he would like to allow the use of Bluetooth for work conversation purposes.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested striking 5(f) in it's entirely.

Commissioner Katzman said under 6(a) and 6(b), 6(a) restates (b) and he would like to strike everything after law enforcement in 6(a). Under 7(c) he would like to include termination. In Section 8 (b) and 8(c) he asked about the employee being liable when driving the vehicle to a worksite.

Commissioner Shrouder said under recent case law driving to work is not covered by a municipality.

Mayor Ross said the City should confirm the employee has primary insurance.

Commissioner Katzman clarified he no issue with that section as it refers to take home vehicles.

Mayor Ross thanked Commissioner Shrouder for the draft policy. He asked if staff and the City Attorney have reviewed the policy. He would also like to include in the policy after every accident an employee must be drug tested.

City Manager Eggleston asked if staff can have time to incorporate all the changes discussed tonight and bring it back to the Commission for approval.

Commissioner Shrouder said he wants to vote on his policy tonight. The insurance requires the City to have a policy.

Commissioner Katzman thanked Commissioner Shrouder for bringing forth the policy and suggested approving the policy tonight and have staff bring forth there additional items at the next meeting.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Katzman moved to approve the policy as amended with staff bringing forth their changes at the next Commission Meeting. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (3-0)

## 8. Update on the RFP for solid waste - Commissioner Shrouder

City Manager Eggleston advised the tentative goal is to have the RFP out by July 20, 2023 with proposals due by August 24, 2023. Review and rankings will be done thereafter and their hope is to award the contract at the end of September. He also advised Waste Management did send the City a proposal for an extension. He also advised we may want to consider a three or four month extension looking ahead for the residents.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the current contract allows for an extension.

City Attorney Horowitz explained the City last went out to bid for garbage services in 2001. There's been a pattern over the past 20 years of providing ongoing extensions to Waste Management which is beyond what the initial RFP provided for. From a strict legal perspective this needs to be bid out. There may be some timing and transitional considerations that the Commission needs to be aware of, but going through a competitive process would be in the City's best interest.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to hire professionals to serve on the evaluation committee.

Mayor Ross said recycling needs addressed in the RFP.

Mayor Ross said the safety net of an extension is something he is in support of.

Commissioner Katzman said while he has no dog in this fight, if an extension is given it gives no initiative to move forward.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to assure an extension is permissible.

City Attorney Horowitz said the contract should not be extended.

Commissioner Shrouder asked what resources the City needs to move this RFP quickly. City Manager Eggleston said the time to move faster has past.

City Attorney Horowitz said while the current contract and RFP from 20 plus years ago did not provide for any more extensions there's a history in the City of providing those extensions. He suggested not a three-year extension, but something more limited to ensure a transition.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about a month to month process without a contract.

Commissioner Katzman would like the RFP to include different options on bulk pickup.

Mr. Eggleston said they are working on the RFP and in the meantime he can present the month to month concept with Waste Management.

Consensus was reached to have the City Manager speak to Waste Management about a month to month process and to look into any additional resources needed to help move the RFP process forward.

## **ORDINANCES ON FIRST READING**

## 10. Ordinance 23-16 (Captain De Giovanni)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED, "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 3-2, ENTITLED "HOURS OF SALE;" TO SPECIFICALLY PROHIBIT ALCOHOL SALES BY PACKAGE AND CONVENIENCE STORES BETWEEN 2:00 AM AND 7:00 AM; AND TO PROVIDE FOR SIGNAGE NOTIFYING PATRONS OF PROHIBITED HOURS OF ALCOHOL SALES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Captain De Giovanni advised this revision would stop the sale of alcohol between the hours of 2:00 AM and 7:00 AM by package and convenience stores.

Mayor Ross thanked Captain De Giovanni for bringing the item forward.

Commissioner Katzman would like to standardize the hours for all establishments.

Captain De Giovanni said the code typically separates on premises and off premises.

Commissioner Katzman said he would like the same restricted hours for restaurants and country clubs as well.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 23-16 as amended to make the all the times in the section consistent from 2:00 AM TO 7:00 AM. Mayor Ross seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (3-0)

#### **CITY MANAGER REPORT**

City Manager Eggleston advised there is a vacancy with the Chief Treatment Plan Operator position in Utilities and in the short term some of those duties will be given to different employees on an interim basis. Regarding the traffic calming study project, the consultant has received the traffic data and will begin an analysis and start putting together a report for the Commission that may take anywhere between 60 to 90 days. He has reached out to the point of contact at Chen Moore for the beautification initiative and they will present a brief update to the Commission in July. He also advised the Bill Lips draining project has begun. He also thanked Barbara Hastings, Carlos Vega and Finance Department staff for their work on the audit.

Commissioner Katzman asked if the Bill Lips project delay will affect events in the fall. Mr. Eggleston said staff will reach out to the Optimist to start some dialogue.

Mayor Ross asked for an update on the dog park. Mr. Eggleston will meet with staff later this week to discuss the plan for the relocation.

## **POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT**

## **11. Police Chief's Report**

Captain De Giovanni advised regional motor assets were brought into the City last week that yielded 246 traffic citations for speeding and aggressive driving. He also reminded the residents that the school zone for Cooper City Elementary is still applicable for the summer along with Renaissance Charter School with the elimination of U-turns near the school. The Quality of Life sweep is active now through July 29, 2023. He also thanked the Mayor and Commission, City Attorney Horowitz, City Manager Napoli and staff for supporting the Real Time Crime Center grand opening. Since the grand opening a theft investigation at Flamingo West Park was resolved through the camera and LPR systems. On June 19, 2023 a LPR received data about a stolen vehicle at Flamingo West Park. There has been an increase in burglaries which is normal in the summer but in both instances the burglars were apprehended. The monitoring of the RV Lots will transition to the Real Time Crime Center on August 1, 2023. There is currently one sworn and one non-sworn vacancy with a CSA reporting to the District on July 1, 2023. He also advised five Cooper City employees were selected as BSO award recipients. Deputy Martin Diaz with the Life Saving Award, Sergeant Julio Rodriguez with the Life Saving Award, and Deputy George Myro also with a Life Saving Award. Deputy George Martinez received an accommodation award and Ashley Barcena was presented with Civilian of the Year.
