MINUTES

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed for the passing of former Cooper City Mayor, Henry Joseph Schaefer.

ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Mallozzi, Katzman, Shrouder, Green and Mayor Ross.

<u>DECORUM</u> – City Attorney Jacob Horowitz

City Attorney Horowitz read the decorum policy as follows: Members of the Commission, staff members, citizens, and others are required to use civil and appropriate language when addressing the Commission or anyone present at the meeting and must refrain from using profanity, cursing, or exhibiting aggressive or threatening behavior. All comments should generally be directed to the presiding officer and not to individual members of the Commission, staff, or the audience. No personal verbal attacks toward any individual by either the Commission, staff, citizens, or others shall be allowed during any meeting of the Commission. Any persons making impertinent or slanderous remarks or personal attacks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Commission or who otherwise violates the decorum rules set forth herein shall be barred from further audience before the Commission by the Mayor, or by request of any member of the Commission unless permission to continue or again address the Commission be granted by a majority vote of the Commission members present.

PUBLIC SPEAKING/AGENDA CONCERNS

Open Public Meeting/Agenda Concerns

Charlotte Marchand, spoke on her concerns with fines due to not registering her home as a short term rental, as she only rents one bedroom in the home. She advised the State of Florida does not consider her one room rental a short term rental.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if Code Enforcement could speak to Ms. Marchand with regard to her concerns. Interim City Manager Vega said the property is not in compliance due to it still being listed as a short term rental.

Commissioner Shrouder stated his fear is that other individuals may say their rentals are one bedroom rentals as well. He suggested Ms. Marchand apply for a variance. The question is do they change the rule to address the issue which can lead to possible abuse or address her individual hardship.

Commissioner Mallozzi suggested staff contact Ms. Marchand and work on a process.

Commissioner Shrouder said staff would follow the code. They need to offer staff direction.

Mayor Ross said he would need more information about the hardship claim.

Commissioner Shrouder said this case would be a onetime variance. He advised he is willing to pay the registration fee from his discretionary funds.

Mayor Ross said the payment of the registration fee does not address the issue.

Commissioner Katzman asked if there is a legal mechanism for a variance. City Attorney Horowitz said that under our code and under State Law there are certain specific conditions, criteria and requirements for a variance. Without hearing all of the facts surrounding Miss Marchand's particular situation he cannot give a definitive answer as to whether she would be eligible for the variance, but she certainly would be eligible to apply. Commissioner Katzman said the hard costs for the inspections would still traditionally be placed upon the petitioner.

Commissioner Shrouder said the entire permit fee would be considered the hard costs.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she brought up this matter a few months back and suggested a lower permit fee due to her circumstances.

Commissioner Shrouder said he will cover the \$750.00 registration fee from his discretionary funds and thereafter any fees due would be the responsibility of Ms. Marchand.

Commissioner Green has no issue with supporting the residents, however his concern is the precedent this may set. He would like to allow staff to look into a variance process.

Commissioner Mallozzi said there are only two or three rentals like Ms. Marchand's within Cooper City.

Commissioner Green supports a codified process.

Mayor Ross supports a clear definition of a hardship.

Commissioner Shrouder said there is legislation that can pass and change the short term rental code completely. He will cover the \$750.00 registration fee from his discretionary funds.

Commissioner Green asked what each Commissioner's discretionary fund's represent and how they can be used. City Attorney Horowitz said the discretionary fund is made up of public dollars. Public dollars can only be spent for a public or municipal purpose under the Florida Constitution. Each member of the

Commission as it relates to their specific allocation of discretionary funds can make the determination as to whether or not a particular expenditure satisfies that legal requirement.

Mayor Ross advised the short term rental bill did not pass the Senate.

Commissioner Shrouder will cover the \$750.00 registration fee from his discretionary funds and would like to look into a type of variance process.

Commissioner Green said this may set a precedent within the City.

Commissioner Shrouder stated this is a rare situation.

Commissioner Katzman said he has no decision on how Commissioner Shrouder spends his discretionary funds however, he would like staff to develop a hardship policy to help with these types of issues.

Commissioner Shrouder said the City should have a process in place for individuals who may run into money issues when applying for a permit offering a potential payment plan.

Commissioner Mallozzi said this is a rare situation. She also stated there used to be a fund set up within the City to help residents experiencing water bill payment issues. She explained to Ms. Marchand Commissioner Shrouder will cover the onetime fee of \$750.00 dollars and she would cover the remaining inspection and permit fee. The inspection is necessary for safety measures.

Commissioner Green asked if the Commission does use public funds for this public purpose and there is an injury in Ms. Marchand's rental is the City liable. City Attorney Horowitz answered he does not believe that factor would change the City's liability. If there were any liability to the City, it would be through the enforcement of the ordinance or any accommodation that was made in deviation from the ordinance. Commissioner Green said through discussions tonight, there may be a deviation from the process in place. City Attorney Horowitz said the City has an ordinance to address this issue. There is also a mechanism in the code by which a resident, a homeowner, in the city can petition the City Commission for a variance which is just that, a deviation from the code. Commissioner Green asked if there is a liability on the City if the fees are paid. City Attorney Horowitz cannot guarantee that the City would not be subject to legal action. He believes staff would like the opportunity to look at the code and work with Ms. Marchand to come back with a potential solution.

Mayor Ross asked for a consensus to have staff look into a process for general hardships.

Consensus was reached for staff to look into a process for general hardships.

Ms. Marchand asked about the fees she is incurring from Code Enforcement.

Commissioner Shrouder said once she receives the permit she will be in compliance.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked for staff to look into a payment plan. Interim City Manager Vega said Ms. Marchand is scheduled for the June, Special Magistrate Hearing for certification of fine. He said the payment of the \$750 and \$260 for the inspection would have her in compliance.

Commissioner Green advised he will pay the \$260 inspection fee from his discretionary funds.

Interim City Manager Vega said staff will reach out to Ms. Marchand tomorrow morning.

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, SUBMITTING TO REFERENDUM PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY AMENDING ARTICLE III, ENTITLED "LEGISLATIVE;" AND IN PARTICULAR AMENDING SECTION 3.02, ENTITLED "QUALIFICATIONS, ELECTIONS AND TERMS;" AMENDING SECTION 3.10, ENTITLED "VACANCIES, FORFEITURES OF OFFICE, FILLING OF VACANCIES;" AMENDING ARTICLE V, ENTITLED "FINANCIAL PROCEDURES," AMENDING SECTION 5.02, ENTITLED "SUBMISSION OF BUDGET AND MESSAGE," AND AMENDING SECTION 5.13, ENTITLED "REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC BIDDING;" PROVIDING FOR CONSISTENCY WITH FLORIDA LAW RELATED TO THE PUBLICATION OF LEGAL NOTICES UNDER SPECIAL CONDITIONS ON A PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE WEBSITE OWNED OR DESIGNATED BY BROWARD COUNTY; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE, WHEN ADOPTED, SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, ON THE NOVEMBER 5, 2024, GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT AND IT SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE AS PROVIDED BY LAW; PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISING OF THE REFERENDUM ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Ordinance 23-8. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

11. Ordinance 23-12 (Community Development)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 23, ARTICLE IV OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "DISTRICT REGULATIONS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 24-14, ENTITLED "SCHEDULE OF DIMENSIONAL STANDARDS;" AMENDING SECTION 23-62, ENTITLED "X-1, CIVIC DISTRICT;" ESTABLISHING HEIGHT RESTRICTIONS FOR THE "CIVIC DISTRICT" ZONING CLASSIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Katzman wanted the record to reflect the actual math is at 85 feet. Community Development Assistant Director Jason Chockley advised staff is aware but used a general number.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve Ordinance 23-12. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Horowitz advised his office presented a legal memorandum to the City addressing the new Open Carry Law in Florida. The Vacation Rental Bill did not make it out of the Senate, however the Form 6 Bill has passed which would require the Mayor and members of the Commission to file a Form 6 Financial Disclosure in lieu of the Form 1 Financial Disclosure starting next year.

Commissioner Katzman asked if the permitless carry law applies to government buildings. City Attorney Horowitz advised there was no change to the any provisional law where you are prohibited from carrying a firearm.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

Interim City Manager Vega advised there are two budget transfers. One for an oil cooler system for \$30,000. The second was an emergency purchase for a wastewater grinder for \$15,986.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

14. Police Chief Report

Captain De Giovanni advised the School Board will roll out their Summer School Program this year with a potential use of Cooper City Elementary School. He would dedicate a SRO if the school is used at \$515 per day. A Quality of Life Code Enforcement Sweep will be conducted May 23, 2023 through May 27, 2023. On June 14, 2023 at 11:00 AM the Real Time Crime Center will host a grand opening event. He also advised his staff will meet with Primrose school on June 13, 2023 at 8:00 AM for a meet and greet. A search warrant was issued today for 8264 Cascada Isle Drive, which resulted in recovering over 400 stolen cellphones, a dozen laptops, a stolen firearm and numerous passports. He thanked the Crime Suppression Team for their work. He also corrected his previous report and advised he had a sworn vacancy as of April 22, 2023. He currently has one sworn and one non-sworn vacancy.

Commissioner Mallozzi would like the Code Enforcement Sweep to include the Air B&B's.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the property that was searched was a rental. Captain De Giovanni responded, yes.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

15. Fire Chief Report

Chief Harrington advised he will present two high school scholarships at the Cooper City High School on May 16, 2023 at 7:00 PM. He also advised the four out of service hydrants listed on his report have been repaired.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked the last time there were hydrants out of service. Chief Harrington answered May 3, 2023 but the numbers do fluctuate.

Mayor Ross asked if the hydrants are numbered on a map. Chief Harrington answered yes, there are 1,231 hydrants in the City that are tested. Mayor Ross asked if Public Works assists with hydrant issues. Interim City Manager Vega is unsure but the Utilities Department does assist with hydrant issues.

Mayor Ross wants to assure the hydrant tags are in the GIS system.

Commissioner Katzman asked Chief Harrington to speak on the recent residential structure fires. Chief Harrington said the Hazardous Materials Team is an automatic response to structure fires as well as the 28 units. Commissioner Katzman confirmed the hydrants were in working order and these were unrelated issues. Chief Harrington said each truck carries between 500 and 750 gallons of water in each vehicle. The new engine will have 750 gallons of water onboard the vehicle.

Mayor Ross said 13 units responding is incredible, however the response time was over doubled. He asked for an explanation of the 11 minute response time. Chief Harrington advised the response times are not due to dispatching or leaving the station, they are due to distance. When the incidents occur in the four corners of the City there is a longer response time. Mayor Ross asked about the use of Closest Unit Response. Chief Harrington said there are certain categories for Closest Unit Response. Mayor Ross asked about the call involving the longest response time. Chief Harrington does not have the information on that call. Mayor Ross asked for an update on the new engine. Chief Harrington advised the engine is in Pompano Beach for a quality assurance check and then it will sent to Fleet for inspection. Mayor Ross asked about an issue with communication with regards to the manufacturer for the rescue. Chief Harrington said they are working their way through the chain of command for that manufacturer.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if there is an issue with the truck can it be corrected in Pompano Beach. Chief Harrington answered yes. Commissioner Mallozzi asked about a possible fire station in Monterra.

Commissioner Katzman said he has had conversations with regard to the possible station in Monterra and they advised they are still interested.

Commissioner Mallozzi also asked about a modular station in Rock Creek.

Commissioner Shrouder said they need to look at a call map. He would also like to discuss a modification to the current location adding more space.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked about the calls listed as no arrivals on the report. Chief Harrington answered those are canceled on route calls.

Commissioner Shrouder said there are several aspects to response times. He would like to look into placing air equipment for the brakes on the trucks to help aid in response time. He also advised Pembroke Pines has equipment on their trucks to change the traffic lights. He would like to look into any equipment that can help aid in faster response times. He also would like to look into lobbying for grants in Tallahassee for facility enhancements.

Commissioner Katzman offered well wishes to the Fire Fighter, Paramedic who is recovering.

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Green advised he was alerted by residents of speeding on 90th Avenue but informed the residents the City is addressing the speeding issues. He also wished a Happy Mother's Day to all mothers.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to assure the City facilities and assets are being taken care of. He would like the City's assets to be covered in an enclosure. He would like to look into grants for improvements of the Police and Fire Stations. He would also like to address the sign code before the election cycle. Interim City Manager Vega said staff is working on the sign code ordinance. Commissioner Shrouder would also like to use the leftover money for nonprofits in ARPA, to allow non-profit HOA'S to use the funds for the camera's that tie into the Real Time Crime Center.

Commissioner Katzman and Commissioner Mallozzi would like to hold a Special Meeting to discuss ARPA items. Interim City Manager Vega will look into possible dates for scheduling the meeting.

Commissioner Katzman said a student of Nur-UL-Islam Academy was killed due to senseless gun violence in a neighboring City and he wants to assure the family the City is here for them. The City is monitoring anti-Semitism issues happening throughout the nation and have been in touch with the appropriate people.

Commissioner Mallozzi wished everyone a Happy Mother's Day. She also advised she had a conversation with County Commissioner Beam Furr who advised the County cannot receive a direct accounting from BSO. She would like staff to request a direct accounting from BSO. She also asked for an update on the speed survey for potential traffic calming devices and an update on the dog park relocation. Interim City Manager Vega said the consultants are looking into possible locations for the dog park.

Mayor Ross said mental health issues also led to the gun violence issue. He suggested anyone who has concerns with the anti-Semitism issue that occurred at Cooper City School contact their School Board Representative. Mayor Ross would also like to receive a true up at the end of the year from BSO. He also spoke on the amount being reimbursed to the Cities for the SRO's.

Commissioner Shrouder said the City needs to ask for backup to increases. If backup is not provided they do not need to pay the increase contractually.

Captain De Giovanni advised he has reviewed line by line each budget line with the previous City Manager. He has provided all backup requested of him.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if the price for a deputy would decrease after the initial vehicle is provided. Captain De Giovanni said in February every year the cost is the true up and is built in. He is willing to sit down and go through costs with the City Manager or any member of the Commission.

Commissioner Shrouder said Police is easier to calculate than Fire as it is calculated differently.

Discussion ensued on receiving true up numbers from BSO.
