## **MINUTES**

## **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Mayor Curran opened the meeting at 5:30 PM.

Mayor Curran asked the commission if they are available to continue this discussion on May 28th.

Commissioner Katzman would like the agreement on the May 27<sup>th</sup> Regular Commission Meeting agenda.

Commissioner Shrouder does not want to delay.

Commissioner Smith wants to address the topic tonight.

Mayor Curran led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **ROLL CALL**

Present were Commissioners Smith, Mallozzi (via Zoom), Katzman, Shrouder and Mayor Curran.

# **PUBLIC COMMMENTS (3 MINUTES)**

David Nall spoke on indemnification of the liability between the city and the Optimist Club.

Howard Schachere, spoke on concerns he has had the past few months with the Optimist Club, including limited practices for sports. He would like all the money for registration to be collected by the city moving forward.

#### **TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION**

#### 1. Facility Use Agreement

Present from the Optimist Club was President Pete Schlang, Past President Wayne Stofksky and Second Vice President Mike Stamm.

Commissioner Smith asked for clarification on item 1 through 6. City Manager Rey advised items 2-6 are items where staff have not been able to reach consensus with the Optimist Club.

Mayor Curran does not want to address the entire agreement tonight.

Commissioner Katzman would like to discuss the agreement as a whole.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to address the agenda items and the agreement as a whole.

City Manager Rey said the agreement gives the director of parks and recreation, the ability to set the number of participants in each of the sports in consultation with the club.

# 2. How do we work through Rec Trac?

City Manager Rey said the city has purchased the upgraded Rec Trac system. The Optimist Club uses another program to schedule referees. The city agreed to move those activities to Rec Trac in the future. The Optimist Club has issues with the operational intent.

Mr. Stamm said Rec Trac does not have the ability to schedule and manage games as it is not built out completely. Commissioner Smith asked what is missing in the system to accomplish this task.

City Manager Rey said Rec Trac will be the tool to use for registrations and residency.

Commissioner Shrouder would like language to include all registration fees will be collected through the software.

City Manager Rey said the system is ready for registrations and collection of funds. The operational day-to-day assignment portion will take several months to complete. The agreement states the Optimist Club will maintain the data until that portion is completed and then inserted in.

Mr. Stamm said there is a user fee included with registrations to help pay for the registration software which they will now not have. He would like a hybrid system that can collect the funds and confirm residents and nonresident participants.

Commissioner Shrouder answered that all money needs to be collected by the city. Scheduling of referees can be done by the Club.

Mr. Stofksky said their concern is running the program. The Rec Trac program cannot export registrations to their system.

Commissioner Shrouder said data can be easily exported.

Mr. Stamm said they can not upload users to their account.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if we can collect an additional fee to have staff import the data into the Optimist Club software. City Manager Rey answered yes, they can.

Mayor Curran was under the impression the city was hiring an individual to work Rec Trac. City Manager Rey said a data entry induvial would be an additional staff member.

Commissioner Mallozzi said this would be for a short-term basis.

Commissioner Shrouder said the city would start with one sport at a time.

City Manager Rey said if the registration cost needs to be increased for data entry it is an option.

Commissioner Smith said they are in a situation currently where everyone is either saying I can't believe what occurred or I told you so. The residents are demanding that the dollars be collected by the city and be accounted for. He asked what the city needs to do to have this process completed.

Mr. Schlang said the city needs to trust the current club as they are trying to fix anything that went astray.

Mr. Stamm said the indictment was a Zelle issue not a registration issue. He spoke on the logistics of refunds and how that will be handled. He does not believe the agreement handles all aspects. Commissioner Smith asked what other cities use. Mr. Stamm said the City of Pembroke Pines uses the Optimist system for certain registrations.

Commissioner Shrouder said the money will be collected through the city. His stance is final.

Mr. Stamm said the program is not ready.

Assistant Parks and Recreation Director Josh Rhodes said the system can take registrations and collect the funds. The information can be sent to the Optimist.

Commissioner Mallozzi said we can raise the registration fee to hire a data entry individual.

Commissioner Smith asked why it would take seven months to update the system. City Manager Rey said it takes time to address all capabilities in the system.

Commissioner Smith asked what it takes to launch this process next week.

Assistant Parks and Recreation Director Josh Rhodes stated staff would need to divert their current duties to take on this task fully.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked what sport they are registering for currently. Mr. Stamm said flag football. Commissioner Mallozzi asked how many participants they have in flag football. Mr. Stamm said 400. Commissioner Mallozzi said that it can be the first sport to test in Rec Trac.

Commissioner Katzman said they met in February, and the Commission directed staff to move forward, and he does not see any updates with Rec Trac. He stated the residents have made it clear they want all money collected by the city. There have been occurrences that have led to a lack of trust among the residents. There are many allegations involving money. The Commission has fiduciary responsibility on behalf of the residents.

Mr. Schlang said the Optimist are trying to correct any wrongdoings and they need to be trusted.

Commissioner Katzman does not understand the difficulty with the city collecting the money and giving it over to the Optimist. This leads to accountability.

Commissioner Smith said the residents are looking for accountability. He asked if they could start with one program working through all issues to see what may need adjusted. Mr. Schlang said if the city can expedite the data to the Optimist program it would be helpful. Commissioner Smith said these issues should have been addressed already by staff.

Mr. Stamm would like a soft rollout with these items. He stated it will be impossible for the individual teams to manage themselves with the city collecting all monies.

Commissioner Shrouder said language can be included to state the Optimist will use software determined by the city and it will be rolled out as ready.

Assistant Parks and Recreation Director Josh Rhodes said Rec Trac will offer a login for the participants.

Mr. Stamm said they are not opposed to everything but there are more details that need collected.

Commissioner Shrouder said staff will handle any additional requirements.

Mr. Stofksky said their system handles cancelations and uniform needs. They want the program to run smoothly.

Commissioner Shrouder said Rec Trac has better capabilities than what the Optimist use currently.

Commissioner Katzman said these details should have been handled by the City Manager and the Optimist. He has a lot of respect for the Optimist and their volunteers. He wants the Optimist to handle the scheduling and needs.

Mayor Curran asked the backup plan if softball registrations do not work properly. City Manager Rey said they will make sure the information is in the Optimist system.

Mr. Stamm would like to run the season in the systems simultaneously.

Commissioner Shrouder said he asked for the cost of the program the Optimist uses in January. Mr. Stamm said he asked the vendor for those costs.

Commissioner Smith said if we need to run a parallel system at first he is fine with that.

Mr. Stofksky asked where the money in Rec Trac goes. City Manager Rey said there will be a banking account connected based on what the city collects and what the Optimist collects.

Commissioner Smith said the details should have been discussed previously. Commissioner Smith asked how many hours was put into this agreement by both parties. Mr. Schlang answered two, two-hour meetings. The commission is willing to help with the cost for software and needs, these issues should have been addressed before tonight.

Mr. Stamm said he has dealt with other conversations.

### 3. Concession Stands and Assumption of Equipment

Mr. Stamm said there are 5 concessions stands with equipment. They would like to do an inventory of equipment, and the AC needs fixed in one stand. Some nets and goals are handled by the city and some are handled by the Optimist.

City Manager Rey would like to be responsible for the equipment and take it in any condition. He would like the concession stands to be self sufficient and fixed by those funds.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested separate sections in the agreement one for equipment in the concession stand.

Commissioner Smith asked if the concession stand is the City's responsibility. City Manager Rey answered yes. Mr. Stamm would like to do an inventory of equipment as there are broken coolers.

Assistant Parks and Recreation Director Josh Rhodes said the city built the concession stand at Flamingo West in partnership with the Optimist. The stand is running with no AC but before the city can give it to the Optimist, they now want an AC to be installed. Mr. Schlang said inside equipment fails due to the heat.

Commissioner Smith asked if the Commission approves AC will the cost be collected from Optimist. City Manager Rey said maintenance will be done by the City and the money would come from capital improvements. He does not believe the city should handle the concessions stands. He believes they should run with stand funds.

Commissioner Smith would like to receive the cost on AC's for the stands to make a decision.

The Optimist will accept the equipment as is if the city installs AC units.

Commissioner Mallozzi does not want to pay for structural changes for the AC's.

# 4. Basketball & Non-resident Fees

Mr. Schlang would like the donations paid to the schools for the use of their facilities to be deducted from the non-resident fee.

Assistant Parks and Recreation Director Rhodes stated there is no cost for the use of the school facility because the City has an agreement with the school board.

Commissioner Shrouder said basketball uses the school boards facility under the City's Recipical Use agreement.

Mr. Schlang said basketball has an additional cost.

Commissioner Shrouder said there is no payment needed.

Mr. Stofksky asked if they do not donate, will the courts not be available.

Mr. Schlang would like the donation amount to be deducted from the city's side.

Commissioner Shrouder said the city will make sure the courts are available.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked what will happen if the courts are not available because the donation is not made.

Commissioner Shrouder said we have a legal agreement with the school board.

Commissioner Katzman said the school will still provide janitorial services if the donation is not available.

Mayor Curran said there was a year where Cooper City High School did not want to give access to the gym. There is no one to clean up after the games. He stated the school covers janitorial costs when the city uses the space for events.

Commissioner Shrouder said the city will make sure the courts are available.

Language will be added that the city will handle the relationship with the School Board, and if there are any concerns about not being able to secure the dates, the city will do help secure a location.

### 5. Section 4.11 - Who can get paid and beach volleyball, etc

City Manager Rey said section 4.11 of the agreement prohibits board members from accepting funds for the club. Transparency is important.

Mr. Stofksky asked if he is speaking on voting members or nonvoting members. He asked if the uniform vendor is on the board but does not vote can he still accept funds.

Mr. Stamm said the organizations' structure was questioned which led the Optimist Club to look at the structure and positions.

Commissioner Shrouder read language from the City of Pembroke Pines contract as follows: No board member, director, or officer of licensee collectively, member shall, either directly or indirectly, purchase, rent, or lease any realty goods or services from the leasee, from any business entity of which the member or the member's immediate family is an officer, partner, director, or proprietor, or in which the member or the member's immediate family has a material interest. The board of directors should not receive any funds.

Mr. Stamm said they are working on updating their articles of incorporation. They said they have 12 elected board members. They will reduce the number of voting members in their club.

Commissioner Mallozzi said the club should solicit bids for uniforms.

Commissioner Smith asked if the club has issues with section 4.11. Mr. Stamm said that the Optimist Club has concerns with the indirect compensation as they give discounts to children of coaches.

Commissioner Shrouder said every city has a clause that an individual cannot get paid if they serve on the board.

Commissioner Smith wants to follow ethical standards.

Mr. Schlang said they are a private entity.

Mr. Stamm said they like the language as written but staff had concerns.

City Manager Rey said they have concerns with line 3. No one that gets compensated should be on the board.

Commissioner Shrouder said the current articles they operate under do not allow for how they run currently.

Mr. Stamm said the concession individual is also on the board and votes.

Discussion ensued about voting members.

Commissioner Shrouder said they can add an clause that coaches' children can get a discount without listing names.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked what the paid positions are in the Optimist Club. Mr. Stamm answered referees, umpires, assigners, outside concessionaries and treasurers.

Commissioner Katzman would like there to be a threshold for elements that need procured. Mr. Stamm said they went with a different soccer uniform vendor this year and had numerous issues. They have looked for vendors and encountered issues with timing.

City Manager Rey also spoke on concerns with commissioners having a for-profit business that conflicts with being in a role of leadership with the sport.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to address only concerns in the agreement.

## 6. Banners & Sponsorship

Commissioner Shrouder wants to add a procurement clause in section 6.6. Mr. Stamm said they have issues with securing goods in a timely manner.

Commissioner Mallozzi said the Optimist Club can estimate a count for uniforms.

Mr. Schlang said they have the lowest prices around.

Mr. Stamm asked what the process for purchasing.

Commissioner Katzman said it is best practice in any organization to look for quotes.

Commissioner Smith wants to memorialize the purchasing process.

City Attorney Horowitz said the City's procurement code states any purchase over \$10,000 requires three quotes.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested the language the Optimist Club shall submit a copy of their purchasing guidelines to the city.

City Manager Rey said the zoning code does not allow financial parts. The city will have to revise the land development code.

Commissioner Smith would like standardization for banners.

Commissioner Katzman said the charge for sponsors should be consistent.

City Manager Rey said the regulations can be placed in the ordinance.

Commissioner Shrouder will send his notes to the City Manager for inclusion. His main goal is to have all money collected through the city and sent to the Optimist Club.

Commissioner Mallozzi agrees that recent issues need addressed but she does not want the Commission to lose sight of all the volunteers that have their heart in the right place.

Commissioner Smith wants to see field rentals, sponsorships and registrations go through the city portal. He wants accountability for the funds.

Mr. Stamm believes the sponsorship tracking is to much. He suggested only checks be accepted.

Commissioner Mallozzi spoke on travel team needs.

Commissioner Katzman said the residents have called for accountability.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if RecTrac allows sponsorships to be line itemed to a specific team. Assistant Finance Director Tena Granit said yes.

Commissioner Shrouder said they need accountability on money collected.

Mr. Stamm asked about the nonprofit exempt status. Commissioner Shrouder said the city will make sure they are accommodated.

Commissioner Katzman will send his additional thoughts to the City Manager and the City Attorney.

Commissioner Shrouder would like the Optimist Club to start working on these matters. He also asked that F.S. 119 be adhered to.

Commissioner Smith wants the Optimist Club to work with the city and start the measures being adopted.

Commissioner Shrouder said he tried to communicate with the Optimist Club about his concerns.

Commissioner Katzman said he spoke with the Optimist Club about his concerns that are not included in the agreement.

Mr. Stamm said over 900 background checks have been conducted and those are not included in the agreement.

Commissioner Smith said if the Club has concerns, he suggested the club show examples from other municipalities.

Commissioner Shrouder said the city can take over the background checks.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

The meeting adjourned at 8:47 PM.
