The following is the Fire Chief's report for May 2025. The report highlights information pertinent to the city's fire safety concerns: Fire Rescue Incidents, Fire Apparatus / Station concerns, Fire Prevention, and Community Outreach.

There were four (4) extended responses. The longest priority 1 response, 11:51 was complicated by minor mechanical issues relating to air pressure. The second was 9:48 which was due to the distance to the incident. The third extended response time (9:20) was again the vehicle's air pressure. The fourth extended response of 9:06 was due to the distance to the incident.

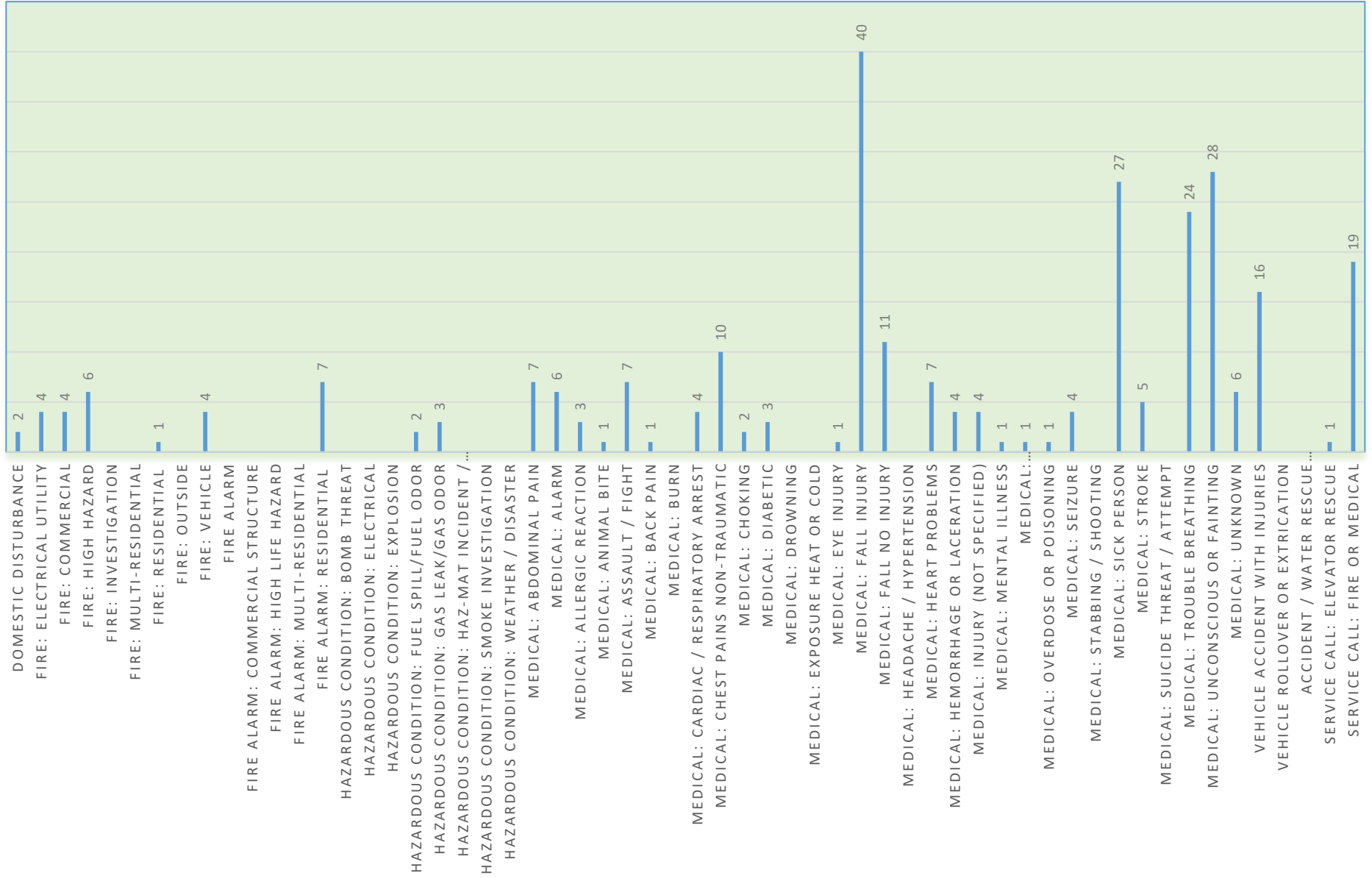

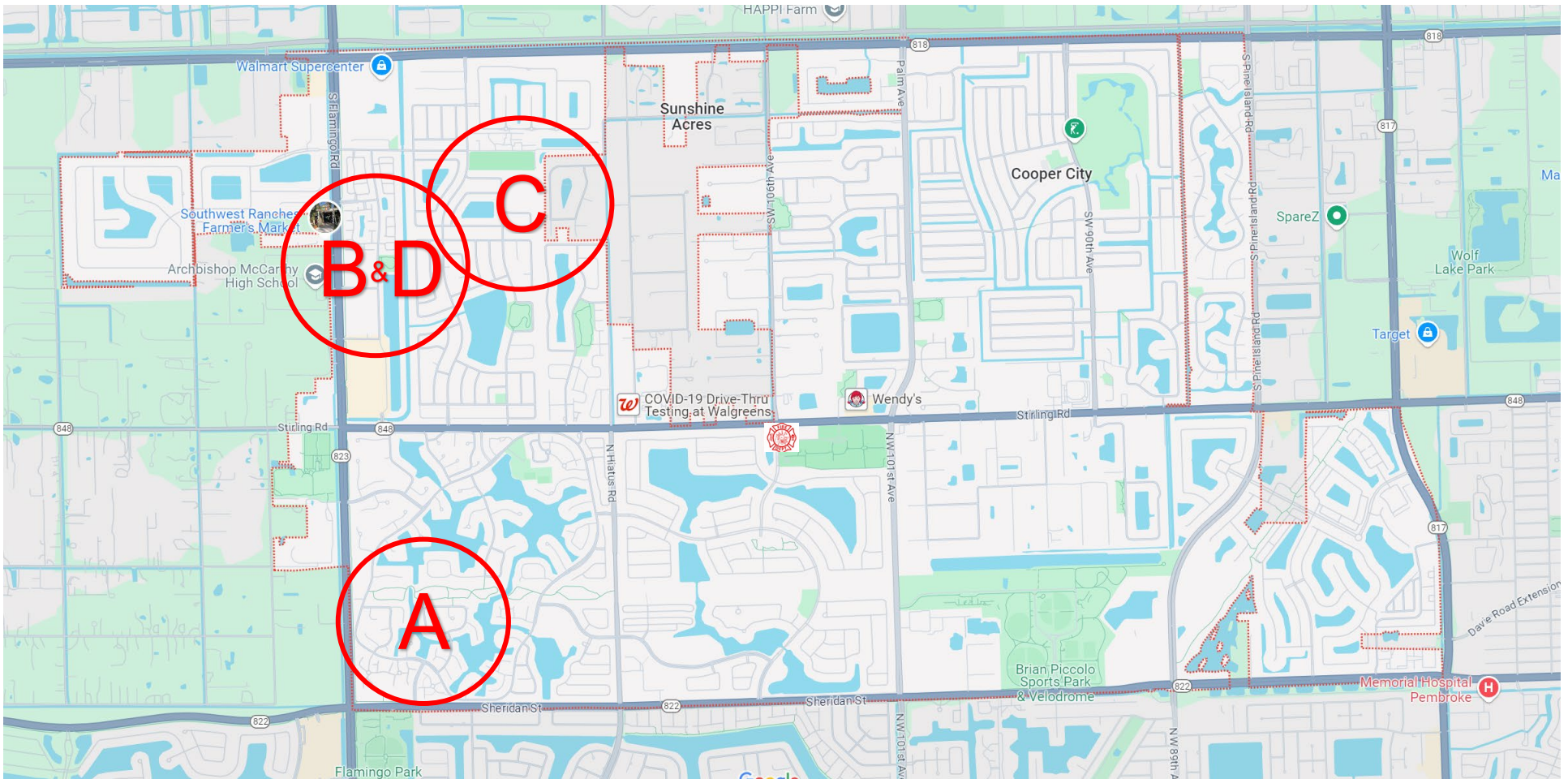
V. COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT
