# MINUTES

## PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Curran opened the meeting at 5:00 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

## ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Smith, Mallozzi, Katzman, Shrouder, and Mayor Curran.

## TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

1. Optimist

City Manager Rey stated the ultimate goal is for both parties to find a mechanism and the tools to move forward together with a standard set of rules. He advised they have looked at other agreements with neighboring municipalities and his hope is to work out an agreement to present to the Commission in March.

Deputy City Manager Jennifer McMahon advised they will review the 2012 and 2021 resolution that the City has in place with the Optimist Club. They will review the letters of non-compliance, the prior draft agreement, reviewing neighborhood community agreements and then review the Rec Trac program capabilities.

Pete Schlang, stated he wants to address the issues they have been encountering and not the Rec-Trac system as they are not familiar with the software.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she wants to address the concerns that they are encountering currently.

Deputy Manager McMahon said Resolution 12-7-5 calls for the following:

The Optimist shall have on file with the City the following:

Proof of incorporation as a non-for-profit corporation

Proof of liability and accident insurance

The name, address and phone number of a person responsible for all communication with the City and its designee

League-approved rosters for each sport

Criminal background checks shall be done for all who act in the following capacities:

Manager/Head Coaches

Official/Assistant Coaches

**Board Members** 

Commissioners/Assistant Commissions

Deputy Manager McMahon stated the first letter of non-compliance was sent on November 8, 2024. The Optimist Club was out of compliance with Resolution 12-7-5 regarding percentage (70%/30%) of residents. The second letter was issued on January 3, 3025 via certified mail. As of January 1, 2025, Sec. 943.0438, F.S. requires the Optimist Club to conduct a Level 2 background screening of each current and prospective athletic coach. The Optimist Club may not authorize any person to act as an athletic coach unless a Level 2 background screening. The process was not completed by the Optimist Club by January 1, 2025 therefore a non-compliance letter was issued by the City.

Robert Dialberto asked if the residency requirement was always a major issue. City Manager Rey said the residency requirement of 70% has been in effect for 12 years.

Commissioner Shrouder said the residency requirement started at 90% and then lowered as the years passed and changed to 70% in 2003.

City Attorney Horowitz said he has been with the City since 2019 and the residency issue has come up fairly consistently for the past five years.

City Manager Rey said the attempted draft agreement had a participation rate. Different cities do look to incentivize the residents who register.

Mr. Schlang said the Optimist Club offered numerous times to establish a new agreement.

Commissioner Shrouder said the last agreement had stalled due to the club not wanting to have level 2 background checks. Mr. Schlang said the issue was cost.

Deputy Manager McMahon said the agreement that did not move forward had a residency requirement at 55% with a \$2,500 fee if the residency requirement was not met. She advised they looked into agreements used in Miami Lakes and Plantation. Max participation is not listed in the proposed agreement. Miami Lakes has a maximum of 100 people in the program. The City of Plantation limits the number of teams per sport. Cooper City charges \$50 plus the \$15. Miami Lakes charges \$55 per year for a membership card with a \$25 discount for residents. Plantation uses a formula. The fee policy for Cooper City and Plantation is up to the club. Miami Lakes jointly agree. Cooper City has a residency requirement of 70/30. Miami Lakes have all fees reviewed by the City Manager and residents have a two week early sign up option. The City of Plantation has an 80% requirement for the rec program and 50/50 on the travel agreement.

Commissioner Shrouder said the City of Pembroke Pines has a 65% residency requirement.

Mr. Schlang said there are numerous agreements available but they need to establish one that meets the needs of Cooper City.

City Manager Rey said looking at all our fields and all sports they need to look at what the fields can handle. There needs to be sufficient amount of time on fields to provide a quality program. They also need to create financial incentives for Cooper City families. Additionally they need to decide on a number for non-residents. He would like to define the field usage and times for each team.

Commissioner Smith said he has heard many complaints from residents and is frustrated that the financial individuals for the club did not attend the meeting tonight. He would like accountability from the club and wants the registrations and field schedules to be determined ahead of time. Commissioner Smith is also disappointed in the City for not taking accountability in buying the equipment.

Commissioner Mallozzi said there is not enough staff in the City to handle moving equipment. She herself as a coach moves the equipment and is very cognizant of taking care of the fields. City Manager Rey believes City staff should move the equipment. With right level of scheduling staff can be responsible for movement of equipment.

Commissioner Shrouder agrees the City should purchase the equipment. He is also open to moving to a capacity item as opposed to percentages. They can base numbers on facilities.

Commissioner Katzman said he has been a coach and a parent of a player in three of the four main sports. He has the upmost respect for Optimist from the referees to the coaches. He decided not to coach this year based on the fact he did not have enough time to determine where and when practices could be held. He believes it is the City's responsibility to support the Optimist and allow the sports to have ample space and times. The lack of practice time does not help develop the children. He would like the City to set the maximum numbers based on field space available.

Mr. Schlang said they used to sit with Parks and Recreation staff three times a year to discuss upcoming sports. Those meetings have not been taking place.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she witnesses non-residents using our fields. Entire adult teams from outside cities are utilizing our fields.

City Manager Rey said they need a system in place to keep track of every event at every field.

Mayor Curran said there are open fields at night from 7:30 PM to 8:30 PM. He has heard concerns from residents including issues with the batting cages.

Deputy City Manager McMahon said they can write into the agreement the responsibilities for equipment.

City Manager Rey said Rec-Trac can show how much money is collected and from where.

Commissioner Shrouder said the current resolution states the City should have the right to inspect the books and records of the optimist. He stated that is interpreted different by the Optimist. This means the records should be submitted to the City not that we need to go to someone's home to view the information.

Commissioner Smith said it is ridiculous that that information is not available to be sent electronically.

Mr. Schlang said the concern was making the information public.

Commissioner Smith wants accountability with the program and reports made available for the financial information.

Commissioner Shrouder said legally they are required to have the financials as public records as they are dealing with the City.

City Attorney Horowitz said to the extent that the optimists are acting as agents of the City the information is public record.

Commissioner Mallozzi said every 501c3 organization has to have financials available for viewing. Commissioner Mallozzi asked if background checks are public record. City Attorney Horowitz answered no. Assistant Parks and Recreation Director Josh Rhodes showed a demonstration of the Rec-Trac software.

Commissioner Shrouder said the City should have a staff membertrained in Rec Trac and be the key contact for the club.

Richard Moss said the Optimist have went through several demonstrations for software. Their current software flags certain elements.

Commissioner Smith said the club needs to work with the City as they need to stay accountable to the residents.

Wayne Stofsky said the software they use is sufficient.

Commissioner Shrouder said Rec Trac has a component for field utilization and rentals.

Commissioner Smith said both parties need to work together for the facility use agreement in 45 days.

Mr. Schlang asked if the City is willing to purchase the modules needed in Rec Trac for the club. Commissioner Smith said he will support the City paying for the module.

Deputy Manager McMahon said our Parks and Recreation Director has to manually check addresses of every player. This task is tedious and Rec Trac can provide reports more transparently.

Commissioner Katzman said he will support the financial resources needed to support the programs. He is also willing to offer staff resources.

Commissioner Mallozzi said certain sports offer incentives to hit the 70% mark. She asked if Rec Trac can accommodate discounts. Deputy Manager McMahon said the system has the ability to change costs.

City Manager Rey said he is proposing he and the Optimist have two meetings to solidify the facility use agreement. Separately IT can meet with the club on implementation of Rec Trac. Once a good template is reached the Commission and the Optimist can meet again.

Commissioner Smith wants to assure all areas are addressed.

Wayne Stofsky asked if the City will handle registrations with Rec Trac. Assistant Director Rhodes said the Optimist can have access to the program.

City Manager Rey said the benefit of using Rec Trac is that all registered users can see the sports programs offered.

## PUBLIC COMMMENTS (3 MINUTES)

Danny Ortiz, Optimist Soccer Coach and resident of Embassy lakes said a lot of soccer clubs are for profit. He also stated software installation can take several months.

Paulina, spoke via Zoom and asked if there is a difference between travel and recreational teams for soccer when scheduling practice.

Commissioner Shrouder said he believes rec team games should be prioritized over travel soccer practice.

Commissioner Mallozzi said the conditioning for the programs is very different.

Commissioner Shrouder said the program with the most residents needs prioritized.

Mark, previous coach spoke on an email he received stating travel soccer is being pushed out of Flamingo West Park and as an option entirely. He is speaking in support of the travel soccer team and in support of transparency from the Optimist. He also supports the City paying for the equipment needed.

Mike Russo, asked if Rec Trac will be a mandate from the City and asked if they can track the usage of the parks. He stated there are adults that occupy the fields after the club leaves the fields for the night.

Commissioner Smith said he has heard several times that we have issues on oversight of our fields. He would like to have a projection at the next commission meeting on what type of personnel we need to hire to address the field issues.

The meeting adjourned at 7:03 PM.
