MINUTES

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 5:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed for the tragic events that took place in Nashville.

ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Mallozzi, Katzman, Shrouder, Green and Mayor Ross.

DECORUM

City Clerk Tedra Allen read the decorum policy as follows: Members of the Commission, staff members, citizens, and others are required to use civil and appropriate language when addressing the Commission or anyone present at the meeting and must refrain from using profanity, cursing, or exhibiting aggressive or threatening behavior. All comments should generally be directed to the presiding officer and not to individual members of the Commission, staff, or the audience. No personal verbal attacks toward any individual by either the Commission, staff, citizens, or others shall be allowed during any meeting of the Commission. Any persons making impertinent or slanderous remarks or personal attacks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Commission or who otherwise violates the decorum rules set forth herein shall be barred from further audience before the Commission by the Mayor, or by request of any member of the Commission unless permission to continue or again address the Commission be granted by a majority vote of the Commission members present.

CHANGES TO AGENDA/EMERGENCY MATTERS

Commissioner Katzman asked for a consensus to table item 12, Ordinance 23-10 as members of the community particularly in the real estate industry would like to offer input on the ordinance and they could not attend tonight's meeting.

Commissioner Mallozzi received an email from the head of the real-estate association indicating their list of concerns but has not received a response to her email in return.

Commissioner Katzman stated he received a list of concerns and asked that the email be sent to the entire Commission and added to the record.

Commissioner Green advised while he respects the realtors concerns he is prepared to address the item tonight.

Commissioner Shrouder respects the realtors concerns and explained his position with regard to several other residents' concerns.

Commissioner Mallozzi does not want the residents to have to endure concerns for any longer than need be.

Commissioner Shrouder asked for the meeting schedule in April and the advertising requirements.

City Attorney Horowitz advised there's an advertising component stating the ordinance title needs to be ran in the newspaper 10 days prior to second reading.

Commissioner Katzman said the residents present tonight can speak on their concerns and they will be considered. He also suggested members of the Commission speak with members of the realtor's organization. He also stated any resident with a concern can email or call him.

Commissioner Green has concerns with the residents that are being impacted daily by the vacation rentals. He believes there is time between first and second reading to address additional concerns.

Mayor Ross stated he has had Cooper City realtors ask him to table the item.

Commissioner Shrouder said it's important for the residents to understand the City is not allowed to prohibit vacation rentals however, they can regulate them. It is his intent to be very strict but he wants to assure the rules are allowable. The delay will not affect the registration process that's in affect. He has witnessed some of the residents' concerns and he wants to hear all sides to be fair and just.

Mayor Ross read an email from Nate Parson into the record asking the Commission to postpone Ordinance 23-10.

Commissioner Katzman pulled item 2.

Commissioner Shrouder pulled item 3.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve the consent agenda with the exception of items 2 and 3. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (5-0)

2. Motion to approve a letter of support to the Broward County School Board asking that the Children residing in the Country Glen Development be given choice to attend Pioneer Middle School Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Katzman supports the item whole heartily and would like to address the letters to each member of the school board individually.

Commissioner Shrouder said he tried to speak to the school board in the past about the item but has never heard back.

Commissioner Mallozzi said the school board is discussing boundaries as a whole. She also advised there are six families at Griffin Elementary that are not in the feeder pattern for Pioneer Middle School.

Commissioner Shrouder believes the boundaries should be redone.

Mayor Ross asked if the Education Advisory Board has an opinion on the matter.

MOTION: Commissioner Mallozzi moved to approve a letter of support to the Broward County School Board asking that the Children residing in the Country Glen Development be given choice to attend

Pioneer Middle School and the letters shall be addressed to each School Board member individually. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

3. Motion to Approve a Piggyback on a National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance (NCPA) RFP 36-22 agreement with MCCI to provide Laserfiche Cloud Professional Records Management System (RMS) Service. – City Clerk/Administration

Commissioner Shrouder would like the item to be bid out. He asked why the item was budgeted at \$60,000 but it is now \$90,000. City Manager Napoli advised the additional cost will be taken out of the line for ARPA additional items. Commissioner Shrouder stated the item is not time sensitive and is almost \$100,000 dollars so he would like the item to be placed out to bid.

Commissioner Green said generally speaking piggybacks offer a better rate.

Commissioner Shrouder said if the item is bid out and the responses are higher we can always go back to the piggyback. He does not see an exception to allow for the piggyback.

Mayor Ross said the preparation of the bid may potentially be a waste of staff time.

Commissioner Shrouder asked the justification for the piggyback.

Commissioner Katzman said he believes the item was thoroughly reviewed when it was prepared by the agency offering the piggyback.

Commissioner Shrouder said our specific needs are not considered as this is a general contract.

Commissioner Katzman stated there is a page in the backup for specifics.

Commissioner Shrouder said our specifications are particular and this item is not time sensitive.

Commissioner Green said he would imagine there are other municipalities that have the same software we are currently using and that has been taken into consideration already.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked the downfall in putting the item out to bid. CFO Kendrick said the downside is staff time and the lack of available staff members to work on the bid.

Commissioner Shrouder said the hours it may take for our City to scan in the materials may be less than what is calculated in the piggyback agreement.

Commissioner Katzman said as long as we have the opportunity to return to the piggyback pricing if proposals are indeed higher he supports the RFP.

Commissioner Green said we are burdening the staff with additional work. The audit is due in days and staff needs to address the audit first.

City Manager Napoli said there is no time constriction for the item other than it is being funded by ARPA.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if staff can mirror the RFP in the backup to save time. CFO Kendrick said that can be one stage of the process.

Mayor Ross asked how long the process would take. CFO Kendrick estimated 60 days.

Commissioner Shrouder said this bid can wait. He would also like to have the scope specific to indexing.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to bid the records management system item. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote. (4-1)

YES: Commissioners Mallozzi, Katzman, Shrouder and Mayor Ross

NO: Commissioner Green

CFO Kendrick thanked the Commission and City Manager Napoli for their support and the opportunity with the City.

6. Discussion and possible action to name an alternate to the SOLID WASTE MUNICIPAL DELEGATES. – Mayor Ross

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to appoint Commissioner Green as the alternate to the Solid Waste Municipal Delegates. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

7. Discussion and possible action on including a Business and Volunteer Spotlight on future agendas. – Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Mallozzi would like to spotlight a business once a month with their name drawn from a fishbowl. She would also like to highlight residents who volunteer. She spoke to members of the Education Advisory Board who are willing to review applications if needed.

Commissioner Green has no issue with the idea. He would like to highlight the volunteers of the City.

Commissioner Shrouder said he has concerns with the spotlight appearing as a City endorsement. He does not believe the spotlight should be at a Commission meeting but rather on Channel 78. He also suggested adding the spotlight to the emails that are distributed to the residents.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she wants to help local businesses.

Commissioner Katzman believes it is a great idea to highlight businesses and volunteers that make the City special. He wants to assure the businesses selected are up to date on their taxes and have no code case concerns. He also wants to assure the selection process is defined.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested a special series highlighting businesses and volunteers to be ran on Channel 78.

City Manager Napoli said they need to determine a selection process and policy.

Commissioner Shrouder said the City of Margate does a Taste of the City where they visit businesses.

Commissioner Mallozzi prefers the randomness of choosing the businesses and volunteers from a fishbowl.

Mayor Ross said this idea was voted down in the past as it can be interpreted as an endorsement. He also asked if the advisory boards have reviewed the item. He has no issue with the volunteer spotlight however, he does not believe this is the best method of promotion for the businesses.

City Attorney Horowitz advised he did have an opportunity to speak to Commissioner Mallozzi and raised some of the concerns that are being addressed this evening. His real concern was the manner in which a business was chosen or selected. Whether that was by this Commission or by a committee, without having some stated, clear criteria it would give him some concern in the context of an endorsement or a recommendation being made by the City to a particular business within our community. Drawing out of a fishbowl may alleviate some concerns. If there is an interest in moving forward with this opportunity he would suggest that this entire process be embraced in a policy. He would like the opportunity to work on a policy with staff, and as part of that drafting process review, all of the legal issues referenced this evening. He also stated staff would have to review each business as code violations occur.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested staff look at other municipalities and see if similar programs exist.

Commissioner Green said in the past the Commission has visited businesses that are members of the Chamber and members of the City. He believes the initiative can happen.

A consensus was reached for staff to look at other municipalities and see if similar programs exist.

8. Discussion and possible action to limit the height of any future structure in Cooper City to no more than 50 feet without a variance - Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Mallozzi said she has driven past the steeple on Palm Avenue which is 84 feet tall many times and while the structure is beautiful she does not believe these size structures are suitable for the City as we are a more residential community.

City Attorney Horowitz said that this would impact the entire City, unlike the item that's currently been drafted to go to Planning and Zoning addressing height which would only affect the X-1 zoning district. He would want to do a little research from a zoning perspective. There is a private cause of action in Florida that the legislature has created, known as the Bert J. Harris Act which gives property owners the right to bring a cause of action against the local government when the action of the local government inordinately burdens the private property owner's rights or their existing use or perspective use of their property. So he would want to ensure that there would be no issue with regard to restricting height in the City that might otherwise create a challenge.

Commissioner Green disagrees with the item due to this being a City-wide change impacting the entire City. A precedent has been set, and this may cause an undue burden.

Commissioner Shrouder stated while the intent of the item is good this method can result in unanticipated consequences. They need to start with the zoning districts individually.

Commissioner Katzman likes the idea as many residents have said they want to restrict height in our community. He is fine with making changes individually but wants to ensure they work on height restrictions as it was a clear directive from the residents.

Mayor Ross said one solution does not fit all. He has no difficulty looking at zoning districts individually and reviewing them. A sweeping change is not good for the entire City.

Commissioner Katzman said he heard from many residents that they do not want to go beyond 50 feet in the community.

Commissioner Green asked if the advisory boards have weighed in on the issue. He does not believe it is a one size fits all answer.

9. ORDINANCES ON FIRST READING

10. Ordinance 23-8 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, SUBMITTING TO REFERENDUM PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY AMENDING ARTICLE III, ENTITLED "LEGISLATIVE;" AND IN PARTICULAR AMENDING SECTION 3.02, ENTITLED "QUALIFICATIONS, ELECTIONS AND TERMS;" AMENDING SECTION 3.10, ENTITLED "VACANCIES, FORFEITURES OF OFFICE, FILLING OF VACANCIES;" AMENDING ARTICLE V, ENTITLED "FINANCIAL PROCEDURES," AMENDING SECTION 5.02, ENTITLED "SUBMISSION OF BUDGET AND MESSAGE," AND AMENDING SECTION 5.13, ENTITLED "REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC BIDDING;" PROVIDING FOR CONSISTENCY WITH FLORIDA LAW RELATED TO THE PUBLICATION OF LEGAL NOTICES UNDER SPECIAL CONDITIONS ON A PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE WEBSITE OWNED OR DESIGNATED BY BROWARD COUNTY; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE, WHEN ADOPTED, SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, ON THE NOVEMBER 5, 2024, GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT AND IT SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE AS PROVIDED BY LAW; PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISING OF THE REFERENDUM ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE." by title

Commissioner Katzman supports the item but would like to inquire if the item can be placed on an earlier ballot if no additional costs are associated. City Clerk Allen will contact the Supervisor of Elections for costs.

Commissioner Shrouder interprets the Charter to allow the advertising on the county website as it stands

due to the change in law.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 23-8 and have second reading once the election date is confirmed. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

City Attorney Horowitz said Commissioner Shrouder is interpreting the charter to read we already are authorized to advertise on the county's website and that the Charter amendment is essentially a housekeeping item to confirm the requirements of State Law.

Mayor Ross asked if the County website is ready. City Clerk Allen said the County is still working on the website.

City Attorney Horowitz said barring some unforeseen situation during the current calendar year, the only time this will be an issue is when the City publishes its notice of the Budget Workshops over the summer.

Mayor Ross agrees with Commissioner Shrouder but disagrees with the urgency.

Commissioner Shrouder is fine with waiting until the item is passed by referendum.

11. Ordinance 23-9 (Commission)

City Attorney read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION," ARTICLE II ENTITLED, "CITY COMMISSION;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 2-23, ENTITLED, "CITY COMMISSION CANDIDATES - RESIDENCY;" PROVIDING FOR CONSISTENCY BETWEEN THE CHARTER AND THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR CANDIDATES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to include driver license/government ID card in section 2-2-3 to be inclusive of everyone who may not have a driver's license.

Commissioner Shrouder said there are several mentions of residency for one year and he would like to instead reference the Charter.

Commissioner Katzman would also like the oath to include a list all of the addresses the candidate has lived at throughout the year.

Commissioner Green said the oath asks the candidate if they lived in the City for a year.

Commissioner Katzman said the list of addresses will help aid in transparency.

Commissioner Green said the listing of the addresses leads to additional work for verification.

City Attorney Horowitz said the oath is indicated in the charter and reads, they are a candidate for the office of City Commissioner for a District in Cooper City, Florida, and that they have resided continuously in a District in the City of Cooper City for six months immediately prior to the taking of this oath. Which will now say in the "City" and the "City of Cooper City for at least one year immediately prior to taking this oath".

Commissioner Katzman asked why it is an issue to ask our candidates to list their continuous addresses over the past year if the overall goal in asking for a driver's license, water bill, or lease is to prove that they live in Cooper City.

Commissioner Green said this is an additional step in the process.

Mayor Ross said this step adds additional information to allow the voters to see if the individual is a permanent resident of the City.

Commissioner Green understands the goal is to make sure the candidate lives within the City.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked about the difference between someone who has lived in the City for years but only goes to their home for an hour a day and then goes somewhere else.

Commissioner Shrouder said there is a difference between proof and affirmation. He also wants the documentation to read the requirement for a lease showing the past 12 months or have the candidate sign a sworn affidavit. He also stated there is case law that speaks to homestead.

Commissioner Katzman said when an individual applies for a rental, job, or credit line an individual would list their previous addresses. This process allows for transparency.

Commissioner Green said when a candidate takes the oath they are signing off on truthful information.

Commissioner Katzman said if we are not willing to ask for continuous addresses, then we should not ask for documents proving residency.

Commissioner Shrouder said water bills do not show where someone lives. We should require an oath and a list of addresses.

City Attorney Horowitz stated this is not so much a Supervisor of Elections issue as it is a Florida constitution issue and an election code issue. Cities in general are very limited, with the imposition they could put on candidates when it comes to qualifying for office. There is plenty of case law that affirms residency requirements. So we know that the one-year residency requirement that the Commission recently embraced in the Charter Amendment is legally supportable. Currently, candidates for office, including each of you signed in addition to your statement of candidacy, your oath of candidacy, which is the State form. You also sign an Oath of Residency which attests to the fact currently you've lived where you lived at the time within your commission district for at least 6 months prior to qualifying. The proposed amendment would expand that to embrace the charter and provide for a one-year extension.

What he believes Commissioner Katzman is suggesting is as part of that Oath of Residency have somewhere on that written form, where you would list the addresses that you resided within that year.

Commissioner Green said he has no issue with the change, but he also has no issue with what is in place currently.

Commissioner Shrouder said a candidate does not have to produce a water bill or deed. A homeless individual can claim they live in the Cooper City Walmart parking lot and as long as they are registered to vote they can qualify.

Commissioner Green asked how that individual would be registered to vote if they did not have an address.

City Attorney Horowitz said you are eligible to vote and eligible to run for office without having a permanent residence.

Commissioner Shrouder does not want to include a water bill as it does not state residency.

Commissioner Green asked if the Elections Office asks for additional information when registering an individual to vote.

Commissioner Mallozzi said several states do not require a photo ID to vote.

Commissioner Shrouder said he would suspect the Elections Office would offer an alternative if someone does not have a photo ID perhaps a sworn affidavit.

City Attorney Horowitz advised the Florida Election Code, Chapter 97 provides a list of items that the Supervisor of Elections may consider determining whether or not a person is who, in fact, whom they say they are, and the list includes everything from a U.S. Passport to a debit or credit card, Military Id, student identification, retirement card, neighborhood association identification, a concealed weapons permit, utility bill, bank statement, government check, and a paycheck.

Commissioner Shrouder said the Elections Office confirms identity. The City confirms residency for the one-year requirement.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve Ordinance 23-9 to include listing previous residences. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve Ordinance 23-9 as amended. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

12. Ordinance-23-10 (Commission)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS," TO AMEND ARTICLE VIII, ENTITLED "VACATION RENTALS;" BY PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS, NOISE MONITORING DEVICES, DEFINING MAXIMUM OCCUPANCY REQUIREMENTS, AND PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT INCLUDING DESIGNATING NOISE VIOLATIONS AS A HEALTH, SAFETY,

AND WELFARE VIOLATION WITH EXPEDITED ENFORCEMENT; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

13. Ordinance 23-11 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 13, ENTITLED "PUBLIC SAFETY," AMENDING ARTICLE VI, ENTITLED "CODE ENFORCEMENT," BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 13-71. ENTITLED "SCHEDULING AND CONDUCT OF A HEARING;" AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR THE CITY MANAGER'S DESIGNEE, TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE SPECIAL MAGISTRATE ON CODE ENFORCEMENT AND BUILDING CODE ENFORCEMENT MATTERS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to amend section H, to read the Community Development Director shall make recommendations to the Special Magistrate as to fine amounts and timeframes to bring the property into compliance, unless otherwise designated by the City Manager.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to assure responsibility is clear. He would like to add that language to the Police Chief section as well.

Commissioner Green said this would take responsibility away from the City Manager.

Commissioner Shrouder said he is not taking power from the City Manager. He is saying the Police Chief can make the recommendations unless otherwise designated by the City Manager.

Commissioner Green said the language as written is sufficient.

Commissioner Shrouder clarified he is not diminishing the City Manager's power.

Mayor Ross said the Police Chief might want to designate someone other than himself.

Commissioner Shrouder said the language could read, Community Development Department and Police Department.

Commissioner Shrouder asked City Attorney Horowitz if under the current language, the City Manager would have to consult with the Police Chief. City Attorney Horowitz answered yes. Commissioner Shrouder asked under his new proposed language, does the City Manager have to consult with the Police Chief. City Attorney Horowitz answered no unless he disagrees with the recommendation. The City Manager has the final decision.

Commissioner Green said the City Manager should choose the individual who is designated. Commissioner Shrouder wants to ensure the person in charge is listed for responsibility.

Commissioner Shrouder asked who makes a recommendation for a tree removal citation.

City Manager Napoli said currently Code Enforcement would handle the citation. Public Works would make the recommendation.

Commissioner Green said the function of the designee should lay with the City Manager.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to have a record of responsibility and ultimate authority with the City Manager. He does not want to diminish any power of the City Manager. He advised he saw room for improvement in this code and wants to strengthen the process.

Mayor Ross suggested it should read the City Manager or his or her designate, and then there will be a separate listing of who the designee is.

Commissioner Shrouder asked who is currently in charge of fire inspections at residential properties. Chief Harrington said they have no jurisdiction over residential properties. Captain De Giovanni said a resident could request an inspection. Commissioner Shrouder asked who handles fire safety issues.

City Manager Napoli has no difficulty with the language change but recommended unless the City Manager determines otherwise.

Commissioner Shrouder cited the language as the following, the Community Development Department unless the City Manager determines otherwise, shall make the recommendations on building code violations. The Police Department, unless the City Manager determines otherwise, shall make recommendations.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 23-11 as amended to read the Community Development Department, unless determined otherwise by the City Manager shall make recommendations to the special magistrate regarding fine amounts and timeframes to bring the property into compliance for all building code violations. The Police Department, unless determined otherwise by the City Manager shall make recommendations to the special magistrate regarding fine amounts and timeframes to bring the property to compliance for all code violations. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 23-11 as amended. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

ORDINANCES ON SECOND READING (Public Hearing)

14. Ordinance 23-6 (Community Development)

City Attorney Horowitz "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 21 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 21-8, ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS;" PROVIDING FOR A DEFINITION OF PERGOLAS; FURTHER AMENDING CHAPTER 23 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "ZONING DISTRICTS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING ARTICLE V, SECTION 23-82, ENTITLED "ACCESSORY BUILDINGS;" PROVIDING FOR THE INCLUSION OF PERGOLAS AS AN ACCESSORY BUILDING; PERMITTING THE INSTALLATION OF CANOPIES OR FIXED AWNINGS THREE (3) FEET FROM A PROPERTY LINE WHEN

Commissioner Shrouder would like to remove all the and/or’s and replace them with the word or.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Mallozzi moved to approve Ordinance 23-6 with the removal of the and/or’s. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR RESOLUTIONS

15. Resolution 23-1 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read “A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 05-5-1, AS AMENDED, BY FURTHER AMENDING THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES AND POLICIES FOR THE CONDUCT OF CITY COMMISSION BUSINESS; PROVIDING FOR AN 11:30 END TIME TO REGULAR CITY COMMISSION MEETINGS; PROVIDING FOR THE PLACEMENT OF ITEMS ON THE AGENDA IN THE ORDER OF SENIORITY BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COMMISSION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Commissioner Green thanked the current Executive Assistant Ms. Morin for her work and dedication. He also believes the responsibilities that an Executive Assistant to Elected Officials is numerous and he would like an additional individual to be added. He has no issues with the issuance of Proclamations and advised they should be issued at Special Recognition Meetings. He agrees with the 11:30 PM ending time and does not believe it is appropriate to have late evening meetings and assumes the public can stay late into the night. He would also like to limit the number of items an individual can add to an agenda. He also stated the dais seating should be by majority vote. He spoke on his perception of the seat he currently sits in and recommends the Mayor sitting in the center with the Commissioners sitting to his left and right to signify unity.

Commissioner Katzman asked about the concerns with the Proclamations.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she believes a proclamation should only be issued if the entire Commission supports the idea. She also believes the person who added the recognition should be the individual who presents the recognition at the meeting.

Commissioner Katzman agrees with Commissioner Green with the Mayor sitting in the center of the dais. A more fair way of choosing the seats may be allowing the senior Commissioners to choose first. He would also like to add Zoom technology to the Resolution as it only mentions call-ins. He also said the Resolution references the allowance of three call-ins and he does not believe it should be the Commission that decides on a limit. He would also like to clean up the speaking time limits to be consistent and include a policy on either yielding time or prohibiting the yielding of time.

Commissioner Shrouder is fine with the current issuing of Proclamations although he understands the potential for abuse. He also believes if a Commission member places a Proclamation on the agenda they should be the one to read and hand it out.

City Manager Napoli said the staff tries to leave all Proclamations for the Special Recognition Meetings however some are time-sensitive.

Commissioner Mallozzi said if there is a Proclamation placed on the agenda that they all do not agree on it should be voted on.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested adding a clause that Proclamations should not take policy positions.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she prefers to vote on everything.

Commissioner Katzman said if a Proclamation is published on an agenda and a fellow Commissioner does not support the item it can be pulled immediately. Then the item would be brought forth for a vote.

City Attorney Horowitz would like to remove the mention of the Proclamation Request Form.

Consensus was reached to remove the mention of the Proclamation Request Form.

Commissioner Shrouder has no issue with the 11:30 PM end time unless overruled by a majority vote. He also would prefer not to strike and salary City staff in Section 1.2. He believes directors should be able to put items on the agenda especially the Finance Director who reports to the Commission in certain instances. He suggested the revision to read, and Department Directors.

Mayor Ross does not believe the Directors should add items to the agenda independently of the City Manager.

Commissioner Green agrees with Mayor Ross. He said the Commission has the right to speak to the Directors if questions arise.

Commissioner Shrouder said the Directors do not have the right to approach the Commission independently.

Commissioner Green said a chain of command is in place and the Directors are present during agenda reviews with the Commission.

Commissioner Shrouder said we need a procedure in place to allow Directors to speak to Commission. City

Manager Napoli said he encourages the Directors to have an open dialogue with the Commission.

Commissioner Katzman said if a Director abuses the rule it will result in a negative response from the Commission and the process will in turn control itself.

City Manager Napoli said the Directors currently place items on the agenda as they need the items passed to run their prospective departments.

Commissioner Green said potentially an employee could approach three elected officials for an item and never speak to the City Manager. He also advised the Charter make it very clear who works directly for the City Commission.

Commissioner Shrouder said the Resolution already allows salaried employees to add items to the agenda.

Mayor Ross said this process would allow for a Director to bypass the City Manager to add items to the agenda.

Commissioner Shrouder said the City Manager will see and approve the item in the agenda software Municode.

Commissioner Shrouder said if the item placed on the agenda was not important he would absolutely support the City Manager in termination if abuse occurred.

Commissioner Katzman said if an employee puts himself on the line with adding an item to an agenda the Commission will evaluate the situation.

Mayor Ross said the employee has the option to call the hotline the Commission approved.

Commissioner Shrouder said a compromise is allowing the term Department Heads as it currently reads all salaried employees and it has never been an issue.

Mayor Ross does not see the need.

A consensus was reached to strike salaried employees and add Director Heads in Section 1.2.

Commissioner Shrouder would like the deadline for the Commission to add items to the agenda to be the end of the night the Tuesday before the meeting as he has a full-time job.

Mayor Ross said he would like the agenda final before his agenda review on the Tuesday before the meeting.

City Attorney Horowitz read the Resolution currently provides that the agenda shall be completed by the Clerk's Office and distributed to members of the Commission no later than the Friday 10 days prior to the meeting. Items placed on the agenda by members of the Commission may be provided to the City Clerk for placement on the agenda no later than seven days prior to the Commission meeting.

Mayor Ross believes the placement of agenda items should be harmonized.

Commissioner Shrouder said the Commission needs additional time to view the agenda to ensure their item is indeed placed on the agenda.

City Attorney Horowitz stated he did have some part in this recommendation and with his experience, it is a little uncommon for members of the Commission or staff to have an opportunity to add items to the agenda as a matter of routine after the agenda is finalized while there is nothing unlawful about it the

recommendation was to have a firm deadline for both staff and members of the Commission to finalize an agenda.

Commissioner Green asked about Commissioner Shrouder's difficulty with having items into the City Clerk's Department prior to Tuesday night.

Commissioner Katzman said whether the item is received at 5:00 PM or 11:59 PM the item will not appear on the agenda until the next business day anyway as staff leaves at 5:00 PM.

A consensus was reached to leave the deadline for the Commission to place items on the agenda no later than seven days prior to the Commission meeting.

Commissioner Shrouder does not believe they should codify a time limit for speakers but instead have a 60-minute standard.

Commissioner Mallozzi said residents need to know how much time they have to speak to prepare appropriately.

Commissioner Katzman would like the time limits to be consistent.

Commissioner Shrouder also does not believe they should have cross-examination.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to allow a back-and-forth if a resident has questions.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to remove the and/or's from the Resolution. He also has no issue with the Mayor choosing the dais seats, as it is customary. He believes seating is management of the meeting and that is delegated to the Chair.

Commissioner Green believes the Commission as a whole should determine the seating arrangements.

Commissioner Shrouder said the body can override the seating if needed. However, he believes the seating helps run the meeting.

Commissioner Green does not believe that one individual should have the right to determine dais seating as everyone is equal. He said the Mayor has never explained the movement of the seats.

Commissioner Shrouder said it might help if the Mayor offers an explanation when assigning the dais seating.

Mayor Ross has no difficulty giving a reason behind the seating placement.

Commissioner Katzman prefers the Mayor sit in the middle surrounded by Commission members.

Mayor Ross said he needs to confer with the City Attorney while he is running the meeting.

Commissioner Katzman said other municipalities have dais seating based on district number.

The Commission took a five-minute recess.

Mayor Ross said he has no difficulty giving an explanation when he rearranges the seats. Commissioner Green apologized and recognizes the Mayor's authority as Chair of the meeting.

Commissioner Mallozzi said on the reports handed in by the employees explaining their time and tasks the Mayor was monopolizing the time of the Executive Assistant to the Elected Officials. She asked that if the Mayor is traveling for the Florida League, the Florida League can perhaps make the arrangements. She also stated the assistant traveled to Miami to help the Mayor receive a pass to bypass the line at the airport.

Mayor Ross clarified the Executive Assistant offered to assist him.

Commissioner Mallozzi believes the time of the Executive Assistant needs to be divided equally among the elective body. She also has concerns with placing items on the agenda in seniority order as she and Commissioner Katzman can be potentially cut off with a limit. She also believes the seating on the dais should be the prerogative of the entire Commission. The Commission is equal, and they should all decide on what seat is appropriate. She also said she has her agenda briefings on Fridays and by Tuesday the agenda has been changed.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the agenda software we have can list a summary of changes.

Commissioner Mallozzi said if items are changed the changes need to be indicated. She also prefers to have open dialogue on the dais as this is the only time the Commission has the opportunity to do so. She would also like consistency in public speaking times. This allows the residents to prepare within the time constraint. She also believes they need to have a firm rule on yielding or not yielding time. She stated if there are any procedural changes the Commission needs to vote on them. She also wants to ensure the Mayor is passing the gavel when motioning on items.

Commissioner Green said to his knowledge the Mayor does pass the gavel when making a motion.

Commissioner Mallozzi would like to return to having one meeting in the summer to allow for staff to focus on other items.

Commissioner Green has no issue with one meeting in the summer.

City Attorney Horowitz stated the Charter reads the Commission shall meet regularly not less than once each month.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested they vote on the summer schedule closer to the summer months. He recommended the language the City Commission may adopt a revised schedule for the summer months.

Commissioner Mallozzi would like to remove the reference to keys to the City as the only person to ever receive a key was Morris Cooper. She would prefer a plaque be given in lieu of a key. She also does not believe an honorary citizen has ever been chosen. She also would like to specify criteria for the removal of an individual from a Commission Meeting.

City Attorney Horowitz read Section 1.6, Members of the Commission, staff members, citizens, and others are required to use civil and appropriate language when addressing the Commission or anyone present at the meeting, and must refrain from using profanity, cursing, or exhibiting aggressive or threatening behavior. All comments should generally be directed to the presiding officer and not to individual members of the Commission (except as to questions to a Commissioner when authorized by paragraph 1.5 (b) above), staff, or the audience. No personal verbal attacks toward any individual by either the Commission, staff, citizens, or others shall be allowed during any meeting of the Commission. Any persons making impertinent or slanderous remarks or personal attacks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Commission or who otherwise violates the decorum rules set forth herein shall be barred from further audience before the Commission by the Mayor, or by request of any member of the Commission, unless permission to continue or again address the Commission be granted by a majority vote of the Commission members present.

Commissioner Mallozzi spoke on an instance where a soccer team recently came into the City and provided a jersey and pin to the City and the Mayor left in possession of those items. The items were presented to the City and they should have remained with the City.

Mayor Ross confirmed the items were given to the City Manager and even recommended the items be placed in the historical museum. He safe kept the items at the time as there were multiple people in the auditorium for the event.

Mayor Ross said as Mayor sometimes he has to make the tough decisions on behalf of the residents. He would also like to limit agenda items to three to allow for prioritization.

Commissioner Shrouder said he does not believe he can be prevented from adding items that are required to be addressed in public.

Commissioner Green does not believe numerous items need placed on one particular meeting agenda.

Commissioner Shrouder said he needs the ability to notice his items and speak to his fellow Commissioners.

Commissioner Green spoke at a previous meeting where a discussion and motion was made on an item that was not listed on an agenda.

Commissioner Shrouder said the item that is being referenced was on the agenda as employee compensation.

Commissioner Shrouder said some Commissioners add more items to the agenda compared to others.

Commissioner Green said if there is a process to govern individuals visiting the chambers they need to also have a process for accountability among themselves.

Commissioner Shrouder asked Mayor Ross and Commissioner Green why they don't add items to the agenda routinely. Is it because they have been here the longest and a lot of their priorities have been accomplished or they have a relationship with the City Manager, and things are accomplished that way

Commissioner Green stated he understands the importance of working with the City Manager and staff.

Commissioner Katzman said the Commission has the authority to pull items from the agenda if the agenda is being monopolized.

Commissioner Green asked if historically they have ever exercised that authority.

Commissioner Katzman said if a Commissioner places 20 items on an agenda and they are all valid concerns they may need to be addressed.

Mayor Ross would like to look at limits on speaking time.

Commissioner Shrouder said limiting each Commissioner with speaking times was removed because it was not efficient.

Commissioner Mallozzi said starting the meetings earlier is not fair to working residents. She does not want to limit the speaking of Commission members as they cannot govern efficiently.

Mayor Ross would like to add a policy prohibiting the yielding of speaking time. He would also like to edit Section 1.5 subsection b to remove cross-examination.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to allow residents to speak openly.

Mayor Ross would like the Commission to be timed just as the residents are.

Commissioner Katzman said the open dialogue helps the Commission discuss and resolve issues.

Commissioner Green said the Commission has the ability to hear concerns from the residents and staff before the Commission meeting.

City Attorney Horowitz advised there was some relatively recent case law with regards to requiring individuals to provide their name and address when they speak at a public meeting so he added some language too, instead of requiring the completion of the written slip having members of the public be asked to complete the written slip. He also added language providing some discretion in the event that the Mayor wanted to bundle speakers on a particular topic. He will add language where the Commission at its discretion may amend the summer schedule from time to time and strike the reference to the meetings being held on the third Tuesday of the summer months. He will add language that no proclamations will be used for political purposes and that any member of the Commission can object to a proclamation, and request it to be put to a vote. Honorary citizens will be changed to residents. There was also discussion about either a plaque or some other commemoration a Medal of Honor, and he will work with the City Manager and staff on some language to bring back for consideration.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to add that no proclamation should be issued on a policy decision.

Commissioner Katzman would like additional language to honor residents.

Commissioner Green would like the Commission to vote on seating arrangements.

Commissioner Katzman would like there to be a formal seating arrangement.

Discussion ensued on the seats potentially being ordered by seat number.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested the Mayor select the seats and then by seniority the Commission vote as to where they want to sit in those particular seats.

Discussion was had for the Mayor to choose the seats of the City Attorney, City Manager, and City Clerk. The Commission members will by seniority choose their seats from the remaining open seats.

City Attorney Horowitz advised there will be a revised resolution brought back to the next Commission meeting for approval.

Mayor Ross advised due to his role he does require more time from the Executive Assistant to the Elected Officials. He does not micromanage the assistant.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve Resolution 23-1. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Napoli advised the City is close to receiving the Autism Awareness designation. City Manager Napoli thanked Parks and Recreation Director Stacie Weiss and staff for their hard work. He also advised on Thursday, March 30, 2023 staff will give the five City Manager candidates a tour of the City and an open public reception will be held at 5:30 PM in the auditorium. On Friday, March 31, 2023 at 9:00 AM the Commission will start their one-on-one interviews and a Special City Commission meeting will be held at 1:00 PM in the auditorium.

Commissioner Mallozzi advised that Waste Management sent a letter to the City stating they did not believe there is not enough time for the City to issue a RFP and have a company start. She was told previously the RFP was being worked on. City Manager Napoli stated he believes they have enough time and will have the RFP out within the next few weeks. He said Waste Management is offering an extension. Commissioner Mallozzi asked why Public Works Director Tom Good is working on the RFP when in the other position he holds he has taken contributions from another waste collection company other than Waste Management. City Manager Napoli said Mr. Good has a lot of experience in the position and Public Works is the department that handles the contract.

Commissioner Shrouder said if there was an RFP written to exclude Waste Management he believes they would protest quickly.

Commissioner Katzman also reminded the Commission that a workshop was asked to be scheduled to include resident input on bulk trash.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the transfers of the money market accounts will occur. City Manager Napoli answered yes. Commissioner Shrouder asked how the three applicants that were emailed to the Commission were chosen for the Executive Assistant to the Elected Officials position. City Manager Napoli said at the prior meeting he advised the Commission he would narrow down the candidates and present them to the Commission. Commissioner Shrouder said a seasoned judicial assistant was left

out of the list of candidates. He would prefer the new City Manager to be on board to help make the recommendations.

Commissioner Katzman would like to look at the resumes of the applicants that were selected for interviews.

City Manager Napoli has no issue with the Commission narrowing down the applicants.

Commissioner Shrouder said judicial assistants should have been included in the top selections.

Commissioner Green said the City Manager stated the criteria and he selected four individuals that meet that criteria. He stated staff has done what the Commission asked for.

Commissioner Shrouder said the position works for the Commission as it is stated in the job description.

Commissioner Shrouder said it does not make sense that the outgoing City Manager is choosing the new Executive Assistant. He also asked why a judicial assistant was not included.

City Manager Napoli answered he did not consider judicial assistants as a qualifying matter. He considers individuals who have worked for an elected official in the past. He recommended the Commission define the criteria.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to wait for the new City Manager to be on board as he may want to have his own assistant.

Mayor Ross does not want to wait and leave the position vacant.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked that all the Commission members look at the applications and recommend a top 10.

Mayor Ross recommended each Commissioner chose two each and keep the individuals that were already recommended.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

16. Police Chief's Report

Captain De Giovanni said during last week's aggressive driving initiative 54 citations were issued, 30 of which were targeting speeding in the major thoroughfares in the residential communities. On April 18, 19 and 20th they will initiate an active code sweep. He wished the community a Happy Ramadan, Passover and Easter and advised his team will be out in full force assisting the religious facilities with additional patrols. He also thanked everyone for attending Tip-A-Cop where they have now raised a total of about \$5,000 for the Special Olympics. He also advised they received a community grant to fund the Get the Scoop initiative.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about the decrease in citation and warnings as compared to the same time last year. Captain De Giovanni answered he was able to get additional funds last year through grants which he does not have this year as of yet.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

17. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Bishop congratulated the new CERT members and the existing members who just completed 10 weeks of training.

Commissioner Katzman asked about the City responding outside the City eleven times and receiving emergency assistance how many times as it was cut off in the report. Chief Harrington answered six times.

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Green wished everyone a Happy Easter, Ramadan and Passover. He also thanked CFO Kendrick for his professionalism here in the City and wished him well in his future endeavors. He also stated he will not be able to make the Solid Waste meeting tomorrow.

Commissioner Katzman thanked Ron Book and Rona Brown and stated the Mayor and he were both in Tallahassee last week speaking with legislators and the requested items are in the House and Senate budgets.

Commissioner Mallozzi wished everyone a happy holiday and wished CFO Kendrick good luck in his new endeavors.
