NEW Rescue 28 Update: The rescue vehicle has been at Fire Fleet (6700 Powerline Road, Ft. Lauderdale) since March 5th. There remain some outstanding items that require correction. There were a few issues however the vendor deemed to not be part of the specifications or bid package. Matheny stated that they would provide a cost quote for correction.

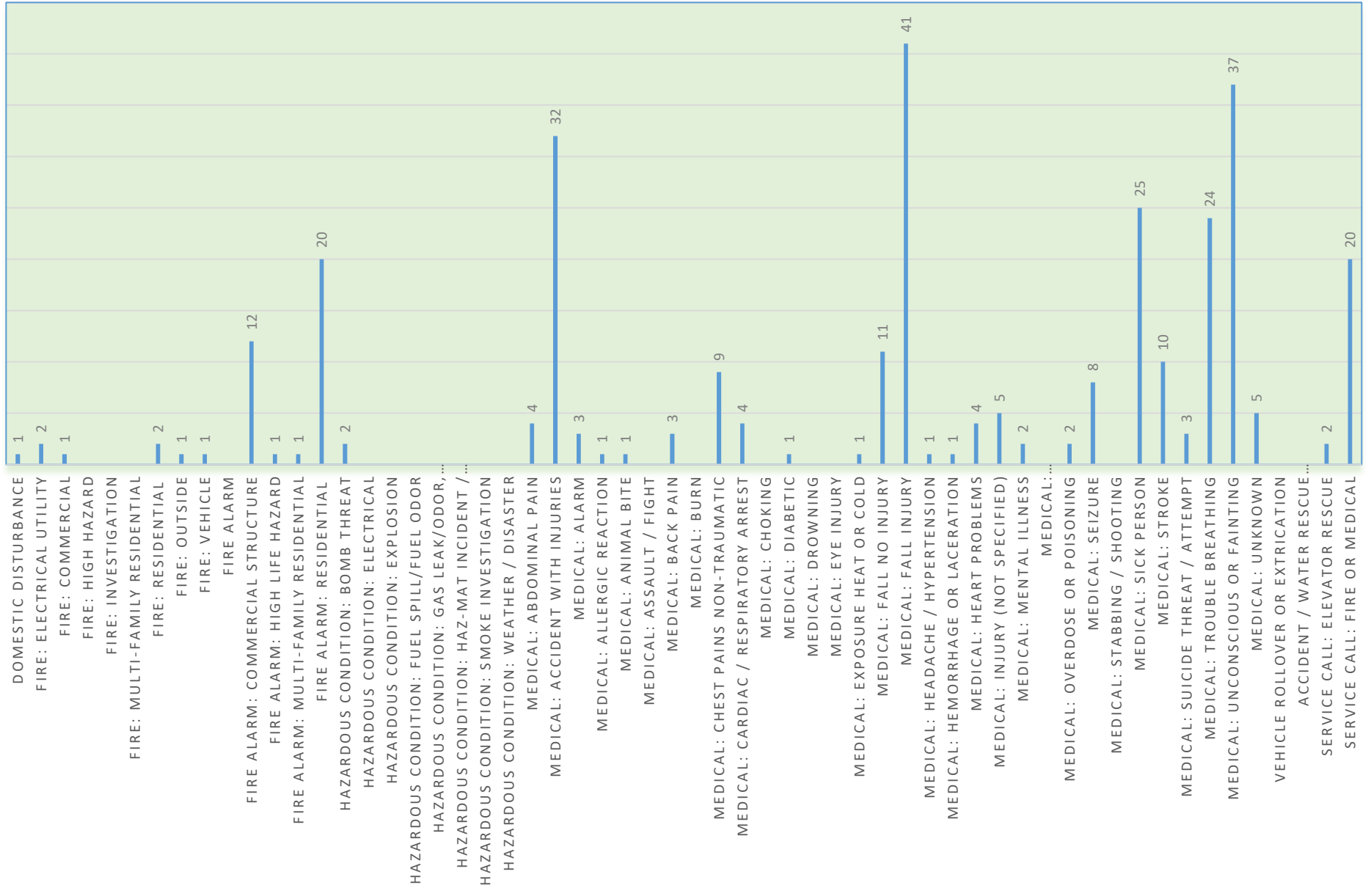

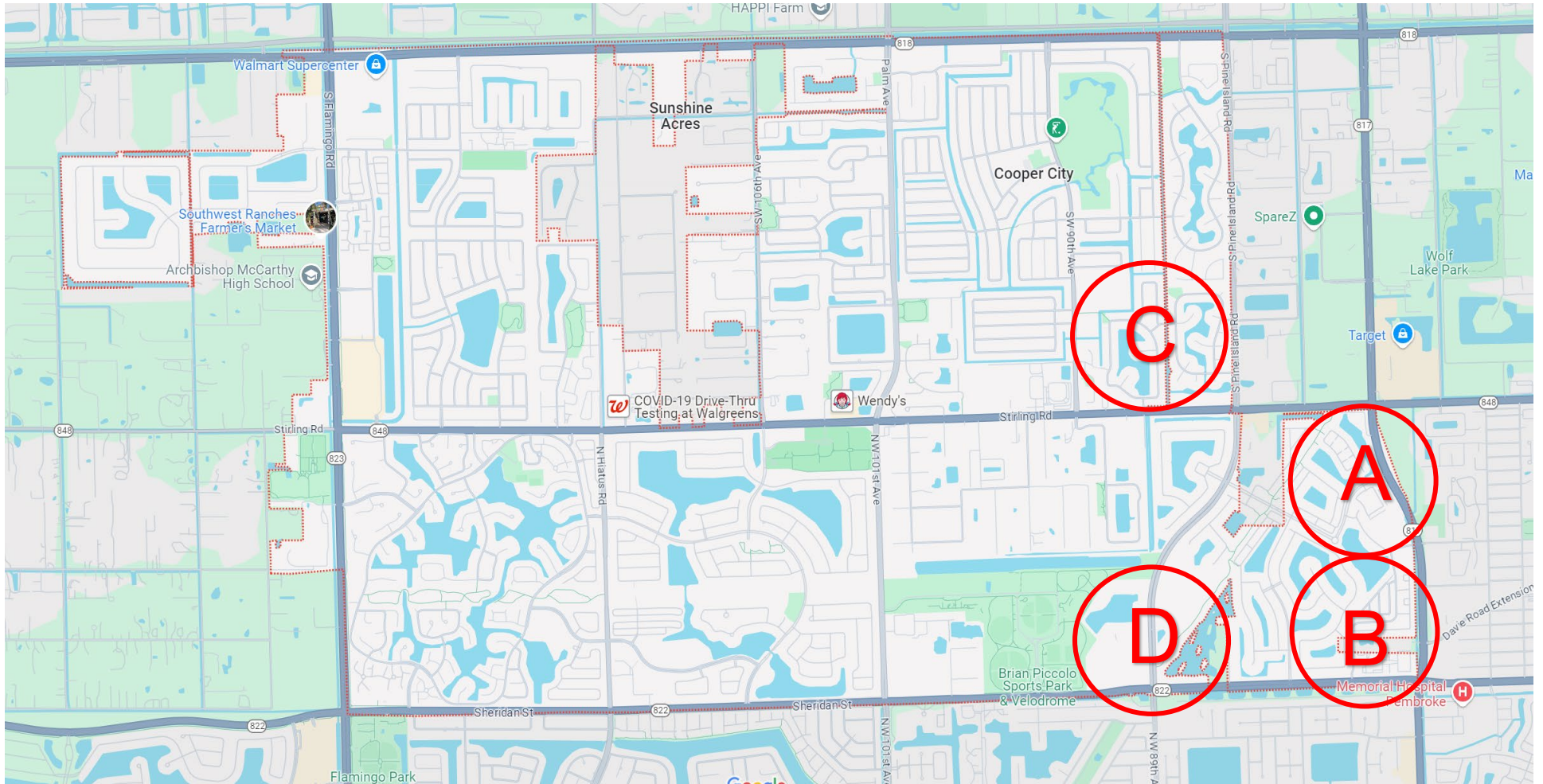
