MOTION: Commissioner Meltzer moved to approve the consent agenda. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (4-0).

REGULAR AGENDA

Motion to approve Engineering Task Order for replacement of Water Treatment Plant Membranes – Utilities

Utilities Director Mike Bailey spoke on the item.

MOTION: Commissioner Meltzer moved to approve Engineering Task Order for replacement of Water Treatment Plant Membranes. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (4-0).

Motion to approve revisions to the City's pay plan - Administrative Services

Commissioner Pulcini advised this is a needed change.

Commissioner Meltzer advised this is a house keeping item that needed to be addressed.

MOTION: Commissioner Pulcini moved to approve revisions to the City's pay plan. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (4-0).

Discussion on an Elected Officials and City Manager's retreat-Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder advised Commissioner Green had previously mentioned a goal-setting meeting and wanted to hear the specifics.

Mayor Ross advised previously they had a facilitator come in and discuss goals.

Commissioner Meltzer how this is handled.

City Attorney Horowitz advised a visioning session is a public meeting and substance is within the purview of the Commission and City Manager.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to defer the item to when Commissioner Green is on the dais.

Motion to approve Human Resources/Risk Management position and pay scale – Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder advised the HR department was budgeted and now wants to continue the process.

City Manager Napoli advised he believes the job description is acceptable. He also advised the pay scale is consistent with a director.

City Attorney Horowitz confirmed into the record the job description is included in the motion.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Human Resources/Risk Management position and pay scale and description. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (4-0).

Motion to approve City Clerk position and pay scale – Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder advised the separation of the HR department requires a change to this position. Commissioner Shrouder asked about department numbers and backup on Clerk salaries from other cities in Broward County.

City Manager Napoli advised his recommendation is for a Director position.

Commissioner Shrouder had concerns with the position in the same pay scale as other Directors who supervise many employees compared to the Clerk position who supervises 3.5.

Discussion ensued on pay plan ranges.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about the title of administrative services.

City Manager Napoli advised administrative services addresses Passports and Special Magistrate.

Commissioner Shrouder believes the department should be title the City Clerk's Office with the removal of the Administrative Services title.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the City Clerk position in the 23 range of the pay scale. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (4-0).

Discussion on legacy pensions – Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder would like to know who serves on plans, terms and contribution rates. He also spoke on pension details that need to be looked into. He would like to have an actuary look at the legacy pensions.

Commissioner Meltzer asked how much longer is GEPP will be around.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to look at changing the multiplier to match FRS, what is the result of increasing the employer contribution rate and develop regulations about entering drop.

Mayor Ross asked for agenda and minutes for the plans.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to know who the appointees to the boards are.

Consensus was reached to look at changing the multiplier to match FRS, what is the result of increasing the employer contribution rate and develop regulations about entering drop.

City Attorney Horowitz advised an actuary would need to look into the Commissions questions.

REGULAR RESOLUTIONS

Resolution 21-43 (Recreation)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 12-7-5, ADOPTED ON JULY 30, 2012; ELIMINATING THE \$36,000 CAP ON NON-RESIDENT FEES PAID TO THE CITY BY THE COOPER CITY OPTIMIST CLUB TO BE USED FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE CITY'S SPORTS FACILITIES; ESTABLISHING A \$50.00 PER PARTICIPANT PER SPORT REGISTRATION FEE AND A \$15.00 FIELD USAGE FEE PER PARTICIPANT PER SPORT FOR NON-CITY RESIDENTS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder advised a waiver of covenant be available to the Optimist.

Commissioner Pulcini would like to add a phased approach to non-resident fees.

Commissioner spoke on the Optimist outreach campaign for Cooper City children.

Sam Saad suggested a phased approach.

Commissioner Meltzer spoke on replacing the artificial turf and saving money now.

Commissioner Pulcini spoke on needing the funds to maintain the parks.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on the 70% being by sport.

Commissioner Meltzer stated there are more non-residents participating.

Mayor Ross spoke on a \$50 per participants per sport registration and a \$15 field usage. Mayor Ross asked what numbers will be phased.

City Manager Napoli spoke on a 3 year at \$40, \$50 and \$65 phase approached.

Mayor Ross spoke on his concern with the language with "may" and "shall", "goal" and "minimum".

Recreation Director Weiss spoke on resident vs. non-resident numbers per sport.

Mayor Ross spoke on non-enforcement of the 70/30 rule.

City Manager Napoli spoke on possibly workshopping the item.

Commissioner Shrouder asked Ms. Weiss's recommendation.

Ms. Weiss advised she understands COVID is still relevant and understands the City's responsibility with the fields.

City Manager Napoli spoke on a phased approach starting with \$40 in total.

Mayor Ross asked who determined the \$65 initially.

City Manager Napoli advised that was in the contract not brought forward.

Ms. Weiss advised that currently the City receives \$15 from non-residents.

Commissioner Meltzer advised this change is needed as it has not been addressed in years. He supports starting with a \$50 fee and raising to \$65 eventually.

MOTION: Commissioner Pulcini moved to approve Resolution 21-43 starting January 1, 2022 implementing a \$50 non-resident fee and starting January 1, 2023 a \$65 non-resident fee. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote (4-0).

Resolution 21-46 (Administration)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, THE BROWARD SHERIFF'S OFFICE, AND RENAISSANCE CHARTER SCHOOL, INC., FOR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER SERVICES, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A" AND INCORPORATED HEREIN; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE ANY AND ALL ACTION NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title. (Administration)

Mayor Ross does not believe the City should be involved in the agreement.

MOTION: Commissioner Pulcini moved to approve Resolution 21-46. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote.

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR LOCAL IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MANDATORY YEAR-ROUND LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION CONSERVATION MEASURES RULE OF THE SOUTH FLORIDA WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT (40E-24, F.A.C.); AMENDING CHAPTER 25 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING ARTICLE III, ENTITLED "LANDSCAPING"; CREATING SECTION 25-52, TO BE ENTITLED "YEAR-ROUND LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION CONSERVATION MEASURES;" PROVIDING DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE APPLICABILITY OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING THE LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION SCHEDULE; PROVIDING EXCEPTIONS TO THE LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION SCHEDULE; PROVIDING FOR A REQUIREMENT TO OPERATE TECHNOLOGY THAT INHIBITS OR INTERRUPTS AN IRRIGATION SYSTEM DURING PERIODS OF SUFFICIENT MOISTURE; PROVIDING FOR VARIANCES FROM THE SPECIFIC DAY OF THE WEEK LIMITATIONS; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Meltzer moved to approve Ordinance 21-22. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote (4-0).

CITY MANAGER REPORT

Fire Truck Leasing Options

City Manager Napoli advised we received our first batch of ARPA funds. He also advised we have a quote for a fire apparatus that expire in October. He is looking for direction from the Commission.

Mayor Ross spoke on used vehicles as BSO as shown its acceptance of using older equipment. Mayor Ross would like to look into alternatives to buying and leasing.

Commissioner Meltzer advised it may be premature as we may receive vehicles back.

Commissioner Pulcini would like to look into purchasing vehicles in the future.

Commissioner Shrouder advised we need to look into the type of equipment we need.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

No City Attorneys report.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

Mayor Ross read a letter that was sent to Colonel Holmes of the Broward Sheriff's Office commending Captain De Giovanni for his professionalism.

Captain De Giovanni advised school traffic congestion is a concern and his staff is working diligently to enforce traffic laws and concerns with 192 citations issued. He also spoke on the beautification initiative and the goal of compliance. The Commercial Plaza initiative is ongoing with the Timberlake Plaza being placed on the November 2, 2021 Special Magistrate Hearing. He advised his team will we present at the Pentecostals of Cooper City Church for Heroes Day. The Explorer Program and the COP program is open and looking for recruits. He also advised a code enforcement officer vacancy will be forthcoming as an officer will be retiring.

Commissioner Pulcini thanked Captain De Giovanni for all his work.

Commissioner Meltzer thanked Captain De Giovanni and his staff for all his work with the residents.

Commissioner Shrouder thanked Captain De Giovanni and spoke on Rock Creek concerns regarding traffic from Franklin. Captain De Giovanni advised he spoke with Rock Creek regarding his concerns.

Mayor Ross spoke on the beautification initiative and thanked Captain and his staff.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

Chief Bishop advised Lieutenant John Monty retired. The hydrant maintenance program is ongoing as well as fire inspections with 100% compliance by years' end. October is Fire Prevention Month and life safety educators are at the schools educating on fire prevention. Call volume is up 8.5% from the same time frame last year. The platform is currently out of service due to mechanical issues. He also advised we have to start looking at replacing fire apparatuses. He spoke on types of apparatuses and needs. Mayor Ross asked about the apparatuses and replacements we have currently. Chief Bishop spoke on apparatuses the City had.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the repair lines will decrease if we buy new equipment. He also spoke on having one Quint vehicle for backup for numerous cities.

Commissioner Pulcini asked Chief Bishop to thank his staff.

Commissioner Meltzer thanked Chief Bishop and his staff.

Commissioner Pulcini thanked the residents.
