Quint 28 Update: The vehicle is still in the early - mid stage of production at Pierce in Appleton Wisconsin. It is still on schedule for delivery in late November/December 2025. A web link to view the apparatus progress will be provided once the cab is started.

NEW Rescue 28 Update: Per a recent update from REV, the vehicle is at their Oakland Park shop for the final work to complete the build. They still must install the stretcher and they are waiting on emergency lights from Whalen. REV also must install and program the SIS (Shift Interrupt Switch) anti-theft device. We hope to schedule a date for a final inspection by mid-July 2025.








