**New Quint 28 Update:** The vehicle is currently at BSO Fire Fleet to equip with fire hose, hand tools and equipment purchased to place the vehicle in service. Training for the new Quint was completed by the vendor on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Quint is currently going through the process of outfitting and equipment mounting to be placed in service soon.

**NEW Rescue 28 Update:** The rescue vehicle was picked up on May 7<sup>th</sup> from Fire Fleet (6700 Powerline Road, Ft. Lauderdale) by the manufacturer to make corrections to meet the contract specifications. We were advised that the Rescue will be returned the week of June 8<sup>th</sup> at which point it will be evaluated and if accepted, the process of outfitting the vehicle for service will begin.

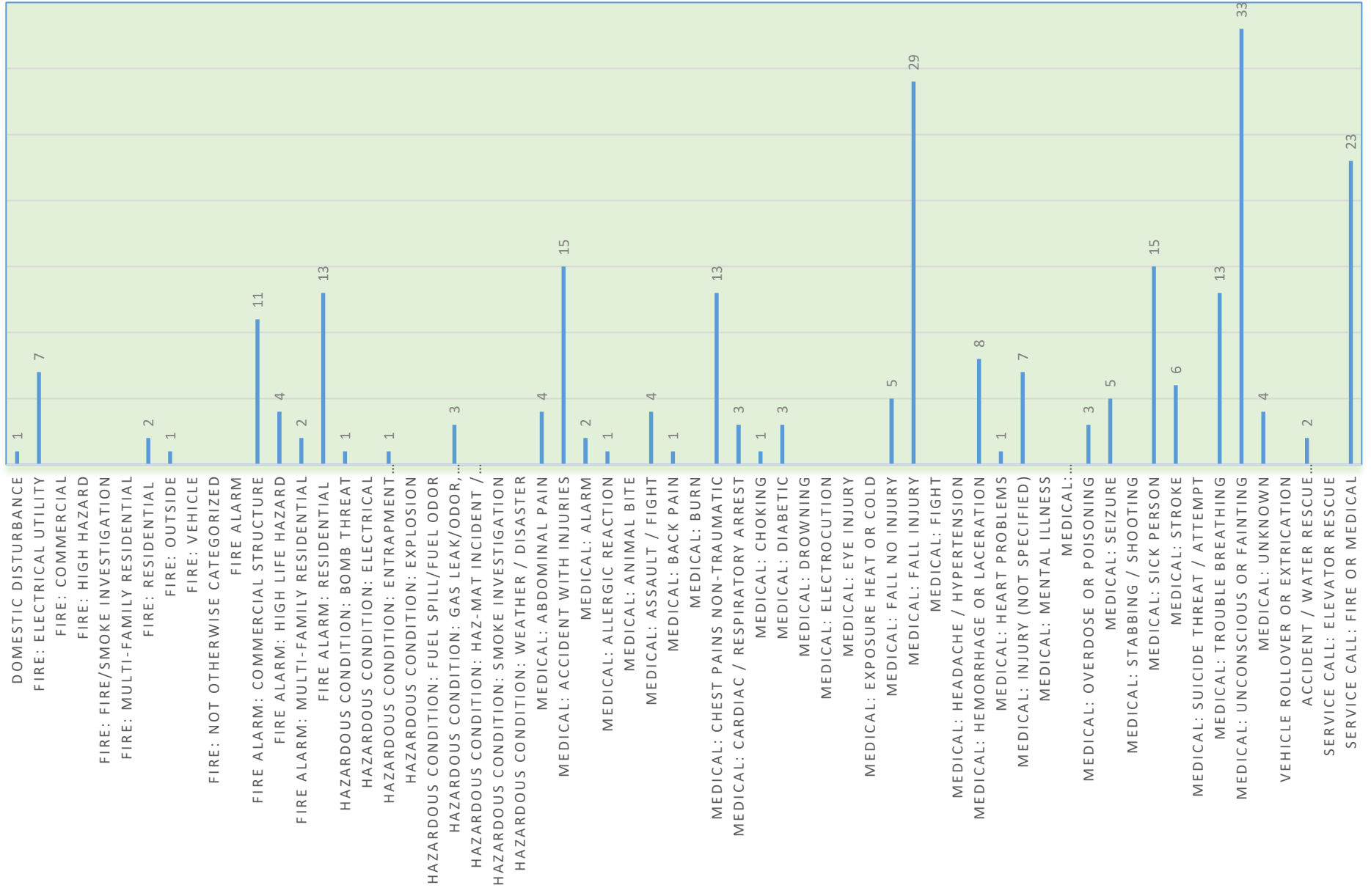

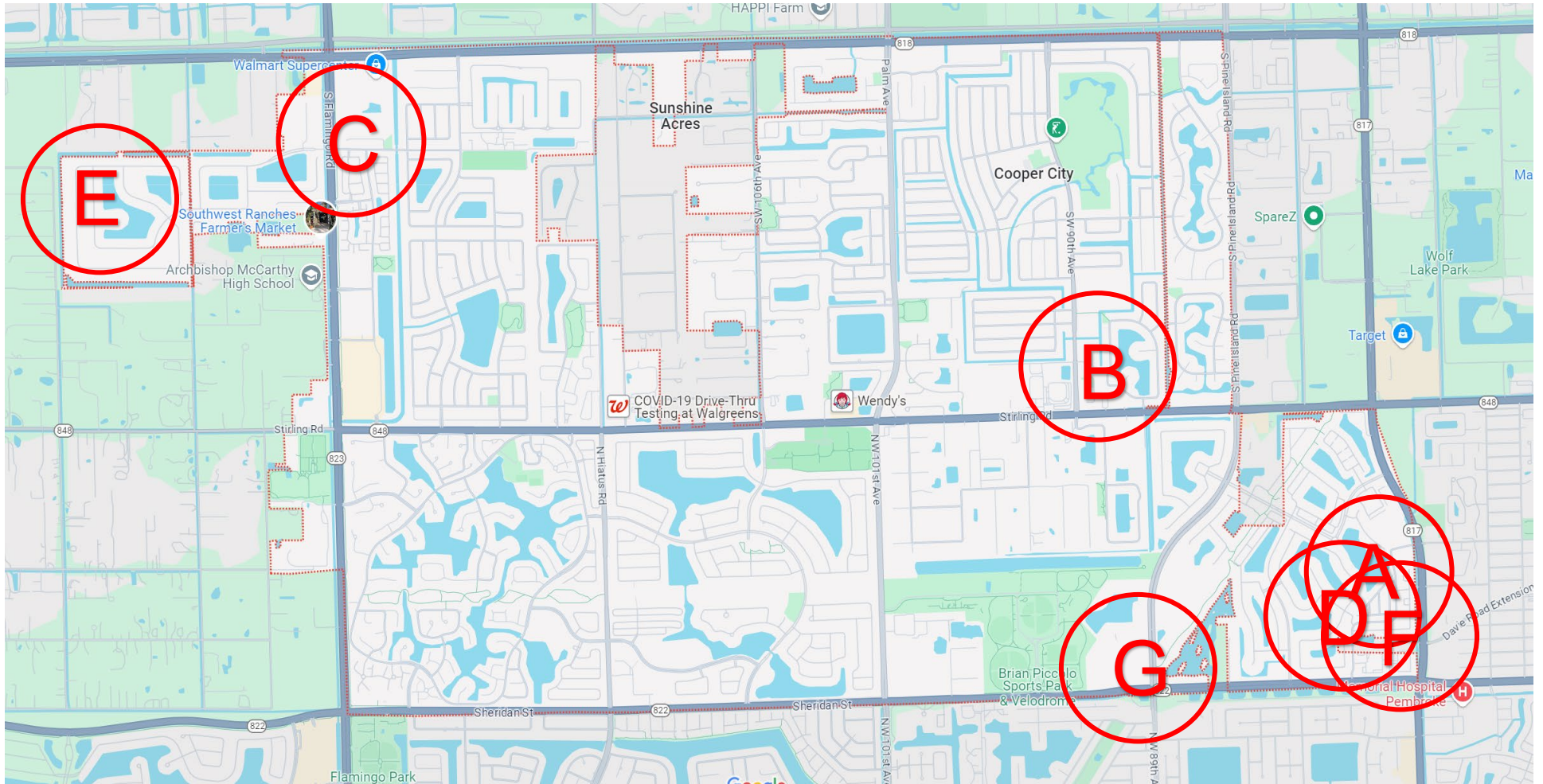
