PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Curran opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC SPEAKING

Open Public Meeting/Agenda Concerns –

Cooper City resident Martin expressed concerns about a property on 89th Avenue that is in violation of City regulations and requires attention.

Commissioner Shrouder asked City Attorney Horowitz if Martin could attest to the violation. City Attorney Horowitz responded, yes, during any hearing before the magistrate, testimony and evidence would be entered into the record.

City Manager Rey said he discussed the situation with Code Enforcement Sergeant Richard Mosca to address the concerns.

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, GRANTING SITE PLAN APPROVAL PURSUANT TO SITE PLAN AMENDMENT PETITION SPA# 9-1-25, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A," FOR THE APPROXIMATELY 1.08 ACRES OF REAL PROPERTY KNOWN AS McDONALD'S AT COOPER CITY COMMONS, GENERALLY LOCATED AT 2550 PINE ISLAND

ROAD IN COOPER CITY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE” by title.

City Attorney Horowitz swore in everyone who wished to give testimony.

Community Development Director Jason Chockley spoke on the petitions. The existing Cooper City Commons shopping center sits on 31.95 acres at the intersection of Sheridan Street and Pine Island Road. It currently features a one-story retail complex with Publix as the main tenant and various other commercial uses. The vacant 3,130-square-foot Wendy's restaurant with a single drive-thru will be redeveloped to make way for a new proposed McDonald's restaurant. Due to the proposed new drive-through, a variance is requested to reduce the number of parking spaces from 68 to 53. The applicant justifies the variance request on several grounds, the primary being that the current property lines and building location already exist, and that it is cost-prohibitive for McDonald's to demolish the existing building and start from scratch. The owner plans a site plan amendment with additions to create a 3,359-square-foot fast food restaurant featuring dual drive-thru lanes. The new site plan will be developed within the Cooper City Commons master site plan and remains compliant with the previous approval conditions and the B-3 zoning district's code requirements. Access to the proposed McDonald's parcel will remain the same as it is today, utilizing the two main shopping center access drive aisles, as originally planned in the master site plan. In addition to the proposed changes to the drive-through, the building will feature new signage, designated mobile order pickup spaces, and repainting. The proposed elevations will still share architectural elements with the primary shopping center building. Regarding the wall signs, the south elevation will have the words "McDonald's" in white, 24 inches tall and 196 inches long. The east elevation will be McDonald's Arches, logo in yellow, 42 1/8 tall, 48 1/8 long. The sign waiver is for a 6-inch side waiver; a proposed east side with the arch requested at 42 1/8, which is a 24 1/8 waiver request. A logo deviation is being requested, along with a 5-inch waiver for the word "McDonald's". The applicants justify the waivers by stating physical site distinctions. An existing building that has a significant setback from Pine Island Road, with mature landscaping and a tall berm. Staff recommends approval, subject to a tie-in to the City's Real Time Crime Center. The Planning and Zoning Board passed the petitions unanimously.

Craig McDonald, on behalf of McDonald's USA LLC, was present.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to ensure that all aspects are included so the applicant can tie into the Real-Time Crime Center. He also asked if the site is currently restricted to certain hours. Director Chockley stated that any B-2 districts can propose the hours. Commissioner Shrouder prefers not to restrict hours if possible.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she understands the plaza is not near a residential area, but she wants to ensure that any late-night hours do not affect residents.

Commissioner Shrouder said the area would be more appealing without time restrictions. The closest 24-hour McDonald's is on Pines Boulevard.

Commissioner Katzman inquired whether other fast-food establishments are subject to hourly restrictions. Director Chockley explained that in specific zoning districts, applicants are required to propose the operating hours.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to ensure that the removal of the time restriction applies only to this McDonald's. She also understands that the reduction in parking spaces is due to a lack of available seating. She wants to ensure the reduced parking is operator-specific.

Commissioner Smith asked whether the Wendys had time restrictions. Director Chockley advised that it was several years ago and that he was unsure.

Mayor Curran opened the public hearing on all resolutions, with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Curran closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 26-13, subject to all requirements for the Real Time Crime Center connection and 24 hours of operation specific to this operator, as McDonald's. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion, which prevailed by a unanimous roll-call vote. (5-0)

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 26-14 with the parking decrease being operator-specific to McDonald's. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion, which prevailed by a unanimous roll-call vote. (5-0)

Commissioner Katzman inquired whether the Commission could now reconsider Resolution 26-11. City Attorney Horowitz stated that the Resolution was included in the backup materials.

City Attorney Horowitz read “ A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 05-5-1, AS AMENDED, BY FURTHER AMENDING THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES AND POLICIES FOR THE CONDUCT OF CITY COMMISSION BUSINESS; ELIMINATING PUBLIC COMMENT FROM THE END OF THE COMMISSION MEETING AGENDA; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE” by title.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Resolution 26-11. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion, which failed by the following roll call vote. (4-1)

10. Discussion and possible action regarding the establishment of a low-interest loan program to assist homeowners with the replacement of cast iron pipes, outdated plastic piping, and electrical panels, utilizing interest earnings to fund the loan program. - Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Shrouder inquired whether these repairs might be eligible for the Community Development Grant. Director Chockley will consult with Broward County regarding this matter.

Commissioner Mallozzi inquired about a waiting period and noted that the eligibility criteria are highly stringent.

Commissioner Shrouder expressed empathy for individuals bearing repair costs; however, he emphasized that the Community Development Grant program is designed to assist residents with low incomes. Furthermore, he noted that the City lacks the qualifications to issue loans.

Commissioner Mallozzi stated that the City of Hollywood was awarded a grant for these projects. She would like to explore available options.

Commissioner Shrouder stated that the City lacks the qualifications to issue loans.

Commissioner Katzman stated that although Commissioner Mallozzi's intentions are well-meaning, overseeing the administration of loans will pose a significant administrative challenge for the City.

Commissioner Smith inquired whether Commissioner Mallozzi had previously proposed this concept. Commissioner Mallozzi responded that she had attempted to do so; however, the necessary funds were not available. Commissioner Smith further asked whether the idea was legally permissible. City Attorney Horowitz clarified that a provision in the Florida Constitution forbids municipalities and government entities from pledging their taxing authority.

Commissioner Shrouder is okay with the City's Grant Administrator contacting the City of Hollywood to inquire about the grant process.

A consensus was reached for the City's Grant Administrator to contact the City of Hollywood to inquire about the grant process.

REGULAR RESOLUTIONS

11. Resolution 26-16 (Administration)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, APPOINTING MICHELLE GONZALEZ TO SERVE AS THE CITY'S INNOVATIONS AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT DIRECTOR, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SEC. 4.01(4)(C) OF THE CITY CHARTER; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

City Manager Rey stated that this position was recently approved and will address various deficiencies within the City, including optimizing the capacity of multiple systems. A work order management system will be introduced to provide strategic guidance to the Communications Group.

Commissioner Smith said the Commission has agreed that strategic innovations must be implemented. He supports the item.

Commissioner Katzman stated that his decision is unrelated to the applicant. The proposed salary with benefits is close to a quarter of a million dollars a year, and he does not believe the position warrants that amount.

MOTION: Commissioner Smith moved to approve Resolution 26-16. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion, which prevailed by the following roll-call vote. (3-2)

12. Resolution 26-17 (Administration)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE CITY OF COOPER CITY PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A"; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Jack Kardys of Miller Legg stated that they have been engaged in the planning process for the past year. The level of service in the City is absolutely outstanding, with 8.3 acres per 1,000 residents. The City's comprehensive plan calls for 6 acres, which we are well beyond. Walkability is measured at 10 minutes, which is the national standard. The City meets all state benchmarks and exceeds them for recreation facilities and the number of ball fields. Meeting the standards of the NRPA, except a community garden and an amphitheater. 963 surveys, two community meetings, and a dozen stakeholder meetings were conducted, and all 12 items listed as important were concerning maintaining and improving existing parks. Additional shaded outdoor areas, developing interconnected open space systems, the parks and greenways and trails, and expanding pickleball courts. Providing additional multi-purpose fields and courts, updating and improving playgrounds, improving comfort and amenities, providing and improving autism- and ADA-friendly features, improving park maintenance, and developing a new aquatic feature: a splash pad and a spray ground. Advertising and marketing parks more efficiently utilizing email and social media. Security improvements, including lighting and security cameras throughout. The Parks and Recreation Department is aligned, and the recent playground upgrades are outstanding and ADA-compliant.

Lumi Fuentes spoke about the masterplan's vision. Enhancing facilities and amenities is necessary before any additions are made. Connections within the parks and trails. Parking near pedestrian mobility is a goal, and the expansion of outdoor and indoor recreation facilities is expected as the population grows. Also, renewing and updating management and operating systems are goals. Some changes have been made to the master plans, including short- and long-term goals. Lighting upgrades for Bill Lips are listed in 2026 and 2027, with long-term goals for storage and a concession stand. Cooper's Point Park was moved to midterm, and Diamond Head Park was re-examined, keeping the racquetball courts rather than switching them to pickleball. The Forest Lake Park playground was moved up to a higher short-term priority. Memorial Park will remain the same, with upgrades to infrastructure, and City Mike Park includes trail improvements and infrastructure updates for event space. Stirling Palm Park was moved to the long-term, and Suellen H. Fardelmann Sports Complex was considered for the addition of pickleball courts. Tamarind Park includes tennis court upgrades, keeping the racquet courts, and Ted Ferone Park has racquet courts converted to pickleball courts and fitness area upgrades. Pioneer Middle

School is included in the long-term plan to explore a partnership with the schools. The short-term plan, which is 1 to 3 years, aligns with the City's current capital improvement plan. Supplemental plans for new development are included and being implemented to meet ADA accessibility requirements. The majority of the costs will come from improving the City's current facilities and parks. The short-term enhancement costs are \$9,297,000, mid-term \$9,265,800, and long-term \$ 7,416,000. Ms. Fuentes applauded the City's most recent playgrounds for their inclusiveness. Connectivity was also a goal from the surveys, including trails and walking paths. Multifunctional indoor spaces were identified as a need in the survey and are a long-term goal. Enhancing park maintenance plans and promoting events and services were also key. The total for all goals is \$12,567.00 short-term, \$13,035,800 mid-term, and \$40,996,000 long-term. Funding strategies can be developed using CIP, user fees, and grants. Having a master plan in place helps in obtaining parks and recreation grants.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about page 68 and the listed needs. He also stated that several of the listed items address the City's website and programming, and that the ICE department can handle advertising updates. Commissioner Shrouder would like to hold a workshop to develop priorities.

Commissioner Mallozzi emphasizes that all projects eligible for grant funding should be considered a priority.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to list priorities before a plan is adopted.

City Manager Rey said the discussions can be included in upcoming budget talks.

Commissioner Katzman raised concerns about the shift in priorities, particularly the bathroom renovations at Bill Lips Park, which are in dire need of updates. Flamingo West, Suellen H. Fardelmann, and Bill Lips were reprioritized to long-term status, and they are the City's most-used parks. He would like to reverse the changes in priorities.

City Manager Rey indicated that a workshop could be scheduled to address the identified needs. Commissioner Katzman expressed concern about voting on the plan, stating that he does not support the proposed changes.

Commissioner Shrouder does not want to approve the plan. He wants to hold a workshop to discuss priorities and then develop a plan based on those discussions. City Manager Rey said modifications can always be made to the plan, but a plan is needed to secure grant funding.

Commissioner Shrouder is okay with approving the plan, given that the budget schedules will be modified each year.

Mayor Curran said the plan needs to be reviewed each year during budget season, and that the grant items should be pushed to the forefront.

Commissioner Smith stated that a plan needs to be developed to begin grant opportunities. He asked if the goals were based on engagement with City staff. City Manager Rey answered yes. Commissioner Smith agrees that a workshop will help develop the priorities.

Commissioner Mallozzi agrees with Commissioner Katzman. She also has concerns about court conversions at Pioneer Middle School because the school is near homes, and noise would be a concern. She also does not want to convert any racquetball courts at Ted Ferone Park. She also asked about the additional space for the courts at Suellen H. Fardelmann. Ms. Funetes said there is room for reconfiguration. Commissioner Mallozzi does not want any parking removed.

Commissioner Katzman stated that the initial priorities were formulated based on surveys and engagements with residents and advisory boards. He inquired about the reasons for the subsequent modifications. Ms. Fuentes explained that the changes were influenced by the current Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), which resulted in a shift of priorities. Commissioner Katzman expressed his concern that the Commission had not been consulted regarding these alterations and indicated that he was not comfortable with the revised priorities.

City Manager Rey said the CIP determines the available funds.

Commissioner Katzman does not endorse the proposed modifications.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked whether the changes were based on costs. City Manager Rey answered yes.

Recreation Director Josh Rhodes said costs are a major factor.

Commissioner Shrouder asked how projects at Encore Park were advanced to the short-term plan.

Commissioner Smith said the implementation of the short-term plans is 1-3 years; that leaves time for adjustments.

Commissioner Katzman expressed concerns that approval of the current plan may lead to implementation, thereby precluding the Commission from amending the priorities.

Commissioner Shrouder prefers to table Resolution 26-17 and workshop the item.

Commissioner Shrouder wants the Commission to agree on costs and specific priorities.

MOTION: Commissioner Smith moved to defer Resolution 26-17. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion, which prevailed by unanimous roll-call vote. (5-0)

CITY MANAGER REPORT

13. Regional Biosolids Presentation

City Manager Rey explained that a county project regarding Regional Biosolids has been proposed to all Broward County municipalities. Utilities Director Akin Ozaydin provided a presentation. Director Ozaydin explained that biosolids are the cleaned and treated solids produced by the wastewater treatment process. Biosolids are dewatered to about 20% solids using a centrifuge, then hauled off-site by private contractors for landfill disposal. In 2021, House Bill 1309 was signed into law, requiring advanced treatment and enhanced testing for PFAS. In 2023, all Broward municipalities agreed to complete a conceptual study. The study, completed in 2024, stated that a Biosolids Facility needs to be constructed. The proposed facility location is 3100 North Powerline Road. The total cost to design the

facility is \$50 million, with Cooper City's contribution not exceeding \$460,000. The yearly cost to our biosolids hauler for 2025 was \$249,000, up from \$122,000 in 2024. Staff explored four options, first contacting neighboring counties. Palm Beach County and Miami-Dade will not accept biosolids from other counties. The City can either join the biosolids facility or continue with the current disposal method. Director Ozaydin recommends joining the Broward County interlocal agreement, as we have received a 33% increase request from the hauler we currently use.

Commissioner Smith expressed appreciation to the staff for their presentation. Furthermore, Commissioner Smith inquired about the implications should no municipalities participate in the agreement.

Commissioner Shrouder has reservations about joining the Broward County Commission in the ILA.

City Manager Rey stated that the costs are not guaranteed.

Commissioner Shrouder asked why Broward County is not addressing this regional issue.

Commissioner Smith asked what the main concerns are about staying with our current vendor and practice. Chief Water Plant Operator Ryan Webster said there is uncertainty about costs. Chief Wastewater Operator Manny Cuevas also spoke about PFAS regulations.

City Attorney Horowitz said the Commission joined PFAS litigation in South Carolina years ago and that the City expects to recover funds sometime this year.

Commissioner Smith asked City Manager Rey for an opinion. City Manager Rey wanted to inform the Commission so it could address any questions or concerns before a final determination is needed.

Commissioner Smith inquired on a timeline for a response. City Manager Rey stated 45 days.

Commissioner Smith thanked Utilities staff for attending the meeting and for their efforts.

A consensus was reached to obtain more information on the ILA.

City Manager Rey stated that he received a letter from the Town Manager of SW Ranches, who was directed by the Town Commission to inquire with the Commission about waiving the 25% surcharge for outside water hookups.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Horowitz stated that legal counsel for Renaissance Charter requested a 30-day postponement of the March 4th Special Magistrate Hearing due to family bereavement.

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Smith expressed gratitude to the staff and the Broward Sheriff's Office for their diligent efforts.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked for an update on the status of the Do Not Block stickers. Utilities Director Ozaydin said he is in contact with the vendor and that two areas have been addressed. She asked to be updated with a timeline for the corrections. She thanked Communications Director Michael Cobelo for his assistance with the Pickleball Fundraiser and all staff who participated in the staff tournament. Over \$200,000 was raised at the Saturday Pickleball Fundraiser for Relay for Life. On March 6th, a Bunko Night Fundraiser will be held to benefit Relay for Life. Donations for prizes are also welcome.

Commissioner Katzman credited Commissioner Mallozzi and all staff for their efforts on the fundraising events. He also congratulated the Executive Assistant to the Elected Officials, Sabrina Valmir, on her marriage. He had the opportunity to speak at Embassy Creek's Career Day on Friday and to participate in an event to vote on a splash pad or a playground. He asked City Manager Rey for an update from Broward County on the median on Pine Island Road. City Attorney Horowitz said he spoke with the County Attorney's Office following our prior meeting, and they mentioned an agreement the City and the County entered into in 2007 regarding the installation and maintenance of the median that he was previously unaware of. The County seeks to amend both the agreement and the tri-party agreement.

Commissioner Katzman stated that this matter remains unresolved. He requested that the City contact our County Commissioner, as previously asked.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on his concerns with the Broward County Commission.

Mayor Curran thanked Parks and Recreation Director Rhodes for the lighting upgrades at Bill Lips.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at 8:49 PM.

Cooper City Hall: Cooper City, we produce Class B biosolids. There are 3 types. One of them is Class AA biosolids. There's 3 of pathogens. That's used for lawns and gardens. Class A is low-level pathogens, used for fertilizers. Class B, which we have.

Cooper City Hall: There's some remaining pathogens, but we use it for agricultural land.

Cooper City Hall: Currently, we produce about 2,500, wet tons of biosolids per year.

Cooper City Hall: And 500 dry tons.

Cooper City Hall: projected about 2,700 wet tons. Our permitted capacity is about 4.27 million gallons per day for our wastewater, so it's not much, only about 10%.

Cooper City Hall: So, you can see this slide that there are 4,100 individual permitted domestic wastewater facilities.
