The following is the Fire Chief's report for the upcoming commission meeting. The report highlights information pertinent to the city's main public safety concerns: Fire Rescue Incidents, Fire Apparatus / Station concerns, Fire Prevention, Community Outreach, and CERT.

The longest emergent response was recorded as 16:31 however the initial and secondary locations provide were incorrect. There was a delay in diverting to multiple locations to find the patient. There was also a 14:10 response that was due to the patient presenting roadside needing immediate medical intervention, delaying the registered arrival time. The patient report shows the actual arrival time which corresponds to 7-minute response time. The only other delayed response time was 11:25 which was due to staging for Deputies to verify the scene was safe to approach.

## I. FIRE APPARATUS / STATION REPORT

Rescue 228 is still in for repairs, waiting on a gear for the onboard air compressor and the installation of a shore “umbilical” air connection to keep the unit’s air reservoir at capacity.

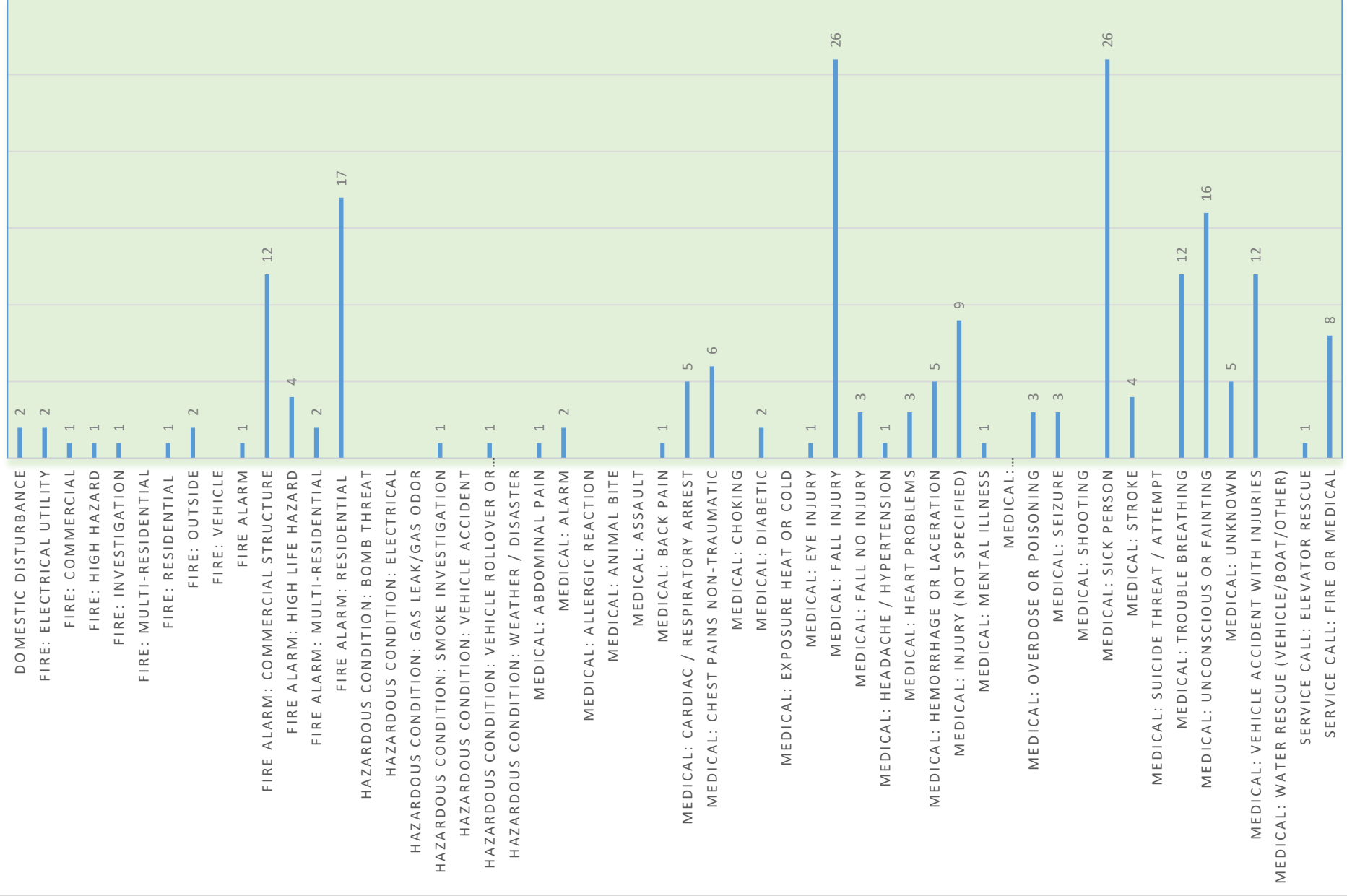
#### **IV. COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT**

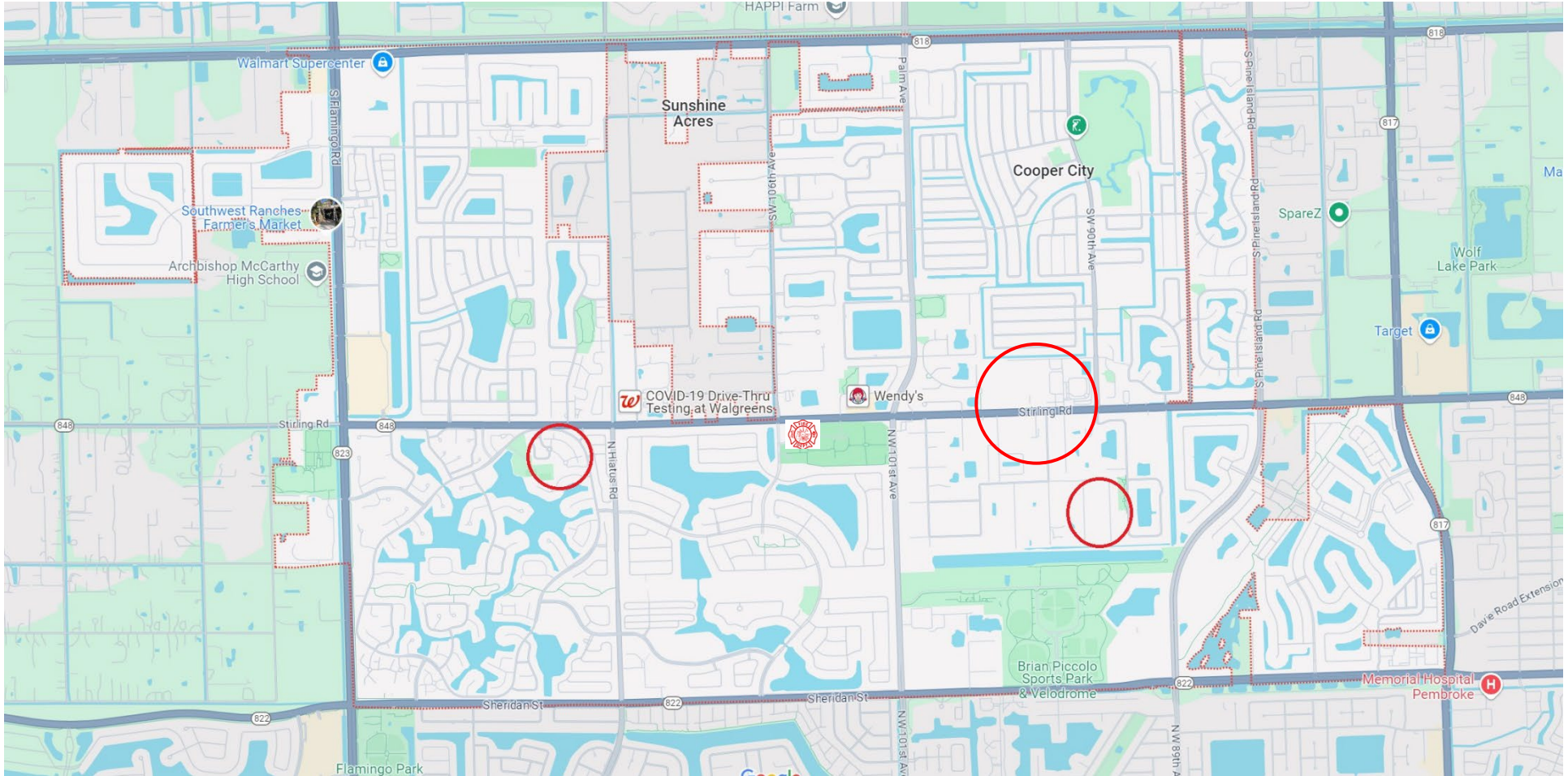
#### **FIRE HYDRANT DESIGN UPDATE:**
