PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Katzman, Shrouder, Green and Mayor Ross. Commissioner Mallozzi was present via Zoom.

<u>DECORUM</u> - Jacob Horowitz, City Attorney

City Attorney Horowitz read the decorum policy as follows: Members of the Commission, staff members, citizens, and others are required to use civil and appropriate language when addressing the Commission or anyone present at the meeting and must refrain from using profanity, cursing, or exhibiting aggressive or threatening behavior. All comments should generally be directed to the presiding officer and not to individual members of the Commission, staff, or the audience. No personal verbal attacks toward any individual by either the Commission, staff, citizens, or others shall be allowed during any meeting of the Commission. Any persons making impertinent or slanderous remarks or personal attacks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Commission or who otherwise violates the decorum rules set forth herein shall be barred from further audience before the Commission by the Mayor, or by request of any member of the Commission unless permission to continue or again address the Commission be granted by a majority vote of the Commission members present.

PUBLIC SPEAKING

Fernando Nunez, thanked the Commission for participating in the Race for Champions the Special Olympics of South Florida and presented the Mayor with a medal.

Dean Altman, 25-year resident said he does not see anyone using the pool at the Pool and Tennis Center at 6:00 AM. He does not believe the costs are worth the pool being open at 6:00 AM and wants data to be analyzed.

Commissioner Shrouder is okay with having a sign posted that there is not a lifeguard on duty to avoid costs.

Commissioner Katzman said he was a supporter of opening the pool early as he received input from residents that were using the Davie pool. He also supports posting a swim at your own risk sign.

City Manager Rey said he would like to look into options.

Commissioner Shrouder said there is less liability on the City without a lifeguard.

City Manager Rey will look into the matter and provide a report at the December 10th Commission meeting.

Commissioner Green said years ago they opened the pool earlier and it was also not utilized. He does not support having the pool open with no lifeguard on duty.

Angelica Palank-Sharlet, Fort Lauderdale resident and former Commissioner of Cooper City asked that her husband's insurance be reinstated.

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, GRANTING SITE PLAN APPROVAL PURSUANT TO SITE PLAN PETITION SP# 4-1-24, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A," FOR THE APPROXIMATELY 29.75 ACRES OF REAL PROPERTY KNOWN AS THE FPL SHERIDAN STREET SUBSTATION, GENERALLY LOCATED AT 830 PINE ISLAND ROAD IN COOPER CITY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Katzman said legally he can only make a decision based on the site plan itself and wants to assure all of the foliage and color schemes match the beautification plan the City approved and that the trees planted are mature trees to help block vision as much as possible.

Mayor Ross swore in Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley.

Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley advised those topics were brought up at the Planning and Zoning Meeting and the applicants did commit on the record to adhering to the City's beatification plan and planting mature trees. They also committed to use the same color of the Monterra wall to blend in.

Commissioner Green would like the project to use the same color schemes as the Monterra project.

Commissioner Shrouder said there are some street lights near the project that need repaired. There is a pole that has been down close to seven months.

Baldwin English was swore in and advised if they have a maintenance responsibility to fix the pole they will certainty do so.

Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley advised the applicant committed funds to the Tree Canopy Trust Fund totaling \$321,935 dollars. The project was approved by the Central Broward Water Control District.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve the consent agenda. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR AGENDA

12. Motion to approve the purchase of playground equipment for the Community Center Tot Lot Playground and Michael Riordan Park (formerly known as Flamingo Park). - Parks and Recreation

Commissioner Katzman wants to assure the playgrounds are creative and unique. He asked if the flooring will be mulch. City Manager Rey stated the bid currently is for mulch as there is not enough money in the budget. The project is contingent on a grant so an amendment will be put forth in December or January to add the flooring. Commissioner Katzman would like all parks to be autism friendly and have pour and play floors. He would like to give staff the opportunity to be more innovative.

City Manager Rey stated he will tour parks in surrounding municipalities for ideas.

Commissioner Green asked if they will have the opportunity to connect additional playground equipment. City Manager Rey answered before the pour and play is installed as this project is tied to a grant.

Commissioner Shrouder asked why we are behind on the timeline for this project. City Manager Rey said they have to use the expenditures by April 2025.

Commissioner Mallozzi said while she understands this is time sensitive as it tied to a grant she would like to gather input from parents that utilize the playgrounds on what is needed.

Mayor Ross thanked City Manager Rey for recognizing the need to move forward quickly to not lose grant funding. He also would like the parks to be handicap accessible as well as autism friendly.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve the purchase of playground equipment for the Community Center Tot Lot Playground and Michael Riordan Park (formerly known as Flamingo Park). Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR RESOLUTIONS

13. Resolution 24-42 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 05-5-1, AS AMENDED, BY FURTHER AMENDING THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES AND POLICIES FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE CITY COMMISSION BUSINESS; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF KEYS TO THE CITY BY A SUPERMAJORITY VOTE OF THE CITY COMMISSION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by tile. – **Commissioner Shrouder**

City Attorney Horowitz said items 13 and 14 go hand in hand. Resolution 24-42 embraces the action that the Commission took by motion at the last meeting. Item 14 amends the city code to eliminate all references to keys to the City from the code.

Commissioner Green supports the item and advised he returned the appreciation key he received.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 24-42. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

ORDINANCES ON FIRST READING

14. Ordinance 24-23 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION," ARTICLE I, ENTITLED "IN GENERAL," BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 2-8, ENTITLED "NAMING AND RECOGNITION PROCEDURES," ELIMINATING THE CITY CODE REGULATING KEYS TO THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by tile. – Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder does not agree with the idea that the keys given to Commissioner Green and Mayor Ross were appreciation keys as they were voted on.

Commissioner Green said the item on the previous agenda was passed by a 3-2 vote not a super majority vote. City Attorney Horowitz stated he believes it was the Commissions intent to have a super majority vote. Commissioner Green said there are many individuals that are worthy of receiving keys.

Commissioner Shrouder said the item on the previous agenda was a motion to present Mayor Ross and Commissioner Green with keys to the City which passed. He asked City Attorney Horowitz if that independent action is invalid. City Attorney Horowitz said the action is inconsistent with the language in the city code which speaks to the Commission, determining it would not be appropriate to issue or present any further keys to the City. Commissioner Shrouder said before the Farewell Ceremony someone stole the keys that were to be presented and the authorities were called. He is not sure why in the past other elected officials were not given keys. A vote was taken and the action was valid.

Commissioner Katzman believes it is time to broaden the keys to the City however, they should only be given to individuals who have given significantly to the City. He believes Commissioner Green and Mayor Ross are worthy of keys.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she conferred with City Attorney Horowitz and they believed the vote did not pass. She also advised when Commissioner Shrouder presented the keys at the Farwell Ceremony he did not refer to them as keys.

Commissioner Shrouder reread the motion from the October 22nd meeting which passed and did not require a super majority vote.

Mayor Ross thanked the Commission for the key to the City honor.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 24-23. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

CITY MANAGER REPORT

15. Pavement Condition Index Analysis

City Manager Rey advised through the American Public Works Association there is criteria to rate roads. There are three areas were the pavement conditions are below 60. There is an area in Rock Creek approaching Embassy Lakes. An area between City Hall and Stirling Road and a small pocket near 106th Avenue near Royal Palm Estates. Staff is looking to present two packages to the Commission one for the area near Rock Creek and City Hall and another addressing the area near 106th Avenue as there are some private roads in that area.

Commissioner Katzman asked the timeline for implementation. City Manager Rey said if it is approved in January it can be accomplished by March or April. Commissioner Katzman asked for an update on the speed tables. City Manager Rey said they are looking to piggyback on a contract with the City of Planation that will be before the Commission in December with implementation in February.

16. Summary and Status of Current Grant Obligations and Proposed Earmarks

The Grants Manager has been working to take control of all the funding the City has received and not spent. There is approximately \$9.4 million captured by the City but not spent. There is \$1,127,321 left in ARPA funds. Staff recommends adding \$325,641 to the SW 49th Street Culvert project. There is \$5,066,960 dedicated to the surtax project and \$959,757 for the gravity sewer line project. There is an additional \$2,274,000 dollars in grant money dedicated to several other projects.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the extension was granted for the quarter of million dollars we have not spent yet. City Manager answered no so they are trying to spend it immediately. Commissioner Shrouder asked who is responsible for the City possibly losing the money. City Manager Rey said structurally the entire administration was responsible. There was not enough attention being spent on these matters. Currently he is trying to focus on getting the projects complete and then he can look into responsibility.

City Manager Rey asked to move \$325,641 of ARPA funds to the SW 49th Street Culvert. The deadline to add new projects has passed so he can only reallocate funds. He advised in September they started moving forward on contract negotiations for the Stirling Road Roadway and Drainage project as the project was awarded in 2022. He spoke on FY2025-2026 priority options including additional funding for the gravity sewer rehabilitation project second phase and the needs at the water and sewer treatment plants.

City Manager Rey said City Attorney Horowitz and himself have been looking into changing the speed limit on Hiatus Road from 40 mph to 35 mph and if it needs County approval. The County stated there is an ILA from the nineties that states Cooper City has the determination on speed limits. There is also an ILA with the County stating the County will control the traffic control devices but not necessarily the speed limits. He would like to draft a request as the County said they will conduct the study to determine the need of the change.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Horowitz reminded the Commission that four hours of ethics training is needed before the year ends.

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Green asked for a status update on addressing the inequities from the pay study. City Manager Rey believes all issues will be corrected by December 1st. He will have a definite number of money given to address the inequities soon. Commissioner Green made a motion to reinstate Mr. Sharlet's coverage and remove the pause of benefits for Commissioner Mallozzi and Mayor-Elect James Curran. City Attorney Horowitz advised it would take an amendment to the ordinance to address the issues.

Commissioner Green removed his motion and thanked the City and his colleagues as it has been an honor serving Cooper City. He wished everyone well and continued good work in the City.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on registering for BSO's Vacation Home Watch Program online and also advised the Santa Letter Program is available with signups from November 25th through December 17th. He also thanked Utilities Director Welch for his time as he sees him leaving work at late hours and appreciates his dedication.

Commissioner Katzman advised November 19th is Robert Becker Day and thanked everyone who wore yellow in recognition of Mr. Becker. He thanked Commissioner Green and Mayor Ross and congratulated Mayor-elect James Curran and Commissioner-elect Smith. He also congratulated all the Cooper City Optimist basketball teams that won the championships including his son's team the Clippers who were undefeated. He thanked all the volunteers who give their time to the children.

Commissioner Mallozzi thanked staff for the Community Yard Sale. She wished everyone a great Thanksgiving. She thanked the outgoing elected officials for their service and reminded everyone there are services available to help everyone who may feel alone this holiday season.

Mayor Ross asked that Mayor-elect Curran handle the proclamations that were deferred tonight. He thanked the City as it has been an honor to serve the residents. He thanked all the churches and synagogues who have been involved in the City.
