PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Mallozzi, Katzman, Shrouder, Green and Mayor Ross.

CHANGES TO AGENDA/EMERGENCY MATTERS

City Manager Napoli advised of an emergency procurement due to a water leak on Stirling Road. He will provide the details before the next Commission meeting.

Agenda Concerns

Joanne Barber, 8740 SW 52 St, President of the Timberlake Lake Maintenance Association spoke on her concerns on complaints she receives from wildlife feeding and spoke on disease rising from wildlife today.

Kristen Whiting, 8721 SW 21 Court, spoke in favor the City prohibiting wildlife feeding due to wildlife causing illness to her family.

Gina Chandler, 5108 SW 87 Terr, spoke in support of the Ordinance as she lives near a neighbor who feeds wildlife causing health issues in the area of Timberlake.

Doug Campbell, 10206 SW 58 St, does not want to include feral cats in the prohibition of feeding wildlife.

Evan Spigelman, 8949 SW 49 Ct, spoke on the feeding of feral cats causing issues.

David Wahl, 5225 SW 93 Ave, does not believe we need an ordinance for a few issues.

Natalie Mor, 3558 NW 87 Ave, spoke on an accident at the intersection of Estada and the need for a traffic control device.

Motion to Approve

3. Motion to approve and authorize the reclassification of the position of Utilities Electrician to Utilities Electrician/Foreman from the existing Pay Grade of 16 to the proposed Pay Grade of 17, reflecting a higher level of job duties performed by the employee in the current position. – Utilities

Commissioner Shrouder pulled item 3.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve the consent agenda with the exemption of item 3. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Commissioner Green asked City Manager Napoli to explain the item. City Manager Napoli advised there is only one electrician in the Utilities Department and his duties far exceed his job description. This will ensure his duties are reflected in the job description and he will move to a pay grade 17. Commissioner Green asked the status of the pay study. City Manager Napoli answered they believe they will be able to present the study at the end of February.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked Utilities Director Raj Verma about the position change. Director Verma explained the individual is being moved to pay grade 17 to classify him to the job functions he performs.

Commissioner Shrouder asked why we are adjusting this position when we are in the middle of the pay study. He advised if this is a situation where the employee needs to be paid more and market conditions, indicate an increase and we need to act now so we don't lose the employee. He would rather approve a temporary increase pending the results of the study. Director Verma explained the individual is performing a two person job but losing this individual will result in more issues.

City Manager Napoli advised the individual is performing duties outside his job description and we do not want to lose the individual.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to remove the acknowledgment and the and/or in the last paragraph.

Commissioner Katzman is in support of the change as there is a major difference in what the individual does and his job description.

Commissioner Shrouder asked the Commission update date be revised.

Mayor Ross has no issue with the item and paying for the expertise the Utilities Department needs.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to and authorize the reclassification of the position of Utilities Electrician to Utilities Electrician/Foreman from the existing Pay Grade of 16 to the proposed Pay Grade of 17, reflecting a higher level of job duties performed by the employee in the current position. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR AGENDA

4. Motion to approve first amendment with The Butler Group of South Florida, LLC D/B/A Nextaff for Crossing Guard services. Parks & Rec

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve first amendment with The Butler Group of South Florida, LLC D/B/A Nextaff for Crossing Guard service. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

5. Motion to approve a temporary agreement with Westway Towing – Finance

Commissioner Mallozzi spoke on the company having major issues historically involving Department of Justice charges. She spoke on indiscrepancies in the memorandum provided.

Mayor Ross advised he met with the owner of the company along with lobbyist Vinnie Grande. He explained the individual charged criminally was charged individually, the company was not slated.

Commissioner Katzman advised BSO uses Westway so there will be a seamless transition and the lot is located locally in Davie.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if we have to have a temporary agreement on file.

City Attorney Horowitz advised the item presented tonight is an emergency procurement under our procurement code. This process requires your professional staff to reach out to multiple vendors to the extent that they are available who are able and willing to provide the service. My understanding from conversations with the manager and the finance director is that's occurred, and that your staff has recommended a contract with West Way that's presented this evening. To the extent that the city did not have coverage come the end of this year when our current contract expires, that that would clearly be an issue in the event that there was a need in the city at any point during the in which there was no contract that provided that a particular function. In the event there was a need for the service it would likely we would reach out to BSO and potentially their vendor in an effort to fill that gap. But the city would not be receiving the benefit of an agreement while it doesn't, necessarily provide the administrative fee, which is no longer an option under the statute. It does provide certain administrative charges which are permissible that being a 25% surcharge on top of any rates that are currently established by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners, which are the towing rates that apply throughout Broward County. So there is some benefit to having an agreement in place.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if we reached out to other vendors.

CFO Kendrick advised staff reached out to three or four additional towing companies and the issue was having a large enough lot to store vehicles. They looked at who bid in the previous RFP, reached out to Public Works and contacted BSO. He also advised Superior did contact him and would have been interested in the contract however, staff did perform due diligence.

Commissioner Shrouder cited local towing agencies.

Commissioner Green asked when the contract was put out. City Manager Napoli advised two years ago and two companies bid neither which was Superior Towing. He supports the item as they did bid the item two years ago.

City Manager Napoli advised this bid will go out within the next few weeks.

Commissioner Shrouder would support the item if we go out to bid immediately and no points are given to the incumbent.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants the agreement to prohibit soliciting of collision services.

Mayor Ross said enforcement is difficult and there is a statue that requires no solicitation. All he asks is that they follow the law.

Commissioner Green said its natural instinct to ask for recommendations.

City Attorney Horowitz will add the specific language prohibiting soliciting to the agreement and the solicitation.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve a temporary agreement with Westway Towing prohibiting the vendor soliciting towed customers for collision services either through itself or related entity. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

6. Motion to approve adding LPR cameras to the remaining LPRs without cameras. – Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder said the cameras will be able to aid in locating vehicles.

Commissioner Katzman would like to add to the motion a friendly amendment of exploring adding a camera to the intersection of Estada.

Mayor Ross inquired about cost.

CFO Kendrick advised the funds will come from a budgeted line.

Mayor Ross asked Captain De Giovanni if these cameras are needed and if we will need any additional cameras. Captain De Giovanni believes this to be a prudent purchase. He also advised a site visit will determine if the City has a right-a-way located at the entrance of Estada or if the location is owned by the CDD, he will visit with the community for the camera addition.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve adding cameras to the remaining LPRs without cameras and exploring adding a camera to the intersection of Estada. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

7. Discussion and possible action on using Public Safety Impact Fees to build-out the City's Emergency Operation Center (EOC) and adding a dedicated server for the Emergency Operation Center and Real Time Crime Center(RTCC). - Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder said he City's EOC is on BSO'S server. He would like to add a City server at the Police Station for City use and the Real Time Crime Center. He would like to use the public safety impact fees. CFO Kendrick advised we can include this item with the internet that will be connected at the Park.

Mayor Ross asked how much we have in public safety impact fees. CFO Kendrick advised \$150,000.

Mayor Ross asked Captain De Giovanni if this is needed. Captain De Giovanni advised it is a prudent purchase. He asked other cities with Real Time Crime Center's and they all indicated a dedicated server would be beneficial. He did not bring this item forth as he wanted to wait until the Real Time Crime Center was reviewed.

Consensus was reached to use Public Safety Impact Fees to build-out the City's Emergency Operation Center (EOC) and adding a dedicated server for the Emergency Operation Center and Real Time Crime Center(RTCC)

8. Discussion and possible action to direct the City Attorney's Office to draft an ordinance providing for the prohibition of feeding wild animals within the City, including, but not limited to, feral/stray cats and ducks. – Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Mallozzi advised this issue has been ongoing for years. She spoke on the trap and release program but the issue is that some individuals do not want their animals trapped. She advised this ordinance will assist Code Enforcement with allowing for the cleanup of feces and food.

Commissioner Green supports the ordinance to address the feeding of the wildlife. He explained a situation in his HOA with an individual feeding ducks that has caused damages.

Commissioner Shrouder sees both sides. The real issue is a prohibition on feeding wild animals to a point where it's a public nuisance. Nuisance needs to be defined to allow for the feeding of neighborhood cats.

Commissioner Katzman said the outline issues of sickness need to be addressed. He spoke on the Broward County Code prohibiting the harboring of animals. He would like to address the major concerns without preventing the feeding of neighborhood cats.

Mayor Ross advised the issue is the manner in which the animals are getting feed. Mayor Ross asked Captain De Giovanni if we have looked at this issue from a public nuisance stand point. Captain De Giovanni advised it can be looked at as a public nuisance however, defining the issue may be a challenge. Mayor Ross also said one ordinance may not address all areas of concern.

City Attorney Horowitz will look at any tools currently in the code to assist.

Consensus was reached for the City Attorney to bring forth an ordinance addressing the issue.

9. Discussion and possible action regarding access to gated communities by non-essential personnel – Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Mallozzi advised residents asked her about this item while she was campaigning. She does not believe Commission members or City personnel are essential.

Commissioner Shrouder explained the previous code allowed personnel to have access to private communities but did not define access. He explained in two communities the gate access system stopped working and emergency personnel could not enter. The Captain then advised these communities were using codes. The intent behind the ordinance change was to clarify the type of access so emergency personnel could access the neighborhoods. The City does not give access to neighborhoods with gate openers.

City Manager Napoli advised the only staff that have access to communities is Utilities, Police and Fire.

Commissioner Green does not believe the Commission needs gate clickers to access communities.

Commissioner Shrouder said the Commission has access to inspect all areas via the Charter. The functions of government need to access these communities.

Commissioner Mallozzi said if the Commission is allowed to have access a memorandum needs to be released citing the ordinance.

Commissioner Shrouder asked Captain De Giovanni if he has had any criminal complaints refarding the City Commission accessing communities. Captain De Giovanni answered he has not received complaints.

Captain De Giovanni explained he did advise the Commission the previous code did not clarify access. His professional opinion is that the updated ordinance streamlines the process.

Commissioner Shrouder said the code does state the access is for lawful necessity.

The Commission discussed the writing of a policy to clarify who has access.

10. Discussion and possible action regarding the spending or reallocation of a Commissioner's discretionary funds in the year in which the Commissioner is up for re-election. - Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Mallozzi explained the previous District 2 Commissioner disbursed the discretionary funds for District 2 the morning of the Swearing In for her term. She explained the funds were for the rest of the fiscal year and she would like a policy written to avoid this issue in the future.

Commissioner Green said if it is an election year the funds should be replenished if used.

Commissioner Shrouder agrees the funds should be replenished for the newly elected individual.

Commissioner Katzman asked to create a newly elected official fund.

Commissioner Shrouder said the time to address this issue is during the budget season during an election year.

11. Discussion and possible action to amend the City's Administrative Procedures Resolution to provide for an 11:30pm end time for City Commission meetings and a 4-minute time limit on discussion by members of the City Commission. - Mayor Ross

Mayor Ross would like to add an additional item limiting agenda items by a Commission to three.

Commissioner Katzman said he wants to have meetings that are not going beyond normal hours to assure public attendance. He would like to limit the time each Commissioner speaks. He would also like to add a support and oppose box to the public speaking slips. He would also like to address advertised date certain items first before the meeting commences.

Commissioner Shrouder said he recommended the oppose and support sign in sheets but it was not implemented. He also recommended Special Recognition Meetings to remove recognition items from agendas and items are still added to regular agendas. He does not want to limit the conversation on the dais as it is the only time the Commission can lawfully discuss items. He also spoke on potentially starting meetings earlier.

Commissioner Green advised the meetings were scheduled at 6:30 PM to allow for residents to attend after work. He supports the four minute time limit. He also spoke on the lengthy meetings and the residents not being able to watch late hours into the night.

Commissioner Shrouder said the Commission needs to conduct business.

Commissioner Green said surrounding municipalities are able to conduct business within reasonable hours.

Commissioner Mallozzi said the only communication between the Commission has to be done in public. She recommended adding more items to consent agenda and trying an 11:30 PM end time. She asked City Manager Napoli if everyone has agenda reviews prior to the meeting. City Manager Napoli answered yes.

Mayor Ross said the Commissioners should be able to make points in a reasonable time.

Commissioner Katzman agrees with discussion but would support a time limit on the first go around.

Commissioner Shrouder does not agree to a three limit item restraint on Commissioners items.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve an 11:30 PM end time for Commission Meeting. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

City Attorney Horowitz will bring forth a resolution to approve the 11:30 PM end time.

Mayor Ross has issue with a single Commissioner adding numerous items to the agenda and monopolizing the agenda.

Commissioner Shrouder stated he is an active elected official.

Commissioner Katzman asked to rotate items by Commissioners on the agenda by seniority.

Commissioner Green said he supports limiting the number of agenda items.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve agenda items being listed by seniority and then repeating again in seniority order. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Commissioner Shrouder asked that the senior members of the Commission vote first.

Commissioner Green believes the senior members need to vote at the end.

ORDINANCES ON SECOND READING (Public Hearing)

12. Ordinance 22-26 (Community Development)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 25, ARTICLE II OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "SIGNS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 25-26, ENTITLED "WINDOW SIGNS;" PERMITTING ALL COLORS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR WINDOW SIGNS; LIMITING ALL PERMITTED TYPES OF LIT WINDOW SIGNAGE TO ONLY BE ILLUMINATED DURING BUSINESS HOURS; ELIMINATING THE "HOLIDAY SEASON" RESTRICTION OF OCTOBER 15 THROUGH JANUARY 5 FOR BOTH TEMPORARY WINDOW SIGNAGE AND WINDOW LIGHTING; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the ordinance including a 36 inch setback for window lighting.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to ensure the signage is viewable.

Commissioner Shrouder does not believe encased lights are aesthetically pleasing.

Commissioner Katzman spoke on the Business Advisory Boards recommendation.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke on businesses that have the incased flickering lighting in the window and how it is not aesthetically pleasing.

Community Development Director Carlos Vega said the pushback would have the lights hanging from the ceiling so it may add liability to the businesses.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 22-26 including no window encasement lighting allowed. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 22-26 as amended. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

CITY MANAGER REPORT

13. Update on the Dog Park

Public Works Director Tom Good advised himself and the City Engineer identified a location inside Brian Piccolo Park. Broward County provided a cost estimate around \$1.4 million however, there were items included in the proposal the City would not be interested in.

Commissioner Green asked if we know what the City's portion would be. Director Good answered no.

Commissioner Katzman asked the next steps. Director Good said speaking with the County on a more realistic number.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked the amount for the park alone. Director Good said around \$314,000. Commissioner Mallozzi asked about a potential dog park location at Jerry Morgan Park. She did advise of a possible deed restriction.

Commissioner Shrouder recommended Flamingo Park.

Director Tom Good advised they did not explore Jerry Morgan Park as there is a deed restriction.

Mayor Ross does not support paying for an improvement to a county park.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested a feasibility study at these locations.

Director Tom Good clarified Broward County did not ask for any funds but they will ask them if they expect the City to share cost.

14. Legislative Update

City Manager Napoli advised the City plans on presenting to the legislature for funding this year. The items presented is the roundabout on Hiatus and North Lake Boulevard for approximately \$367,000 and the 49th Street Culvert between \$350,000 to \$500,000. He also advised Mayor Ross added the Florida League of Cities priority list. City Manager Napoli thanked staff for Light Up Cooper City as it was a great event. There will be a celebration at Memorial Park on December 18, 2022 for the first

night of Hanukkah at 5:30 PM. City Manager Napoli also advised the Collective Bargaining Agreement has been finalized and will brought forth the first meeting in January. Lastly, he advised he has been with the City almost three years and believes it is time to move on. He is proud of the accomplishments the City has made in the past three years and deeply cares about the City and staff. He is committed to making sure there is a good transition for stability.

Commissioner Shrouder stated he spoke to the City Manager and he is willing to stay on during the transition and he would like Commission consensus on amending his contract to remove the provision on notifying the Commission if he applies within another entity and continuing the obligation on severance. He also stated the City has done tremendous under City Manager Napoli's leadership and he respects his decision.

Commissioner Green does not want City Manager Napoli to part ways with the City as he has moved the City forward in a way that has never been done. He spoke on the initiatives City Manager Napoli has implemented including the EOC SharePoint site and managing the CARES Act funding. He stated City Manager Napoli has been a phenomenal leader and if he has wronged him in any way he publicly apologizes as an elected official.

Commissioner Katzman advised he hasn't had the chance to work with City Manager Napoli for long but as a resident he was great. He was hoping to work with City Manager Napoli longer but he respects his decision and thanks him for willingness to serve during the transition and supports the addendum discussed.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she would like to see City Manager Napoli stay but the choice is his.

Mayor Ross thanked City Manager Napoli on behalf of the residents as he has worked endlessly for the residents including the strategic plan and ARPA funding. He thanked City Manager Napoli for assisting during the transition. He agrees with the removal of the provision on notifying the Commission if he applies within another entity and continuing the obligation on severance. Mayor Ross said he is proud of City Manager Napoli and his decisions.

Commissioner Shrouder made a motion to amend the City Managers contract to remove the provision on notifying the Commission if he applies within another entity and continuing the obligation on severance as identified in the contract contingent upon him staying for up to two months. Commissioner Shrouder thanked City Manager Napoli for bringing a level of professionalism to the City that it did not have prior.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to amend the City Managers contract to remove the provision on notifying the Commission if he applies within another entity and continuing the obligation on severance as identified in the contract contingent upon him staying for up to two months. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote. (4-1)

YES: Commissioners Mallozzi, Katzman, Shrouder and Mayor Ross

NO: Commissioner Green

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Horowitz advised he will bring forth an amendment to the City Managers contract pursuant to the last motion. He also advised the Broward County Commission adopted an ordinance amending the code of ethics for elected officials throughout Broward County. Starting on January 1, 2023 public officials, elected officials throughout the State of Florida are prohibited from lobbying for

compensation at the State, Local and Federal level. The other significant prohibition in the Constitution is when you leave public office there's a 6 year prohibition on lobbying the agency that you recently served.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

15. Police Chief Report

Captain De Giovanni thanked City Manager Napoli for his support. He also spoke on the value of the license plate readers and how they aided in real time arrest of an individual with a felony arrest warrant entering Monterra at a late hour and was not a resident of the area. He also advised the Suellen Fardelmann smart camera system has been completed and the permitting process has begun on the Real Time Crime Center. He also thanked the COP's who give their own time to support the City's public safety mission. He also advised four local news stations covered the Santa Letters initiative. Lastly, he reminded the residents the Shred-A-Thon will be held on January 20, 2023 at 10:00 AM.

Commissioner Katzman asked about the holiday home watch program. Captain De Giovanni advised BSO District 16 has a home watch program to check on residents homes if they are away for the holidays.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

16. Fire Chief Report

Chief Harrington advised he has no amendments to his report and thanked City Manager Napoli for his efforts.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if there is insurance coverage for the fire apparatus that caught fire. Chief Harrington advised the truck was a BSO vehicle and the vehicle will no longer be in service and they have a temporary replacement at District 28.

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Green apologized for missing Light Up Cooper City. He thanked the Recreation staff for their work on the event. He also asked to move the Walking Club to Mondays.

Commissioner Shrouder inquired about decorative coverings for the electric boxes. He also asked about the process for the City Manager search and how they should proceed.

Mayor Ross said they need to look at professional recruiting firms which can be difficult. Another option is having HR recruit individuals.

Commissioner Shrouder advised we need to use a professional company.

Consensus was reached to have the City Manager bring forth recruiting firms.

Commissioner Katzman asked if we would like to hold a Special Meeting to move the process forward as soon as possible.

Commissioner Shrouder said the objective is to settle on a company with price ranges.

Consensus was reached for a Special Meeting on December 21, 2022 at 7:15 AM.

Commissioner Katzman would like to update the code to adhere to the Charter with regard to election changes. City Attorney Horowitz advised he is working on the code in reference to the election changes.

Commissioner Shrouder would also like to look at the sign code in relation to elections. City Attorney Horowitz advised they are working on an update to the sign code as well.

Commissioner Mallozzi wished everyone a Happy Holiday.

Mayor Ross wished everyone a Happy Holiday.

ADDITIONAL PUBLIC COMMENTS (2 MINUTES)

Robin Morganstine, 2990 W Budd St, advised the emergency clickers are designed for emergency use alone not for city officials as it causes issues to the gate arm.

Commissioner Shrouder said when we adopt the administrative policy we can identify the use of the emergency lane to not cause issues with the gate.

ADJOURNMENT
