RECOMMENDATION:

Commissioner Mallozzi requests a discussion and possible action on the implementation of a Community Garden initiative in the easement in Monterra to enhance community engagement, promote sustainability, and utilize available public space efficiently.

BACKGROUND OF ITEM:

Community Gardens have been a growing trend in urban and suburban municipalities, offering residents a dedicated space to cultivate fruits, vegetables, and ornamental plants. Some key benefits of implementing a community garden:

1. Environmental benefits include:

- Enhances Green Spaces: Converts vacant lots into vibrant, productive landscapes.

- **Encourages Sustainable Practices:** Promotes composting, water conservation, and organic farming methods.
- **2. Community Engagement & Social Interaction** Fosters relationships among residents and creates a sense of belonging.
- **3. Educational Opportunities** Provide hands-on learning for schools and community groups about gardening and sustainability.
- **4. Enhanced Neighborhood Aesthetics & Green Spaces** Improves the visual appeal of public areas while increasing green coverage.
- **5. Mental & Physical Well-Being** Offers a therapeutic and physical activity that reduces stress and overall health.

- **6. Intergenerational Learning & Cultural Exchange** Allows different age groups and cultural backgrounds to share knowledge and experiences.
- **7. Environmental Benefits** Helps mitigate urban heat island effects by increasing vegetation and improving air quality.
- **8.** Food Security & Self-Sufficiency Strengthens access to fresh produce, reducing food insecurity for community members.

The proposed Community Garden will provide residents access to gardening plots, educational workshops, and opportunities to grow their produce.
