Subject: Fire Chief's Report – Commission Meeting January 14, 2025

The following is the Fire Chief's report for the upcoming commission meeting. The report highlights information pertinent to the city's main public safety concerns: Fire Rescue Incidents, Fire Apparatus / Station concerns, Fire Prevention, Community Outreach, and CERT.

I. FIRE / RESCUE INCIDENT REPORT FOR DECEMBER 2024.

FASTEST UNIT RESPONSE / MUTUAL AID CALLS FOR DECEMBER 2024.

There were five (5) extended responses. The longest emergent response was recorded as 11:56 due to an incorrect location that was initially provide to the 911 call taker. There was a delay in diverting to the secondary location. There were also 10:58, 9:30 and 9:25 responses that were due to distances to the incident locations. Lastly, there was a 10:01 extended response time due to a mechanical issue (air pressure build up).

I. FIRE APPARATUS / STATION REPORT

Rescue 228 was in for major repairs but was returned to service near the end of the month only to go back into a reserve unit for an additional repair. These ongoing repairs are normal as units approach their end of front-line service life which is approximately 10 years.







IV. COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT


- Fire crews and Life Safety Educators participated in a Santa event for the Littlest Cowboys at Cooper City High School.

FIRE HYDRANT DESIGN UPDATE:


Cooper City High School has presented their proposed paint designs. Once completed the paint and supplies will be provided to the next school to complete their fire hydrant art design project.
