MINUTES

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Mallozzi, Katzman, Shrouder, Green and Mayor Ross.

DECORUM - Attorney Jacob Horowitz

City Attorney Horowitz read the decorum policy as follows: Members of the Commission, staff members, citizens, and others are required to use civil and appropriate language when addressing the Commission or anyone present at the meeting and must refrain from using profanity, cursing, or exhibiting aggressive or threatening behavior. All comments should generally be directed to the presiding officer and not to individual members of the Commission, staff, or the audience. No personal verbal attacks toward any individual by either the Commission, staff, citizens, or others shall be allowed during any meeting of the Commission. Any persons making impertinent or slanderous remarks or personal attacks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Commission or who otherwise violates the decorum rules set forth herein shall be barred from further audience before the Commission by the Mayor, or by request of any member of the Commission unless permission to continue or again address the Commission be granted by a majority vote of the Commission members present.

PUBLIC SPEAKING

Open Public Meeting/Agenda Concerns

Carmen Mure, 11315 Lake Shore Dr, spoke on pickle ball court updates and working with the City during the upcoming budget season.

Marlon Bryan, Attorney for Westway Towing, spoke on his concerns with the ranking from the evaluation committee.

David Sweet, spoke on his support of Westway Towing.

Brett Holcombe, President of Westway Towing, would like the Commission to look into the evaluation committee process and to tour their facility.

PROCLAMATIONS/PRESENTATIONS

1. Marty Kiar Presentation - Values of Cooper City - Broward County Property Appraiser

Broward County Property Appraiser Marty Kiar thanked City staff for their professionalism and great work as a partner with the Property Appraiser's Office. He advised the values will be released on Friday, May 26, 2023. There are several exemptions available to residents such as homestead exemption, senior exemptions, veteran exemptions and exemptions for widows. He also advised there has been a 16.8% increase in market values for Cooper City and the taxable value is \$4.46 billion dollars. The average sale price for a residential property in Cooper City is about \$651,346. The average condominium sale price is about \$190,000. He also spoke on title fraud and the program, Owner Alert which is available by visiting BCPA.net. He also spoke on several instances where fraud has occurred in Cooper City.

Commissioner Katzman asked Mr. Kiar to send the statistics he spoke on to the Commission.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if we can place the Owner Alert information on the City website.

2. Legislative Update on the Appropriations and the Legislative Session - Commissioner Katzman

Senator Lauren Book and State Representative Michael Gottlieb spoke on bringing in more than \$800,000 to Cooper City this year for the culvert and the Hiatus Road traffic needs. Senator Book spoke on a permanent diaper tax exemption and good bipartisan victories.

Commissioner Katzman thanked both Senator Lauren Book, State Representative Michael Gottlieb and Rana Brown for their hard work. He also spoke on an item that was struck at the Governor's desk and if there is anything the City or the residents can do to communicate to the Governor. State Representative Michael Gottlieb said the priority in the House was water projects.

Senator Lauren Book spoke on ballot petitions.

Mayor Ross thanked Senator Lauren Book and State Representative Michael Gottlieb.

Rana Brown thanked the City and is waiting for the signing of the budget for the City's funding requests.

Ordinances On First Reading

6. Ordinance 23-14 - (Community Development)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 19 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED, "UTILITIES;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING ARTICLE III, SECTION 19-154, ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS;" AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF "IMPERVIOUS AREA;" FURTHER AMENDING CHAPTER 21, ENTITLED "UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE," BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 21-8, ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS;" PROVIDING FOR A DEFINITION OF "ARTIFICIAL TURF OR ARTIFICIAL GRASS;" AMENDING CHAPTER 25 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING ARTICLE III, SECTION 25-47, ENTITLED "SUPPLEMENTAL LANDSCAPE REQUIREMENTS;" ESTABLISHING AN EIGHTY PERCENT (80%) CREDIT TOWARDS IMPERVIOUS AREA CALCULATIONS, SPECIFYING SETBACK REQUIREMENTS AND PROVIDING FOR PERMIT REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder spoke to Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley on modifications. Assistant Director Chockley advised the Commissioner recommended making the front driveway modification exempt from the 50% increase.

Mayor Ross asked if Commissioner Shrouder's recommendation would help address the water issue. Assistant Director Chockley advised most residents that widen driveways have an impervious area at 100%.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if there is language that can be added to address properties that may have issues with the new impervious calculations.

Commissioner Shrouder wants a mechanism to address certain homes that may have issues with the new code update.

City Attorney Horowitz said the Commission can designate certain authority to staff.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested residents could exceed the impervious area in the front yard if staff determines it will not affect drainage.

City Attorney Horowitz will work with staff to bring back language to that affect.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve Ordinance 23-14. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

7. Ordinance 23-13 (Community Development)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "BUILDING AND BUILDING REGULATIONS;" SPECIFICALLY AMENDING ARTICLE V, ENTITLED "FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION;" PROVIDING FOR CONSISTENCY WITH THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM; PROVIDING FOR ACCESSORY STRUCTURES IN FLOOD HAZARD AREAS; SPECIFYING THE ELEVATION OF MANUFACTURED HOMES IN FLOOD HAZARD AREAS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Ordinance 23-13. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Commissioner Green pulled item 10. Commissioner Mallozzi pulled items 9 and 10. Commissioner Shrouder pulled item 11.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve the consent agenda with the exception of items of items 9, 10 and 11. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

9. Motion to adopt the Southeast Florida Local and Tribal Government Climate Action Pledge – Mayor Ross

Commissioner Mallozzi asked why this item did not go before the Green Advisory Board.

Mayor Ross explained this item is a regional aspect. All 31 cities are dependent on each other.

Commissioner Mallozzi said the agricultural and beach aspects do not apply to the City. She also spoke on the costs of the pledge and the need for staff resources that she does not support.

Mayor Ross said Jennifer Jurado is available to answer all of Commissioner Mallozzi's questions. He advised having reviewed the pledge himself and hearing Ms. Jurado speak on the item this is simply an acknowledgement of a problem with no funds needing to be committed.

Commissioner Green asked City Attorney Horowitz if the pledge requires funds from the City. City Attorney Horowitz advised his understanding is this is an aspirational pledge.

MOTION: Mayor Ross moved to adopt the Southeast Florida Local and Tribal Government Climate Action Pledge. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote. (4-1)

NO: Commissioner Mallozzi

YES: Commissioners Katzman, Shrouder, Green and Mayor Ross

10. Recommendation of Award – RFP Agreement between the City of Cooper City and A Superior Towing Company - Administration

Commissioner Green asked where the facilities of Westway and Superior Towing are located. Brett Holcombe, President of Westway Towing, advised they are located at 3330 Burris Road in Davie.

Commissioner Green thanked Westway Towing for providing services to the City the past few months. He asked Captain De Giovanni to speak on his experience with Westway Towing. Captain De Giovanni advised he has not received any complaints with their service.

The General Manager from Superior Towing advised they are located at 2385 SW 66 Terrace in Davie.

Commissioner Shrouder said both are great. He advised he has been towed by both companies and has had great experiences with both. He would have preferred the RFP to be more detailed. He understands the Procurement Department is working on insufficiencies.

Commissioner Katzman asked Mr. Vega and Mr. Fleming to speak on their experience serving on the Evaluation Committee and with Westway Towing. Interim City Manager Vega advised he has no experience with towing so his observations were based on the RFP. He advised the items Superior provided seemed more advanced. Commissioner Katzman asked if it is typical to do a site visit. Interim City Manager Vega believes the committee can request to do a site visit.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked Parks Operations Supervisor Tim Fleming to speak on his experience with Westway Towing. Parks Operations Supervisor Tim Fleming advised he has had issues with Westway not picking up debris from accident scenes. Commissioner Mallozzi said she has witnessed debris left in the roadway. She has concerns that we have issues with the company. She advised staff recommended a vendor and she supports staff's recommendation.

Commissioner Katzman wants to assure the non-solicitation clause is listed in the agreement. City Attorney Horowitz confirmed it is included.

Commissioner Green asked if there is language in the contract that obligates the company to clean up debris left in the roadway. City Attorney Horowitz confirmed it is included.

Commissioner Shrouder said we cannot determine why the debris was left. He agrees that the process was flawed referring to the rating of equipment without visiting the sites.

Commissioner Mallozzi advised she previously suggested using two vendors. She also previously brought up issues with an individual formally in the company being arrested and the spouse of that individual working right next door to Westway.

Commissioner Green said he spoke to Mr. Holcombe about the issue involving an arrest of a former employee who is no longer with the company. He asked if the spouse of the individual next door is involved with the company. Mr. Holcombe answered no.

Commissioner Katzman said there is a process in place and he has heard all sides. He moved to approve the agreement.

Mayor Ross asked Parks Operations Supervisor Tim Fleming who he conveyed the issues to with regard to Westway not picking up the debris. Parks Operations Supervisor Tim Fleming said he contacted dispatch. Mayor Ross asked who in dispatch called Westway. Supervisor Fleming is unsure.

Commissioner Shrouder said the categories in the RFP were not accurate. Reputation should have been listed in the RFP if they were essential to the award.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about the use of two contracts.

City Attorney Horowitz advised the City went out for a competitive bid, a RFP was issued and we know that process is in part governed by the Broward County Code of Ethics that applies to Elected Municipal Officials. That code tells us that members of the City Commission cannot serve as evaluators on a procurement selection committee, and in this case they did not. The City had a committee comprised of three members of professional staff, who served in that capacity, and they've made a recommendation. But what the Commission can't do this evening is essentially re-evaluate and change the scoring. The Commission has the option to accept the recommendation from staff or send the matter back to the evaluation committee for their further review, based on this discussion. But the solicitation documents had a defined term. It was essentially an exclusive opportunity for one contractor to be engaged by the City. If the Commission wanted to deviate from the procurement process and go in a different direction he would suggest rejecting all of the responses, terminating the procurement process and re-examine the towing contract in a different capacity.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if there is a termination provision. City Attorney Horowitz advised there is a termination for convenience clause in the contract.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve the Recommendation of Award – RFP Agreement between the City of Cooper City and A Superior Towing Company. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote. (4-1)

11. Motion to approve the execution of an agreement with Granicus, LLC for Video Streaming Services – City Clerk

Commissioner Shrouder asked what we owe the vendor currently. Mr. Cardona from Granicus advised the City owes overage on closed captioning. Commissioner Shrouder asked the increase in rate from the previous contract. Mr. Cardona answered there is no increase.

Mayor Ross asked the cost with the RFP compared to the cooperative agreement. City Clerk Tedra Allen answered the quote was \$27,025 and the cooperative rate is \$22,808.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if we have a termination provision with a cooperative agreement. City Attorney Horowitz answered the City is bound by the terms and conditions of the cooperative agreement. The only cause for termination listed is for default or breach.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if there is a difference in services provided between the cooperative agreement and the RFP. City Attorney Horowitz said the response received was from another company who was then bought out by Granicus so that may have some bearing on the price difference.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked why the City cannot use social media for streaming. Mr. Cardona said the close captioning Granicus provides is ADA compliant and the City owns the videos. Commissioner Mallozzi asked about reoccurring volume issues.

Interim City Manager Vega said the audio issues we have been experiencing are City issues.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve the execution of an agreement with Granicus, LLC for Video Streaming Services. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR AGENDA

12. Motion to approve the purchase of City Vehicles

Interim City Manager Vega explained it has been very difficult the past two years to purchase vehicles. In visiting lots to purchase vehicles the City is restricted to a certain pool of vehicles. Staff has visited several dealerships with the major issue being rising costs. Staff is looking for a range in which the Commission is comfortable with price wise for the purchase of City vehicles. Ford vehicles have been the standard in the City however, the cost can be higher compared to other brands.

Commissioner Shrouder said a process needs established. He would like to look into purchasing all brands and purchasing vehicles with the best value. He does not believe Administration needs an updated vehicle. He would also like to set an amount of \$45,000 or less and start a replacement plan.

Commissioner Katzman spoke to staff multiple times regarding the item. He thanked Public Works for their due diligence on the preparation of the item but advised they need to remain prudent with the resident's money. He would like to see if it costs less to use a different brand of vehicle in any color range.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she understands certain departments require vehicles with certain specifications.

Commissioner Katzman advised the Commission can approve a range and staff can always approach the Commission if a vehicle with certain specifications will total more money.

Commissioner Green said the Commission can set the budget amount and let staff determine the vehicles they need.

Mayor Ross believes a fair compromise is a range between \$45,000 to \$55,000.

Commissioner Shrouder said they are bypassing procurement so they need to make a policy decision. He does not see the need to remain with Ford. He would like to look at the best value of vehicles.

Commissioner Shrouder asked Captain De Giovanni what he pays usually for vehicles. Captain De Giovanni said prices have risen significantly to the \$50,000 to \$55,000 range.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to allow staff to consider all colors and brands.

Interim City Manager Vega advised staff will notify the Commission when vehicles are purchased.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve the purchase of City Vehicles with a \$55,000 cap not limited to the brand Ford or white in color. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR RESOLUTIONS

13. Resolution 23-7 (BSO)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE AND FILE THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION AND BY-LAWS FOR THE COOPER CITY POLICE CRIME WATCH, INC. ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A" AND INCORPORATED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Katzman wants to assure positions on the board are tied to employment. He also wants to assign a member of Finance to the Board. He also commended Captain De Giovanni for his efforts.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the third position should be a position appointed by the Police Chief as opposed to the Community Involvement Specialist.

City Attorney Horowitz would like to confirm it is legally an option to have an undefined individual appointed to the board.

Commissioner Shrouder said if it is legally allowed the change can be made.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 23-7. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

14. Resolution 23-9 (Administration)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING A PARTIAL RELEASE OF LIEN FEE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$495.50, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 13-75 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING OR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 23-9. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

15. Ordinance-23-15 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA; AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION," BY AMENDING ARTICLE X, ENTITLED "COOPER CITY PROCUREMENT CODE;" SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 2-252, ENTITLED "PURPOSE AND INTENT;" AMENDING SECTION 2-253, ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS;" AMENDING SECTION 2-256, ENTITLED "METHODS OF SOURCE SELECTION;" AMENDING SECTION 2-257, ENTITLED "SMALL PURCHASE PROCEDURES;" AMENDING SECTION 2-258, ENTITLED "EXCLUSIONS AND EXCEPTIONS TO BID AND PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS;" AMENDING SECTION 2-259, ENTITLED "BONDS AND SECURITY REQUIREMENTS;" AMENDING SECTION 2-261, ENTITLED "TYPES OF CONTRACTS AND CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION;" AMENDING SECTION 2-263, ENTITLED "PROCUREMENT OF CONSTRUCTION AND PROFESSIONAL DESIGN SERVICES;" AUTHORIZING THE USE OF ELECTRONIC PROCUREMENT AND ELECTRONIC BIDDING SOFTWARE, CONSISTENT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF FLORIDA LAW, AS AN OPTION FOR THE COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION OF GOODS AND SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR CONSISTENCY THROUGHOUT THE PROCUREMENT CODE REGARDING PROCUREMENT REQUIREMENTS AND COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION THRESHOLDS; CREATING SECTION 2-270, TO BE ENTITLED "CONE OF SILENCE;" ADOPTING THE CITY'S CONE OF SILENCE POLICY AS A CODIFIED ORDINANCE OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder said the threshold amounts for the Directors need to be defined. He said they reference the Purchasing Agent as an independent person but they fall under the Finance Director. He would like to codify specific amounts. In Section 2-261 he does not believe the City Manager should be allowed to approve a large contract without Commission approval. He believes the language is necessary but it needs a cap.

City Attorney Horowitz advised the Cone of Silence section is no different than the language used in the City's competitive bidding.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to add aggregate language in Section 2-257. He also does not want to allow a change order to equal the amount of the contract.

MOTION: Commissioner Mallozzi moved to approve Ordinance 23-15. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

CITY MANAGER REPORT

Interim City Manager Vega thanked the Commission for their support during his time as Interim. He also said Mr. Eggleston will start officially on June 1, 2023.

Mayor Ross thanked Interim City Manager Vega for his work.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Horowitz commended Interim City Manager Vega for a job well done.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

16. Police Chief's Report

Captain De Giovanni advised Stonebridge Parkway and 90th Avenue were included in the aggressive driving and speeding enforcement operations. Code Enforcement will continue the quality of life sweep through May 27, 2023 including visits to the short term rentals. He also wanted to bring forth a code recommendation looking at Section 3-2, regarding alcohol sales from retail establishments after a certain time period. Currently the Code reads Monday through Saturday, limitation on alcohol sales from 6:00 AM to 7AM. Sundays from 4:00 AM to 7:00 AM. Captain De Giovanni would like to follow the City of Weston's model prohibiting the sale of alcohol at convenience stores Monday through Sunday from 1:00 AM to 7:00 AM. The Town of Davie limits from 2:00 AM to 7:00 AM, Pembroke Pines, 3:00 AM to 7:00 AM and Hollywood 2:00 AM to 7:00 AM. He advised the City allowing the sale of alcohol at late hours may encourage individuals to enter the City under the influence. He also advised starting October 2023, any regulation in the area of commerce or business will require a lot more legwork so his team will be bringing forth more recommendations.

City Attorney Horowitz advised there was some action taken by the legislature which essentially creates a cause of action for businesses in the event that local government adopts legislation which adversely affects their economic interests.

Consensus was reached to move forward with the City Attorney's Office to draft the ordinance.

Captain De Giovanni advised there has been an issue in Hibbs Grove with bulk trash and with the help of the Real Time Crime Center it was discovered that an individual from Davie was dumping bulk in the City. The Real Time Crime Center Sergeant position has been filled. He thanked Commissioner Green for a Miami Team Night Out event that the Police Explorer's attended. He also advised unwanted firearms and ammunition can be brought to the Police Station to be discarded. He also thanked the Community Involvement Team for holding the Get the Scoop event at Temple Beth Emit and thanked Interim City Manager Vega for his hard work and efforts.

Mayor Ross asked if the Firearm Buyback Program is still active. Captain De Giovanni advised BSO still offers the program.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

17. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Harrington thanked Interim City Manager Vega for a job well done. He also thanked Mayor Ross and Commissioner Mallozzi for presenting the scholarship awards at the Cooper City High School.
