MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the consent agenda with the exception of items 14, 23 and 25. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

14. **Resolution 25-43 (BSO)**

City Attorney Horowitz read “A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, THE BROWARD SHERIFF’S OFFICE, AND RENAISSANCE CHARTER SCHOOL, INC., FOR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER SERVICES, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT “A” AND INCORPORATED HEREIN; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE ANY AND ALL ACTION NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE” by title.

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to assure the City is not liable for overtime costs. She also spoke on the terms of the agreement, stating the Broward Sheriff’s Office will invoice Renaissance Charter School directly. However, they will not enter into an agreement directly with the school.

City Attorney Horowitz stated the City has had this agreement in place for five years. The Broward Sheriff’s Office made a policy decision not to contract directly with Charter schools. The agreement is merely a pass-through.

Commissioner Mallozzi does not want the City to be responsible for payments if personnel costs increase. City Attorney Horowitz clarified that Renaissance Charter will pay all costs.

Commissioner Shrouder asked that the City’s address in the agreement be updated.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Resolution 25-43. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

23. Motion to approve a service agreement with FastSigns to design and install utility box artistic wraps. – Administration

Commissioner Mallozzi supports the item and will bring forth an item in the near future to add art to the City plazas.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve a service agreement with FastSigns to design and install utility box artistic wraps. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Commissioner Mallozzi wants to include language to address any warranty issues of the light bulbs.

REGULAR AGENDA

28. Motion to approve a certified financial audit of the Optimist Club of Cooper City, Inc. in accordance with Section 6.3 of the Facility Use Agreement. – Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder stated that our agreement with the Optimist Club allows the City to perform an audit. The City will cover all costs.

Commissioner Katzman asked if this would include a forensic audit. City Manager Rey answered yes.

Commissioner Smith asked what a forensic piece entails. City Manager Rey said the forensic audit looks into the history of the Optimist Club and ways to address any issues moving forward.

MOTION: Commissioner Smith moved to approve a certified financial audit of the Optimist Club of Cooper City, Inc. in accordance with Section 6.3 of the Facility Use Agreement. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

29. Discussion and potential implementation of Enforcement protocols for Lawn and Yard Debris Disposal. – Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Mallozzi would like to add enforcement protocols to the code to prohibit landscapers from leaving debris. This code addition can also help reduce clogged drains.

Commissioner Shrouder supports the item.

City Attorney Horowitz will bring forth an ordinance for consideration.

Commissioner Smith asked if we have had language similar to this in the past. City Attorney Horowitz answered no but he is aware of other municipalities having restrictions.

MOTION: Commissioner Smith moved to approve enforcement protocols for Lawn and Yard Debris Disposal. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

30. Review and Approval of the City Manager's Yearly Evaluation and Salary Increase. – Administration

Commissioner Shrouder said the previous City Manager was hired at a higher salary. The former Mayor negotiated the current salary with City Manager Rey, and it should be revisited.

Commissioner Smith asked for the salary of the previous City Manager. City Manager Rey said the former City Manager's salary was \$248,000.

Commissioner Smith recommended \$248,000. This number is consistent with similar municipalities throughout Broward County.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she asked for a list of salary increases given recently. There was one employee who received a 5% increase.

Commissioner Smith asked if the increase was due to salary restructuring or a merit increase.

City Manager Rey said the compensation study results did adjust salaries. Merit increases were also given.

Commissioner Mallozzi is concerned with an increase, as City Manager Rey's contract was just renegotiated in October. She also has concerns with City Manager Rey receiving vacation days upon hire, as the City lost \$30,000 with the previous City Manager due to this method. She suggested repaying any vacation days used if the City Manager were to leave the City. City Manager Rey agreed.

MOTION: Commissioner Smith moved to approve City Manager Rey's salary at \$248,000 and the amendment to vacation accrual terms, Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote. (3-2)

YES: Commissioner Smith, Katzman and Shrouder

NO: Commissioner Mallozzi and Mayor Curran

Commissioner Katzman thanked staff for their efforts.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Resolution 25-45. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

32. Resolution 25-47 - (Finance)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, RELATING TO THE PROVISION OF FIRE SERVICES, FACILITIES AND PROGRAMS IN THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA; ESTABLISHING THE RATE OF ASSESSMENT; IMPOSING FIRE ASSESSMENTS AGAINST ASSESSED PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY OF COOPER CITY; APPROVING THE ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Mallozzi asked if these numbers include potential salary increases. City Manager Rey answered yes.

Commissioner Katzman asked if salary increases are not granted, how the residents are reimbursed.

Commissioner Mallozzi stated they can lower the assessment during the budget hearings if needed.

MOTION: Commissioner Mallozzi moved to approve Resolution 25-47. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0) Commissioner Smith was not present on the dais.

33. Resolution 25-48 (Finance)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY ADOPTING A TENTATIVE MILLAGE RATE OF 5.845 FOR GENERAL OPERATING BUDGET PURPOSES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AND SETTING FORTH THE DATE, TIME AND LOCATION OF THE PUBLIC HEARING TO FORMALLY ADOPT THE FY 2025-2026 MILLAGE RATE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder stated the millage rate of 5.845 is a decrease from the current fiscal year.

Commissioner Smith stated the decrease is \$3.93 a household. The City requires many updates. He asked about the potential impact of the commercial real estate tax on the City. City Manager Rey does not foresee a major impact.

Commissioner Shrouder stated that by raising the fire assessment rate, we are receiving additional funds.

Commissioner Katzman said the rate of 5.845 demonstrates fiscal responsibility.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Resolution 25-48. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

34. Resolution 25-49 (Utilities)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, RETROACTIVELY APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF \$19,638.25 TO CONCRETE WORKS & PAVING, INC., FOR THE PROVISION OF WATER, SEWER, AND DRAINAGE REPAIRS; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE ANY AND ALL ACTION NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder asked to justify the retroactive approval. Utilities Director Akin Ozyaydin explained that the budget and purchase order were two different amounts.

MOTION: Commissioner Smith moved to approve Resolution 25-49. Commissioner Mallozzi seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

ORDINANCES ON FIRST READING**35. Ordinance 25-09 (Administration)**

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 7, ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION," ARTICLE IV, ENTITLED "FIRE ASSESSMENTS;" SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 7-22, ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS," TO AMEND THE DEFINITION OF "TAX COLLECTOR;" PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

City Attorney Horowitz advised that there has been an amendment to the Florida Constitution and a Tax Collector's Office has officially been established. There is an additional agreement within the backup for approval.

Commissioner Katzman asked to receive an accounting on the use.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 25-09. Mayor Curran seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the City could potentially lose 2% on our ad valorem collection. City Attorney Horowitz does not believe there will be a decrease in the ad valorem collection.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the agreement with the Tax Collector. Mayor Curran seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 25 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS;" BY AMENDING ARTICLE II ENTITLED, "SIGNS;" AMENDING SECTION 25-24 ENTITLED "TEMPORARY SIGNS;" AUTHORIZING CERTAIN TEMPORARY SIGNS FOR SPONSORS OF THE COOPER CITY OPTIMIST CLUB; ESTABLISHING THE COOPER CITY OPTIMIST SPONSORSHIP SIGN PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR RESTRICTIONS AND REGULATIONS OF APPROVED TEMPORARY SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION;

PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE” by title.

Commissioner Katzman said his understanding is that the banners would be in the colors that the business utilizes. Assistant Community Development Director Jason Chockley advised that the interior part of the signs will not be restricted.

Mayor Curran asked if the package would be unified. Assistant Community Development Director Chockley answered yes.

MOTION: Commissioner Smith moved to approve Ordinance 25-10. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Ordinance 25-11. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Commissioner Smith thanked the Planning and Zoning Board members and the Commission for moving the item forward on behalf of the business community.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

40. Budget Transfer Notification - Tree removal

City Manager Rey advised that he had a meeting with the Public Works Department of the City of Pembroke Pines, which has been working with Broward County. Broward County would like to take over the maintenance of Sheridan Street, between Pine Island Road and University Drive. Pembroke Pines would take Pine Island Road, south of Sheridan Street. The City's only responsibility is the hedge on the south side of Sheridan Street. The hedge is in bad condition, and the intent is for the City to cover maintenance costs.

Commissioner Shrouder questioned the agreement as the City does not currently maintain the road between Sheridan Street and Pine Island Road. Utilities Director Akin Ozaydin stated that Broward County said the roadway belongs to the City. Commissioner Shrouder said Broward County has maintained the road for years. City Attorney Horowitz said he is not involved in the agreement.

The Commission asked for more information before an agreement is signed.

City Manager Rey said the Broward Sheriff's Office has not given the City an updated agreement as of yet. He has heard that BSO is not willing to agree to a 5% cap moving forward. The City may need to look into other options.

Commissioner Mallozzi said she supports law enforcement and fire personnel. She, however, does not support Sheriff Gregory Tony. She spoke about working with other municipalities for safety services and her frustration with Sheriff Tony not adhering to the terms in the contract.

Commissioner Smith asked if there were plans to meet with Sheriff Tony. City Manager Rey said there was an attempt, and he is aware of municipalities meeting with BSO personnel, but not the Sheriff himself. Commissioner Smith asked City Manager Rey to meet with Sheriff Tony. He does not support prioritizing public safety. He asked City Manager Rey what options he is looking into as alternatives. City Manager Rey answered all options. Commissioner Smith asked if the major concern is no cap in the future. City Manager Rey answered yes. Commissioner Smith asked when recommendations would come forth. City Manager Rey said doing the legwork would take time. He will discuss the subject with the Public Safety Advisory Board.

Commissioner Katzman commended our law enforcement and fire personnel. There has been a lack of transparency, and it is unprofessional of the Sheriff not to show up to meetings involving contracted cities. He supports the City Manager looking into all options available.

Commissioner Shrouder said he plans on providing the best public safety possible. He is hoping that BSO can negotiate as we have in the past.

Mayor Curran said the residents have a high standard for public safety. He hopes BSO can negotiate with the City.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Smith welcomed Lieutenant Wagener to the City and thanked staff for their work during budget season.

Commissioner Mallozzi welcomed Lieutenant Wagener to the City and thanked staff for their work during budget season. She asked that the communications department advertise school safety measures and City codes regarding parking when the new school year starts.

Commissioner Katzman thanked staff for their hard work. He would like support for a resolution addressing the power surges caused by FPL. He asked that a copy of the resolution be forwarded to the Public Services Commission.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to draft and adopt a resolution notifying FPL of the power surges and resident issues. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Mayor Curran thanked staff.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to earmark overtime funds to enforce City codes within HOAs. He also asked that the "Painting with the Police" program be budgeted at \$20,000 for the upcoming year.

ADDITIONAL PUBLIC COMMENTS (3 MINUTES)

Optimist President Pete Schlang said the Optimist Club is currently rewriting it's Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. They are rebidding their insurance carrier and adding additional procedures. They are also working to standardize the sponsorship and banner program. He advised Commissioner Shrouder asked to view the club's bank statements, and there were rumors about Optimist Club staff members asking individuals not to register in the RecTrac software. City staff also requested to be alerted about any on-field incidents. Parks and Recreation Assistant Director Josh Rhodes spoke on an incident that occurred recently, and he was not informed. He asked to be notified moving forward.

Commissioner Shrouder stated the Optimist Club had concerns with the public records clause in the agreement. Language was added stating that all financial records are public record. He then asked for those records and was denied. He attended the Optimist Club monthly meeting, where he was given a budget and then accused of photographing the budget. He then witnessed Optimist Club members shredding the budget document he was given. Mr. Schlang stated that the budget is available in the meeting minutes. Commissioner Shrouder said the financial records are subject to Chapter 119 of the Florida Statutes.

Commissioner Mallozzi thanked the Optimist Club for the accomplishments of the past few months. She also had concerns with residents needing three forms of identification to register for sports, as it is causing difficulties with registration.

Commissioner Shrouder said the agreement states the Optimist Club's financial records are subject to public view. Mr. Schlang said he does not believe bank statements are public record.

Commissioner Shrouder asked City Attorney Horowitz if bank statements are public record via the contract language. City Attorney Horowitz answered yes, under the agreement, the bank statements are public record.

Commissioner Smith asked about the hurdles with RecTrac and asked Mr. Schlang to contact him. He explained that there have been issues recently with the Optimist Club and that is why clarification is needed by his colleague.

The meeting adjourned at 8:46 PM.
