


Environmental Scan

- Provide everyone involved in strategic planning with a shared understanding of the City's operating environment.
- Help City leaders successfully navigate the forces and obstacles that can hinder the achievement of a shared vision.






How likely are you to recommend Cooper City to someone who asks?






Demographics: Race and Ethnicity



Demographics: Age and Gender










City Revenues


City Expenditures






Impression of city employees based on most recent interaction:



Analysis of Stakeholder Input


- ▲ All individual stakeholder input and survey responses were compiled, analyzed, and counted by theme.




What do you foresee as Cooper City's biggest challenge over the next 5 years?









Being that a large portion of our residents are getting older, I would love to see a 55 and over community being built...The kind where we can purchase a villa or single family home.
















Confidence in Cooper City's Future

On a scale of 1-to-5, with 5 being the highest, how confident are you that Cooper City will be an even better place to live five years from now?






