MINUTES

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners Shrouder, Meltzer, Pulcini and Green and Mayor Ross.

CHANGES TO AGENDA/EMERGENCY MATTERS

March Yard of the Month was presented to Ms. Fina Di Salvo. Florida Nursery Mart provided a \$50 gift certificate.

PROCLAMATIONS/PRESENTATIONS

Mayor Ross read a Proclamation for the Mayor's Monarch Pledge.

PUBLIC SPEAKING

Open Public Meeting

Mark Hattabaugh, thanked the Commission for attending their event honoring holocaust survivors and spoke on Resolution 22-3.

Andrew Gross, 5010 Regency Isles Way, asked about the purchase of fire apparatuses.

Jennifer Gross, 5010 Regency Isles Way, spoke on Ordinance 22-2 and inquired on the potential ordinance change.

Lori Green, spoke on Forest Lake Dog Park and her concerns with the park being closed by someone other than City officials. City Manager Napoli responded he will increase physical surveillance and look into all options available to deter further instances.

Al Alvarez, 3001 Bogata Ave spoke on Ordinance 22-2 and access to gated communities that is untraceable.

Mike Carvelli, 10013 Chandler Dr, asked that Ordinance 22-2 be tabled as it is a security issue.

Robin Morganstine, 2990 W Budd Dr, spoke on Ordinance 22-2 and advised the gate access clickers currently in use cause several gate issues for the community.

David Nall, spoke on the City having access to communities for over 30 years and asked why concerns are now being brought to the Commission.

Brenda Kezar, advised she spoke to residents in Embassy Lakes that have no issue with the Commission having access to the community.

Danielle Wright with Next Gen Management spoke on concerns with traceability and knowing who is entering the communities.

Appointment to City Board Update

Commissioner Shrouder appointed Sam Hororwitz to the Recreation Advisory Board and Commissioner Pulcini appointed David Duda to the Senior Advisory Board.

Cooper City financial results through first quarter of FY 2022

CFO Aaron Kendrick spoke on the current results of the first quarter of FY 2022. The statements reflect where we should be with budget to actuals. Commissioner Meltzer asked about the sanitation fund and advised since we pay Waste Management based on billing, we need aging on that fund. Commissioner Meltzer would also like to know if transfers are due to cost allocation.

Commission Special Recognition Meeting minutes of January 25, 2022

Commissioner Shrouder pulled the minutes for correction.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to table the minutes for correction. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

REGULAR AGENDA

Motion to Approve Purchase of Articulating Boom Lift - Utilities

Commissioner Meltzer spoke on issues described by Utilities Director Mike Bailey about purchasing a new lift. He asked how often we rent the boom lift. Utilities Director Bailey answered every few weeks. He also spoke on costs for renting. Utilities Director Bailey spoke on concerns with renting during hurricane season.

Commissioner Shrouder has concerns with the purchase of used equipment. He believes the item should have data showing its value and it should have went through the procurement process if the item was budgeted.

Mayor Ross asked if there is a warranty. Utilities Director Bailey answered yes six months. He asked how much money we have spent the past year renting the lift.

Commissioner Meltzer asked if the renter of the boom lift we use now will give us a long term rental during hurricane season. Utilities Director Bailey did not inquire about long term rentals.

Commissioner Shrouder said the item should be bid out.

Commissioner Green asked if the purchase meets his requirements in order for his team to utilize it. Utilities Director Bailey answered the lift will satisfy the needs of the department.

Commissioner Shrouder asked about specifics with the purchase.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve Purchase of Articulating Boom Lift. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote.

NO: Commissioner Shrouder

YES: Commissioner Meltzer, Pulcini, Green and Mayor Ross

Motion to Approve Engineering Proposal For Replacement of Electrical Generator at Sewer Pump Station #55 – Utilities

Commissioner Shrouder said the item was not budgeted and would require a budget amendment. He also advised the item should have been listed more accurately on the agenda report.

Commissioner Meltzer asked that a checklist for procured items be adopted.

Commissioner Green asked Director Bailey if he knew this item would need to be replaced. Director Bailey advised the generator is not performing and the station was listed to be updated in FY 2024 or 2025.

Commissioner Pulcini advised based the opinion we received today this item would require a budget amendment and asked City Attorney Horowitz if the Commission can approve the item or if an emergency clause can be exercised. City Attorney Horowitz answered if the item is an emergency it can be approved and then included in a budget amendment.

Commissioner Shrouder said he would approve the item as an emergency purchase but wants to assure documentation is completed to that degree.

Utilities Director Bailey does not trust the generator to last.

Mayor Ross asked how long the proposal will take from Chen Moore. Utilities Director Bailey answered three months. Mayor Ross asked about the bid for construction work.

The item was approved as an emergency purpose.

MOTION: Commissioner Green moved to approve Engineering Proposal For Replacement of Electrical Generator at Sewer Pump Station #55. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (5-0)

Presentation Regarding Stormwater Utility Rates and Billing – Utilities

Utilities Director Mike Bailey explained Rafatelis performed a storm water rate study for the City and the recommendation was to revise the rate structure to consider the impervious areas of the city. They also recommended changing the billing to collecting fees on the tax bills.

Thierry Bovieri and Matt Ori from Raftelis spoke on the study. Mr. Bovieri spoke on benefits of a nonad valorem assessment including facilitating billing commercial properties and helping cost recovery associated with impervious areas. Mayor Ross asked the effect of changing to the non-ad valorem assessment would have on places of worship. Mr. Bovieri answered he would need to look into the billing system.

Commissioner Meltzer asked if we can continue to bill nonprofits on the water bill if we move to billing via the tax bill. City Attorney Horowitz answered yes. Mr. Bovieri advised there is a three tiered level class for residential properties.

Discussion ensued on impervious calculations.

Commissioner Meltzer asked about the early pay discount associated with Broward County.

Commissioner Shrouder asked what our current collection rate is. He also spoke on issues with leases and exemptions that could create a loss to the City.

Mayor Ross asked the criteria for the three tired system.

Commissioner Shrouder asked how impervious areas are calculated for residential.

Mr. Bovieri explained the lots were split by parcel size.

Commissioner Shrouder advised a GIS system cannot look at impervious areas.

Community Development Director Carlos Vega spoke on pavers with regard to impervious areas.

Commissioner Shrouder said we can bill directly and collect on the water bills.

Mr. Bovieri mentioned the commercial classes would see a reduction of 5% as a whole with a change.

City Manager Napoli advised this is the Commission's decision.

Commissioner Green asked City Attorney Horowitz if they moved toward adopting the non-ad valorem assessment does it mean we must use it. City Attorney Horowitz answered it can leave the option on the table.

Mayor Ross asked how long the study took and also had concerns with the lack of answers to questions he had.

Mr. Bovieri spoke on pros of the non-ad valorem assessment method of billing. Mayor Ross had concern with the discount applied for paying the tax bill early.

Utilities Director Mike Bailey advised the customer may pay more and also there is a fee to the have the County collect. Mayor Ross asked if there is a down side to approving this tonight. Utility Director Bailey answered there is a tight timeline and costs associated if this approved.

Discussion on Community Sponsorship at City Facilities – Commissioner Pulcini

Commissioner Pulcini spoke on a program that residents can purchase bricks within a sign similar to the City of Plantation.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to see some renderings.

Commissioner Pulcini said we can include the community if there is an artist within the City who has ideas.

Direction was given to the City Manager to look into renderings for monument signs.

Discussion on Tenant Application, Change of Occupancy & Termination or Transfer of Utility Services (Code Sections 19-74 and 19-84) – Commissioner Pulcini

Commissioner Pulcini advised the code states utility transfers can be done via telephone but that is not the process utilized. He also advised properties who have water accounts in the tenants name cannot be liened.

Commissioner Shrouder stated we can require the landlord to sign with the renter.

Commissioner Green asked if the owners sign along with the renters. City Manager Napoli answered no. He suggested increasing the dollar amount of the deposit to collect fees left unpaid.

Commissioner Pulcini asked if we can have a running deposit based on consumption.

Mayor Ross asked the process on failure of payment. City Attorney Horowitz spoke on the code that states a 25 day turn off period after nonpayment.

Commissioner Meltzer stated we have two options an increase in a deposit or having owners sign along with tenants. He would like to see aging of the accounts to make a decision.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested having both options available.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to see the aging and collection on tenants and owners.

Commissioner Meltzer would like to see how much money has been written off as uncollectable the past three years.

Mayor Ross asked to see how many people have been sent shutoff letters.

City Attorney Horowitz advised the code in its entirely needs to be updated.

Commissioner Shrouder would like water turn-ons to be done online.

Discussion on EMS Collections – Commissioner Pulcini

Commissioner Pulcini would like to see if the cities vendor can determine an individual is a resident and if so not send them to collections.

Commissioner Meltzer had concerns with an uptake of calls due to no collection.

CFO Aaron Kendrick advised the aging schedule is done by an outside vendor.

Commissioner Pulcini would also like to request the Commission to approve the write off.

CFO Kendrick advised the collection rate is 94% and 6% for items 180 days delinquent or older with regard to utility accounts.

Discussion ensued on write offs.

Commissioner Pulcini spoke on the current write off policy.

Commissioner Shrouder asked how he can access administrative policy. City Manager Napoli will give him the access.

Commissioner Pulcini would like the third party company to distinguish between residents and non-residents and not send residents to collections.

Commissioner Green stated if someone is paying for transport they need to pay for the service.

Mayor Ross asked who we charge for the lift assist the individual or the institution.

Commissioner Pulcini asked for data to show if there is a difference due after insurance costs.

City Manager Napoli will gather the requested information.

Discussion on liens that are certified against property - Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder asked if we are foreclosing on liens. He advised the statue states you cannot foreclose a lien on homestead property but homestead property is capped at a half acre.

City Attorney Horowitz would like to look into foreclosing properties larger than a half-acre.

Direction was given to the City Attorney to look into options.

Discussion on Road Repairs in Royal Palm Ranches - Commissioner Shrouder

Commissioner Shrouder advised the roads in the Royal Palm Ranches community need repairs.

Commissioner Meltzer asked if there are standards the community can be held to with regard to having the roads up to date.

Commissioner Shrouder said the roads needs to be fixed and asked a timeline of an assessment.

Mayor Ross advised we should let the community know of the need for road updates.

City Manager Napoli advised the City cannot fix the roads because they do not belong to the City.

Commissioner Meltzer instructed there is portion that is the City's property.

Mayor Ross asked City Manager Napoli what the Town of Davie does in this instance. City Manager Napoli does not have that information.

City Manager Napoli advised we need to have an estimate for the roads and develop a schedule for an assessment. He suggested determining costs before having a workshop.

City Attorney Horowitz will follow up on which roads are City roads compared to roads owned by the residents.

REGULAR RESOLUTIONS

Resolution 22-3 (Utilities)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, SETTING FORTH THE CITY'S INTENT TO USE THE UNIFORM METHOD FOR THE COLLECTION OF A NON-AD VALOREM SPECIAL ASSESSMENT TO BE LEVIED UPON REAL PROPERTIES LYING WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY, AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A," ATTACHED HERETO, TO FUND ENHANCEMENTS, IMPROVEMENTS, ADDITIONS TO, AND MAINTENANCE OF, THE CITY'S STORMWATER UTILITY SYSTEM; STATING A NEED FOR SUCH LEVY; PROVIDING THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE FORWARDED TO THE PROPERTY APPRAISER, TAX COLLECTOR, AND THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Mayor Ross asked Utilities Director Bailey if he had time to gather the information requested. Director Bailey answered no.

Mayor Ross opened the Public Hearing.

Mark Hattabaugh, 5201 S Flamingo Road spoke on his concerns with Resolution 22-3.

Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Meltzer confirmed this is strictly a vote of intent.

Director Bailey advised of an approximate cost of \$30,000 if the City moves forward.

MOTION: Commissioner Pulicini moved to approve Resolution 22-3. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which failed by the following roll call vote (3-2)

NO: Commissioners Shrouder, Pulcini, and Green

YES: Commissioner Meltzer and Mayor Ross

Resolution 22-4 (Administration)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE THIRD AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT FOR POLICE SERVICES BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF COOPER CITY AND GREGORY TONY, AS SHERIFF OF BROWARD COUNTY, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A" AND INCORPORATED HEREIN; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE ANY AND ALL ACTION NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder supports the traffic deputy and recommends the approval of two deputies due to traffic issues in the City.

Captain De Giovanni advised the amendment is helpful and he will use all resources provided to him by the City.

Commissioner Shrouder said traffic issues are a main issue in the City and are on the rise.

City Manager Napoli would like to look into other means and financial needs with regard to approving two deputies.

Commissioner Green will not be supporting the resolution not that it's not needed but he is looking at the affects after the ARPA funds are diminished.

Commissioner Meltzer asked what the deputy will do. Captain De Giovanni advised the deputy will be assigned strictly to traffic. Commissioner Meltzer asked if the last time a traffic deputy was added did the City see a measurable difference with traffic. Captain De Giovanni advised of the benefit for school traffic. Commissioner Meltzer asked if the money would be better spent enhancing technology as adding the deputy will be a cost for the City after ARPA funds run out. Captain De Giovanni advised the City has the ability at any time to amend the agreement if needed and the traffic enforcement aspect requires a deputy. Commissioner Meltzer asked how the Captain will obtain data to see the impacts of the additional Deputy. Captain answered they are monitoring and collecting data from speed signs and they determine the best resources for the identified issue.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 22-4. Commissioner Pulcini seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote (4-1)

YES: Commissioner Shrouder, Meltzer, Pulcini and Mayor Ross.

NO: Commissioner Green

ORDINANCES ON FIRST READING

Ordinance 22-2 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 25, ARTICLE VI OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "ROADS AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 25-87, ENTITLED "PRIVATE STREETS;" PROVIDING FOR CITY VEHICULAR ACCESS TO GATED COMMUNITIES AND GATED COMMERCIAL PROPERTIES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Shrouder explained the origin of the proposed revision. On September 13, 2021 there was a call to Darlington Park for a house fire and the City owned clickers did not work to open the gates. The transmitter at Darlington Park was not working. He explained a gate technician at Darlington contacted him to gain a contact to access the range of transmitter codes. Throughout the process he learned pursuant to the code on file we do not have authority to mandate that the current clicker option be used in lieu of access codes maintained by different points of contacts. The revisions he made where the requirements of the accessibility systems. The revisions to section I were recommendations by staff. This revision mandates a uniformed system that the City can use to require communities to follow so separate codes are not needed. Every community has the system already it's the matter of them falling out of sync. He then read a bulletin released by the Embassy Lakes Masters Homeowners Association advising the City was considering an Ordinance to allow all employees and officials to have access to all gated communities which is incorrect. The proposed revision does not affect Embassy Lakes as they are already compliant with the revisions and the Ordinance does not call for any additional access. There is also information posted about the clickers owned by city staff opening garage doors.

City Manager Napoli is not aware of clickers opening garage doors.

Commissioner Green said when was elected in 2010 the City Manager at that time never advised him of clickers nor has the current City Manager. He never had a clicker to access any private gated community.

Commissioner Shrouder clarified the amendments to section I were made by staff and city staff has had the legal access to enter communities for 30 years.

Commissioner Green advised he enters private communities by calling ahead or speaking to security at the gates.

Commissioner Shrouder advised the information released by Embassy Lakes is incorrect.

Captain De Giovanni advised no clickers his staff has have opened garage doors.

Commissioner Meltzer advised he was emailed on February 22, 2022 stating gate opening clickers will be given to all city staff.

City Manager Napoli advised that is not correct. City Manager Napoli explained at an unmanned gate staff has a code to enter. He also advised there are 10 clickers belonging to the City.

Commissioner Green does not recall the item of clickers coming to the Commission.

Commissioner Shrouder clarified that in 2018 when the City's previous Attorney's Office wrote a legal opinion about the Commission having clickers he was not on the Commission. He asked City Attorney Horowitz if the proposed Ordinance grants City Commission more access than what they currently have. City Attorney Horowitz answered no. He spoke on the inaccurate information Embassy Lakes has been posting.

Commissioner Meltzer said he was given a clicker by the previous acting City Manager without asking for one to be provided and it has sat unused.

Commissioner Green spoke on the legal opinion of the current City Attorney's Office.

Commissioner Shrouder has concerns with Embassy Lakes releasing information and not allowing comments on the information released. He also advised he added this amendment to the Code after discussion with the Captain revealed he did not believe he could force the associations whose emergency systems were not working to comply with a system in place with the City. Captain De Giovanni gave a recommendation to include an enforcement aspect in the Ordinance. Commissioner Shrouder advised this ordinance update will not affect Embassy Lakes.

Commissioner Green asked City Attorney Horowitz about the memo issued in 2020. City Attorney Horowitz advised the memo was released at the request of the City Manager in response to inquiries about access to gated communities through clickers.

Commissioner Green asked if we do not pass this revision will police and fire not have access to gated communities.

Commissioner Shrouder asked the Captain if the revision is not passed will police and fire have to continue to maintain separate lists to access communities.

Captain De Giovanni answered if the revision to the code is not passed he will continue to have access to communities through two modes, the gate clicker and the gate codes.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if this change allows him to have access via one system. Captain De Giovanni advised this propped change would streamline the process.

Commissioner Shrouder asked Public Works Director Tom Good if in any other cities he worked with he is familiar with access to communities via clickers or if clickers open garages. Public Works Director Tom Good advised he is not familiar with clickers and access.

Commissioner Shrouder asked why the Captain had to help Darlington Park set up their system. Captain De Giovanni advised there are two modes. PD maintains separate gate codes and clickers are obtain through the fire marshal.

Commissioner Shrouder asked who gives the association a range of transmittal codes to program clickers. City Manager Napoli advised the Fire Marshal has assisted the City when needed. Commissioner Shrouder advised the issue of centralizing the process is the reason behind the ordinance update. City Attorney Horowitz advised other cities have the same requirements stated in the ordinance. Commissioner Shrouder said the information put out by Embassy Lakes is not accurate.

Commissioner Meltzer advised he hopes the misinformation that was transmitted to the public has now been laid to rest. He received a phone call from a board member and he explained the process. He advised he is available to speak to all board members.

Commissioner Shrouder advised he tried to speak to management and his call was not returned. He asked that a letter be sent to the residents of Embassy Lakes to let them know that the information released was not accurate.

Commissioner Meltzer asked about vendor policy if they need access to a community..

Mayor Ross asked how meter readers enter community. City Manager Napoli advised they have access codes or they advised the security guard.

Mayor Ross advised that if an individual can be linked to a clicker that would solve the issue of knowing who is entering the community. He also advised having staff wait in lines is not efficient. He understands that the community wants to know who accesses the community. He recommended having security recognize vehicles and take note or having a mechanism within the clicker to detail who it belongs to. He also spoke on emergency circumstances to enter the community by the commission and also the pros of having access to the community for improvements.

Commissioner Shrouder advised the enforcement mechanism is not defined in the ordinance.

Commissioner Green asked City Attorney Horowitz about the language written in the attorney's opinion with regard to police entering the community. City Attorney Horowitz explained enforcing the code with the HOA in adhering to the code.

Commissioner Meltzer wants to clarify that vendors will not have gate codes and all city employees will not have clickers.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 22-2. Commissioner Meltzer seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote (4-1)

YES: Commissioner Shrouder, Meltzer, Pulcini and Mayor Ross.

NO: Commissioner Green

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Napoli advised Utilities Director Bailey has gathered information with relation to the boom lift.

Utilities Director Mike Bailey advised rental rates are about \$1200 a day. During hurricane season the lift is used to place shutters

Commissioner Shrouder asked if the city has a bucket truck. City Manager Napoli advised the City has a old bucket truck. Commissioner Shrouder spoke on alternative solutions for placing shutters while information is gathered on a boom lift.

The vote was then called for the purchase of the boom lift.

City Manager Napoli advised applications for ARPA assistance is open. The CDBG timeline was received with a tight turnaround time of the end of March. He has spoken to Captain De Giovanni with regard to traffic control at Cooper City Elementary and will bring the Commission potential solutions. He also advised a monitoring device will be installed at the Dog Park and patrol will be increased.

Commissioner Shrouder advised he received his budget book but wants to budget by position as asked for previously on August 10, 2021. City Manager Napoli advised at the meeting staff would provide a list of all positions that encompass the total salary. Commissioner Shrouder said the commission asked for line items. City Manager Napoli advised line items for salary would in return have the Commision approving salaries.

Commissioner Meltzer believed a breakdown would be provided.

Commissioner Pulcini said when looking at budget versus actuals for last year nearly every department has saved money in wages. He asked for details on where savings arose from. City Manager Napoli said if positions are budgeted by line the Commission will determine salaries. He advised they agreed to a have a list of positions showing the overall total.

Commissioner Shrouder wants to budget by position. City Manager Napoli advised the Commission approves a pay scale.

Commissioner Meltzer asked that the minutes be reviewed from the meeting in question.

Mayor Ross asked that we be clear on what was asked.

Commissioner Shrouder inquired about the piggyback contract for fire apparatuses. City Manager Napoli advised he will provide the contract. Commissioner Shrouder also advised that the pool resurfacing item from a previous agenda advised the pool had not been resurfaced in 17 years which was inaccurate information. City Manager Napoli read an email that was sent to the Commission. The pool was last resurfaced in 2014 this information was overlooked as the staff that was involved in the current resurfacing project was not employed at the time. No warrantys are active. The pool still does need resurfaced to meet building code requirements.

Commissioner Pulcini advised the staff working on the item did not have historical knowledge and it was a mistake by staff. He does not believe it was purposeful.

Commissioner Shrouder stated he does not believe the mistake was purposeful but wants to make sure the Commission is being very cognizant of procurement issues.

Commissioner Meltzer believed record retention is a key priority and it's the Commissions job to override the procurement process if they chose.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Horowitz requested a shade session to discuss pension allegations. He also spoke on an opinion received from the Attorneys Generals office regarding fund transfers and budget amendments. The City Attorney's Office is reviewing the opinion.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

Captain De Giovanni updated the commission on the latest traffic enforcement operation under the base grant was very successful with 37 citations written with the majority written due to excessive speeding. Speeding operations will continue with message Boards and speed trailers. The Commercial plaza imitative is ongoing with two plazas appearing at the next special magistrate hearing. Captain De Giovanni spoke on the incident that occurred on February 20, 2022 and his team has reached out to regional partners to assure the crime is solved and will not occur again. A photo of the suspects' vehicle has been released and he encourages anyone who has knowledge to contact crime stoppers to assure justice. Captain De Giovanni assured the public that the steps taken by the commission and the City Manager of the deployment of LPR's and a real time crime center will be assist in preventing these incidents. The Cooper City High School and was a great event. He also advised the Chip-A-Pet program registration is full but they are looking to host another event before the end of year. There are currently two vacancies. A CSA vacancies and a code inspector.

Mayor Ross asked out of the 37 citations written how many where Cooper City residents. Captain De Giovanni will gather the information requested.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if another motorcycle situation arises does his team have a plan. Captain De Giovanni advised yes by including other regional offices. DLE BSO command advised they stand ready to assist with resources in the future.

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Green thanked Mike Cobelo for the State of the City presentation and apologized for his absence.

Commissioner Pulcini thanked Assistant Finance Director Natasha Mazzie for her service to the City as she moves on in her career.

Commissioner Meltzer thanked Mike Cobelo for the state of the City video presentation. He thanked Recreation, Public Works and BSO for the Senior Expo as the event was a huge success.

Commissioner Shrouder echoed Commissioner Pulcini's remarks on Assistant Finance Director Natasha Mazzie. He asked for commission consensus for a letter to be sent to Embassy Lakes clearing up misinformation.

Mayor Ross thanked Assistant Finance Director Natasha Mazzie and former IT Manger Daryl Mcfarlane.

ADDITIONAL PUBLIC COMMENTS (2 MINUTES)

Robin Morganstine, 2990 W Budd Dr, said the access that he commission has now should not have been granted as it is for emergencies only. The issue at hand is that the commission is not emergency responders. She advised the clickers override the tailgate system and does not log who enters the community. She also had issue with the item being published on the agenda on Friday afternoon.

City Manager Napoli advised the item was submitted by Commissioner Shrouder last Tuesday at 7:30 PM. The item required backup and information gathering and it was placed on the agenda soon thereafter.

Lori Green apologized for speaking out of turn earlier. She explained the issue was the language of the proposed code change. They needed the time to discuss with their gate operator who advised the current gate clickers have the ability to open older garage door systems. The other issue is that the clickers are cannot be detected.

James Curran advised that all individuals should be recorded when entering the community.

Commissioner Shrouder asked the Embassy Lakes Association contact the City before transmitting information.

Commissioner Pulcini asked if the current gate clickers do in fact open doors.

Mike Carvelli, advised there are no means to track the current clicker devices. Embassy Lakes clickers are activated through a database. The technology is not available to track the City's clickers.

Commissioner Shrouder advised the system that will be used has not been chosen yet. Commissioner Shrouder asked that Embassy provide input on what system works best for the community.

Ana an Embassy Lakes resident has concern with the clickers not being traceable. She also spoke on a utility issue she had and did not have the commissioners respond.

Al Alvarez asked why the City can't use clickers that are traceable. He welcomes the commission to come in announced. He asked if code enforcement has clickers.

Commissioner Shrouder advised that he did try to enter Embassy in a city vehicle before and was denied.

Commissioner Green apologized and said he does recall a clicker being available to him and he did not accept one.

Commissioner Meltzer said the underline issue is that the commission has unlimited access without detection. He asked that his name be placed on the HOA's list so he can enter. He then returned his clicker to Mr. Napoli.

Ms. Wright from Next Gen Management clarified that Darlington Park was struck by lightning and damaged the transmitter. There were two fail safe mechanisms in place for Fire and Police. Gate codes and keys are on sight to bypass the gates. She also stated that the Town of Davie passed familiar requirements that cost \$5000 to 10,000 to comply with the system chosen by the Town. She asked that costs occurred by the HOA's be taken into account.

Jennifer Gross clarified the County Glen Board of Directors was unaware of access by the Commission. She has concerns with the Commission entering the community without knowledge.

Commissioner Shrouder advised city access is already codified in the Code.
