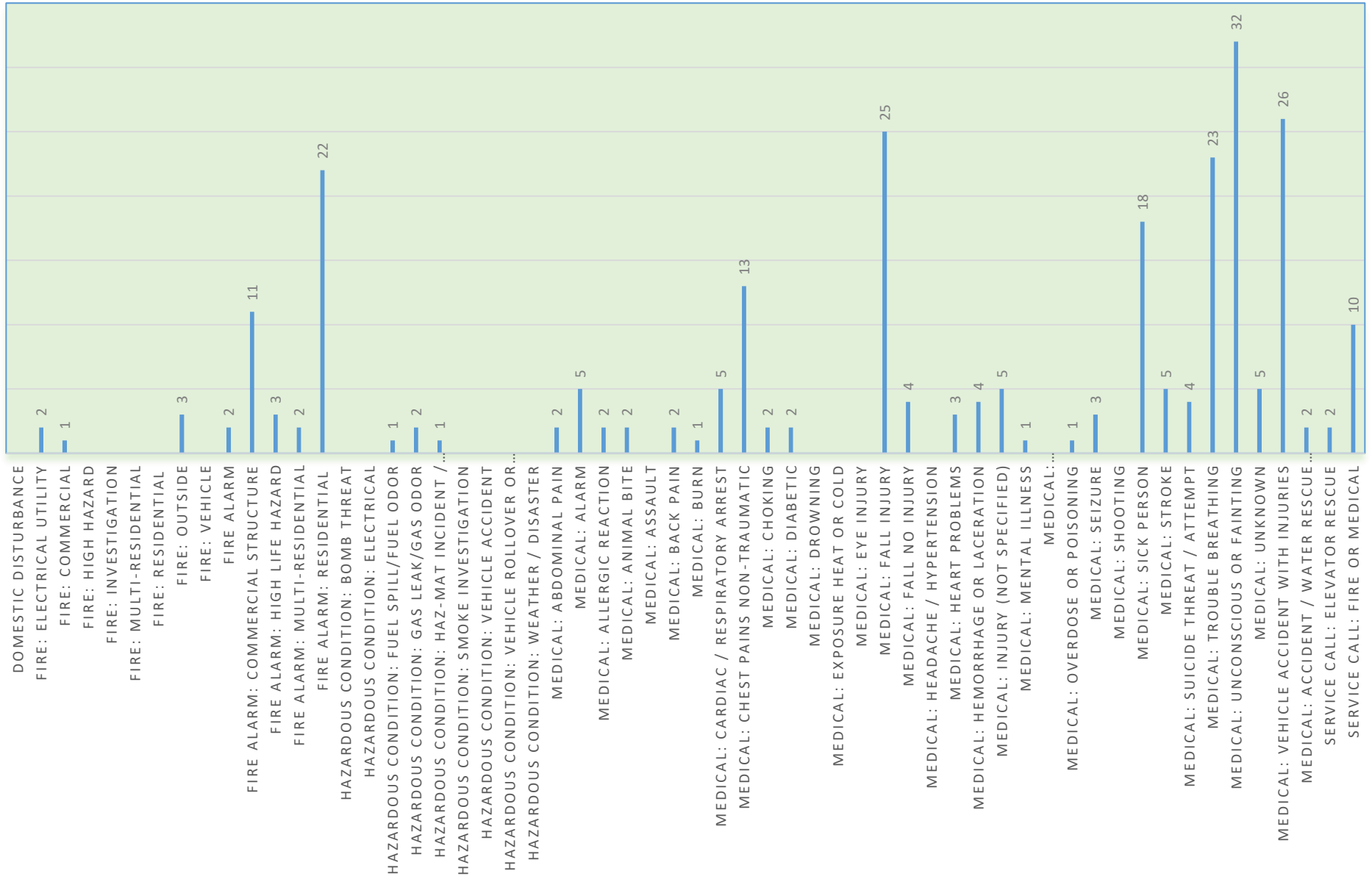

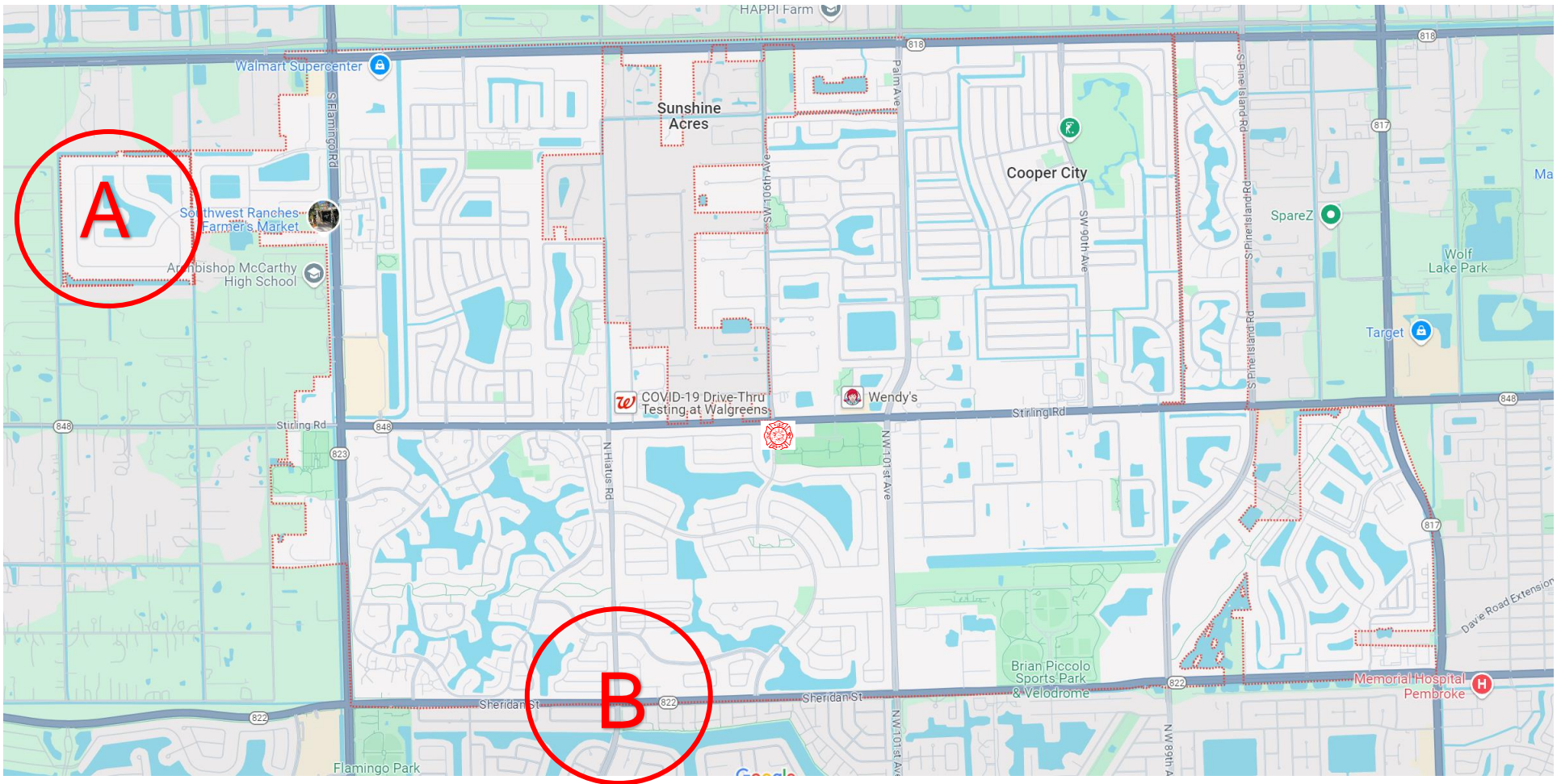
V. COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT
