The following is the Fire Chief's report for the upcoming commission meeting. The report highlights information pertinent to the city's main public safety concerns: Fire Rescue Incidents, Fire Apparatus / Station concerns, Fire Prevention, Community Outreach, and CERT.

The longest emergent response was 13 minutes and 11 seconds which occurred due to a minor mechanical issue that was addressed, and undisclosed temporary road closure. There were three (3) other outliers with delay of 9:26, 9:34 and 11:51, all of which were due to distance and traffic.

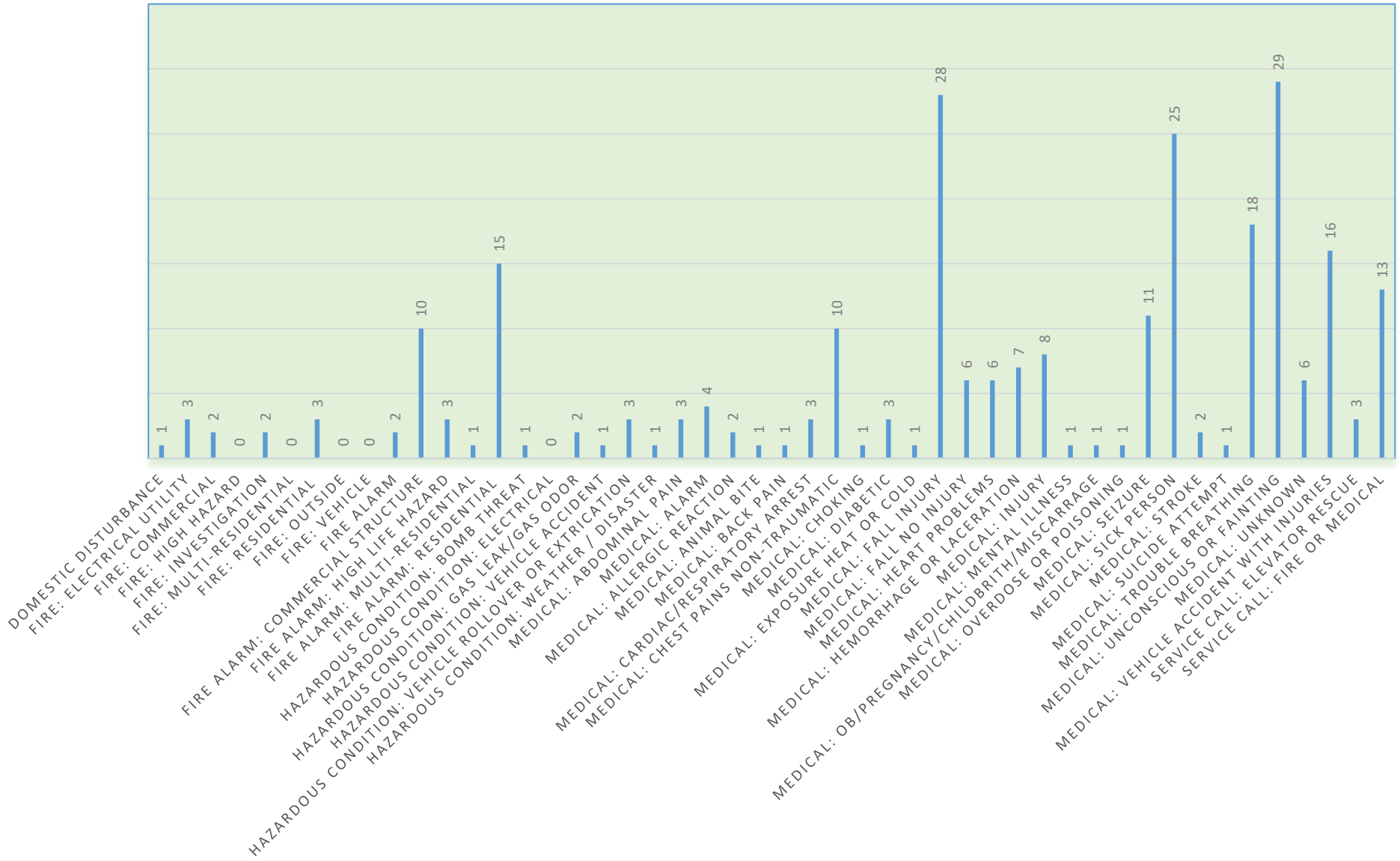
IV. COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT

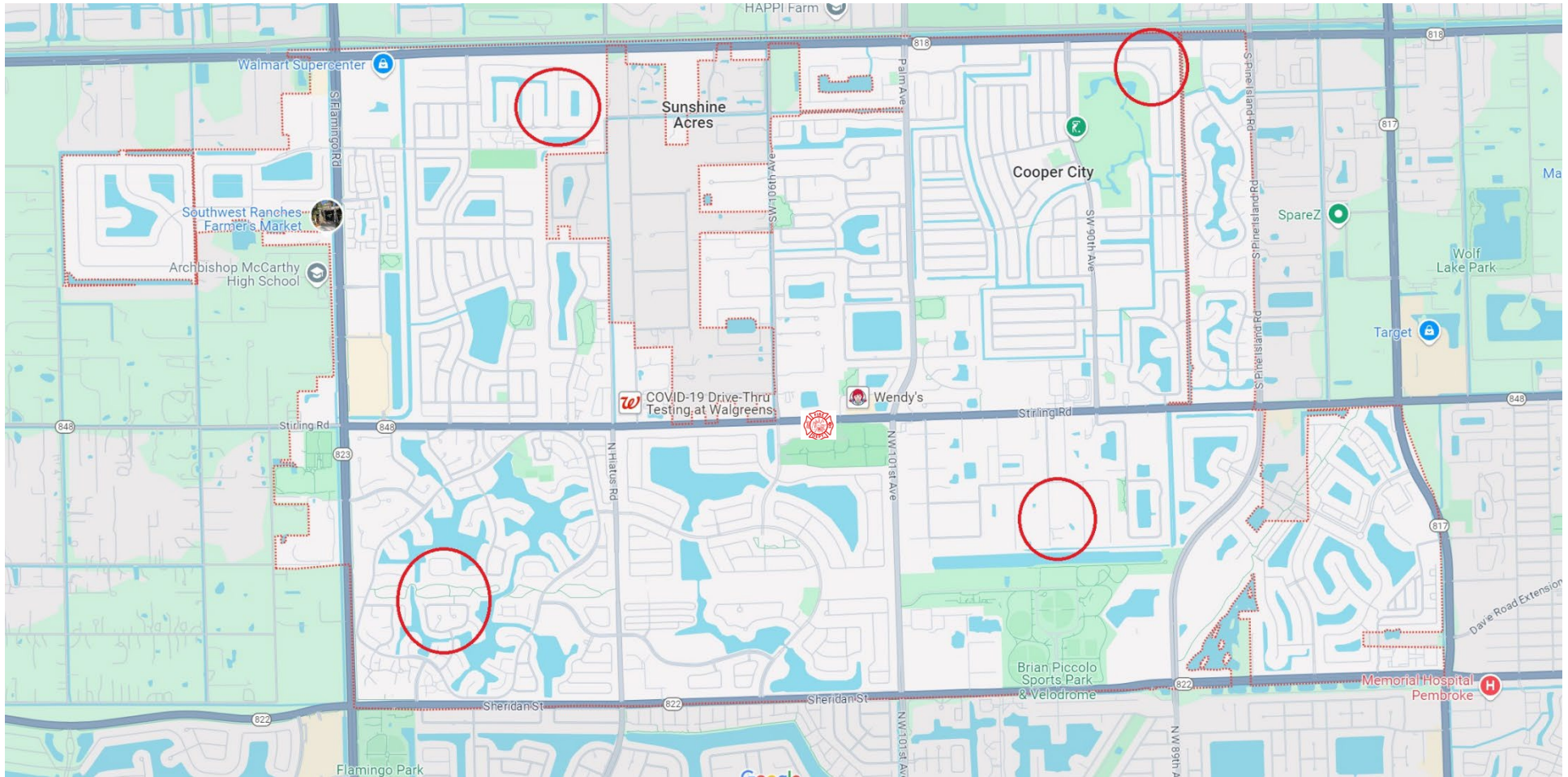
FIRE HYDRANT DESIGN UPDATE:
