WHEREAS, every resident of Cooper City can make a difference for the monarch by planting native milkweed and nectar plants to provide habitat for the monarch and pollinators in locations where people live, work, learn, play and worship; and

Now, Therefore, I, Greg Ross, Mayor of the City of Cooper City, Florida, and the City Commission, do hereby honor the National Wildlife Federation's Mayors' Monarch Pledge; and I encourage other city officials across our great nation to take a stand with me so that the monarch butterfly will once again flourish across the continent.
