- The new Rescue truck is getting ready to paint the chassis. I have been presented with a few designs and color schemes. Production dates have not been provided by the manufacturer at this time.
- The electronic lock will be a magnet lock with a code pad for the main entrance at station 28. Facilities will be addressing its completion.
- Fire Hydrant flushing has started and will continue for the next several months until complete.
