Subject: Fire Chief's Report – Commission Meeting August 27, 2024

The following is the Fire Chief's report for the upcoming commission meeting. The information will follow the same format of prior reports and highlights information pertinent to the city's main public safety concerns: Fire Rescue Incidents, Fire Apparatus / Station concerns, Fire Prevention, Community Outreach, and CERT.

This month reflects the fastest unit response of 8 seconds, which was a walk-in to the fire station for a medical emergency. The next fastest response was 24 seconds in which the apparatus was near the location of a vehicle accident. The longest response time was 12 minutes 5 seconds. This medical incident was a Code 3 response by R228 from Fire Station 28 to the 3400 block of 83rd way. The extended response time was due to the time of day (rush hour), security gates, and distance to the incident location.

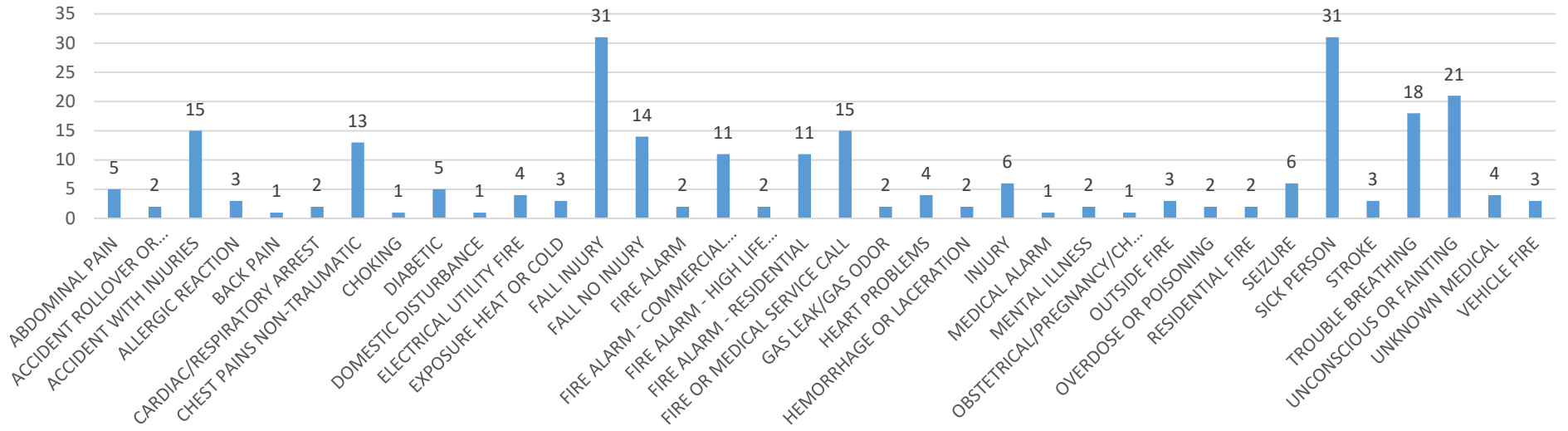
VI. Community Outreach Report

- July 29, 2024, the crew of Engine 28 conducted a fire safety presentation at Potential Christian Academy. Sixty children participated in the presentation as well as a show and tell truck tour with explanations about the firefighters' job. 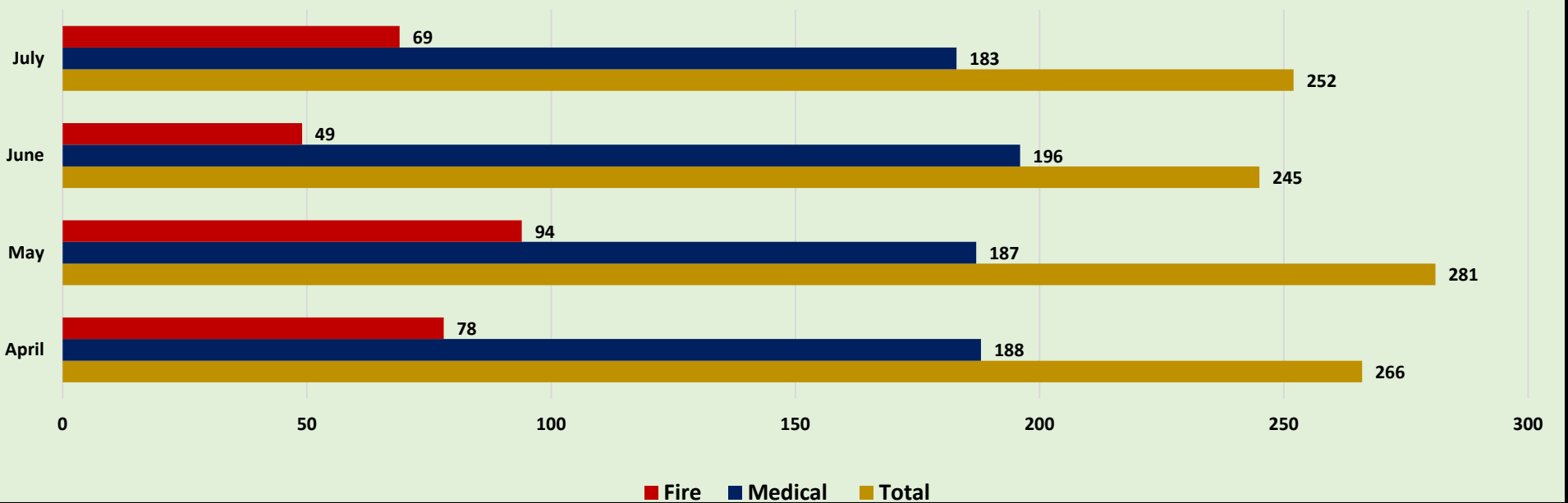
FIRE HYDRANT DESIGN UPDATE:

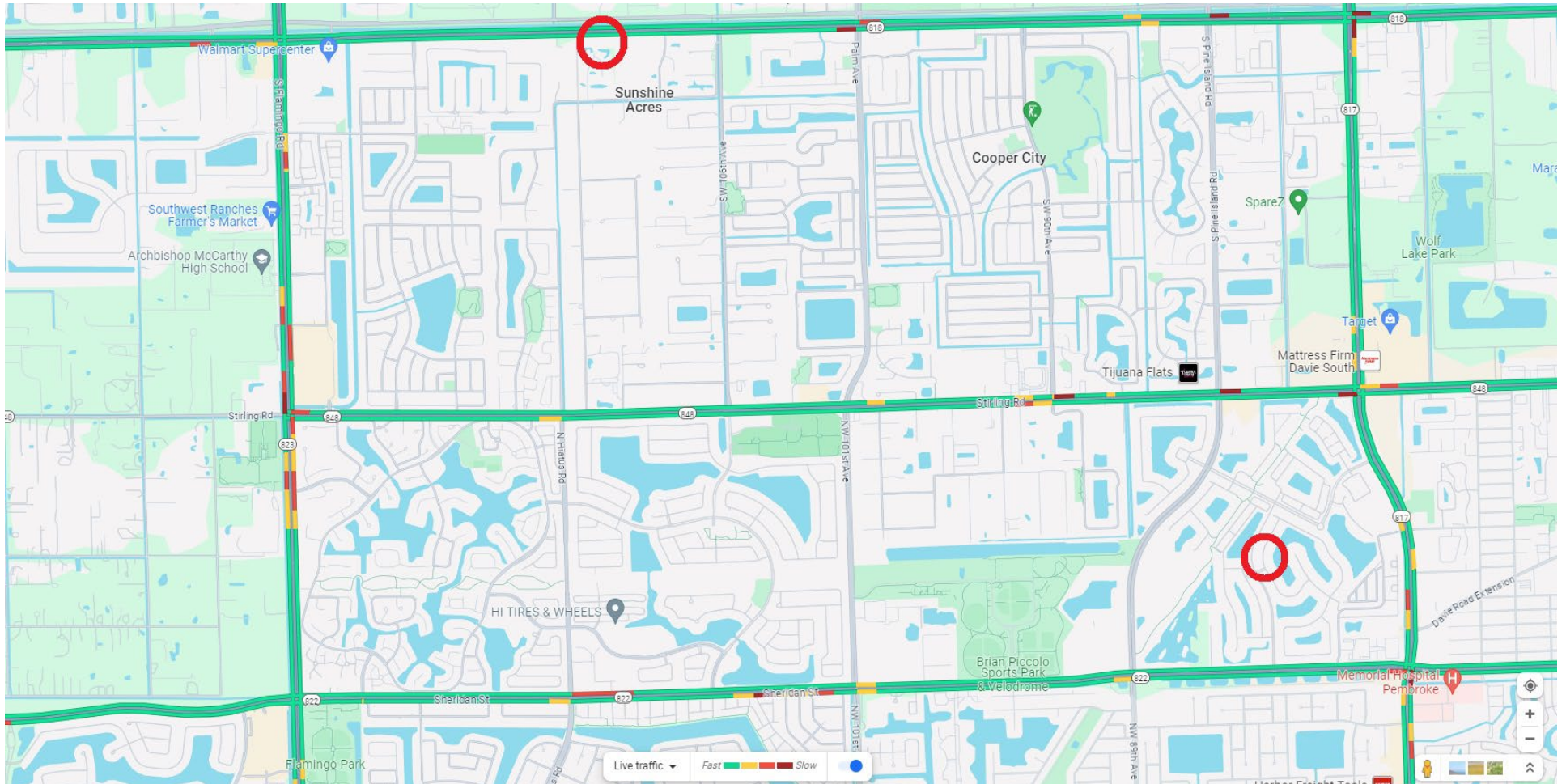
Fire and Rescue Incidents - July 2024
