MINUTES

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE -

Mayor Ross opened the meeting at 6:30 PM and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Present were Commissioners, Katzman, Shrouder and Green. Commissioner Mallozzi was absent.

DECORUM - Jacob Horowitz, City Attorney

City Attorney Horowitz read the decorum policy as follows: Members of the Commission, staff members, citizens, and others are required to use civil and appropriate language when addressing the Commission or anyone present at the meeting and must refrain from using profanity, cursing, or exhibiting aggressive or threatening behavior. All comments should generally be directed to the presiding officer and not to individual members of the Commission, staff, or the audience. No personal verbal attacks toward any individual by either the Commission, staff, citizens, or others shall be allowed during any meeting of the Commission. Any persons making impertinent or slanderous remarks or personal attacks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Commission or who otherwise violates the decorum rules set forth herein shall be barred from further audience before the Commission by the Mayor, or by request of any member of the Commission unless permission to continue or again address the Commission be granted by a majority vote of the Commission members present.

CHANGES TO AGENDA/EMERGENCY MATTERS

City Manager Rey advised there were no changes or emergency matters.

Commissioner Shrouder asked that items 18 through 24 be added to the consent agenda.

PROCLAMATIONS/PRESENTATIONS

1. Proclamation - K9 Macie - Mayor Ross

A proclamation was presented to Deputy Covet honoring K9 Macie.

BSO staff also presented Deputy Covet with a plaque honoring K9 Macie.

Captain De Giovanni thanked the Commission for honoring K9 Macie and having a great relationship with the Broward Sheriff's Office supporting the K9 program.

2. Pet Adoption - Commissioner Mallozzi

Commissioner Green advised Shuggie a 4-year-old dog and Yang a 14-week-old kitten are available for adoption by contacting the Humane Society of Broward County at <u>www.humanebroward.com</u> or 954-989-3977 Ext 6.

3. Garth Communications Presentation – **Communications**

Yvonne Garth, President of Garth Solutions was present.

City Manager Alex Rey advised he had a conversation with Garth Solutions and understands the expectations from the Commission with regard to the communication program that have not been fulfilled. He believes errors occur due to lack of strategy. He would like to hold a workshop for the Commission facilitated by Garth Solutions to develop communication strategies. Ms. Garth said it has been a privilege to serve as the City's communication consultant. She would like the Commission to support the idea of the workshop to develop a communication strategy and implementation ideas.

Commissioner Katzman asked when the workshop will be scheduled. City Manager Rey said staff will coordinate and schedule the meeting soon.

PUBLIC SPEAKING

Open Public Meeting/Agenda Concerns

Randy Grice, Assistant Public Information Officer with Broward County Animal Care invited the residents to the Summer Bash Adoption event on Saturday, July 27 at 11:00 AM located at Broward County Animal Care, 2400 SW 42 Street in Fort Lauderdale.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if Broward County Animal Care is accepting stray dogs. Mr. Grice advised they are having capacity issues and that is why they are hosting adoption events.

Alexandra Fox from Franklin Academy spoke on the new traffic plan using the park and advised they are preparing for the new school year.

LAND DEVELOPMENT MATTERS

(Florida court rulings now require all land development matters to be considered by the City Commission in a quasi-judicial process. All persons who wish to give testimony or present evidence must be sworn in. Copies of the complete procedures are available in the Office of the City Clerk).

Ordinances On First Reading

4. Ordinance 24-18 (Community Development)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 25 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED, "DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING ARTICLE I, SECTION 25-5, ENTITLED "DESIGN OF OFF-STREET PARKING;" REDUCING THE REQUIRED WIDTH DIMENSIONS FOR A PARKING SPOT IN A RESIDENTIAL DRIVEWAY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Katzman would like to hear the presentation from staff.

Community Development Director Carlos Vega advised this ordinance change stemmed from discussions from a driveway variance petition which required a driveway to be 12x20. The ordinance change was brought forth to the Planning and Zoning Board in an attempt to clean up the code and be consistent with the commercial standards of 9x18. The Planning and Zoning Board did not recommend the change.

Commissioner Shrouder asked the current driveway requirement. Director Vega answered 12 by 20. The recommended code change would be 9 by 18. The change will still accommodate three parking spaces.

Mayor Ross asked if the City receives a lot of variance requests due to this requirement. Director Vega answered yes, they are receiving variance requests.

Commissioner Katzman said his only concern is this may cause more street parking. Director Vega explained this is just a minimum standard. The driveway can still be widened up to 24 feet.

City Manager Rey said this will allow two cars to be parked in the driveway legally.

Director Vega said we are establishing the minimum standards for our residential driveways. It's consistent with what our development standards are. If you build a brand new commercial development right now your driveway space is 9 by 18.

Commissioner Green asked if the code change went back to the Planning and Zoning Board. Director Vega answered no but the variance did and they voted to approve it.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Ordinance 24-18. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

BOARD/ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

5. Appointment of Glenda Luquis-Sanchez to the Business Advisory Board (BAB) - **Commissioner Shrouder**

City Clerk Tedra Allen advised Commissioner Shrouder appointed Glenda Luquis-Sanchez to the Business Advisory Board.

6. Financial Report – Finance

CFO Irwin Williams advised the graphs presented in the backup are the eight months ended May 31, 2024. He advised the graphs list the departments and whether they are under or over budget. He advised BSO takes up 67% of our entire general fund budget. The special revenue funds are presented as well and all are within budget. As of May 31st we had \$56.3 million dollars in our cash accounts with the bulk in the Bank of America account. The investment accounts are also listed and as of May 31st we have earned \$1.2 million in interest on our investment accounts.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve the consent agenda including items 18-24. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

REGULAR AGENDA

16. Discussion and possible action on renewing and amending Resolution 20-4-1, extending the effectiveness of the Charities and Fundraiser Events list. - **Administration**

City Manager Rey said the City has a list of charities that have been approved by the Commission to prevent any ethic issues. The list has since expired and requires Commission review.

City Attorney Horowitz advised this is a requirement under the Broward County Ethics Code. When elected officials engage in charitable solicitations on behalf of a nonprofit there are certain disclosure requirements, unless the City Commission has co-sponsored or supported the charitable fundraising previously.

Commissioner Green would like to add the Honor Flight of South Florida organization.

Commissioner Shrouder suggested the Commission submit a list and adding the resolution to the Consent Agenda.

Commissioner Katzman wanted to verify that all the charities are a current 501c3 and legally up to date. He would like to add Florida's Children's First and the American Legion. He would like to update the Maccabi Games year.

Consensus was reached for the members of the Commission to each submit a list to be included for placement on the next agenda.

17. Discussion on the explanation and history of Commission Benefits – **Commissioner Shrouder**

Commissioner Shrouder said he does not take the Commission salary and instead donates it to charities. He has had several issues with this process and this led him to look into Commission benefits and where they derived from. In 2002 there was a charter amendment that states not only salaries but benefits have to be approved by ordinance. There was no ordinance that he or the City Clerk's Office was able to find other than the salary Ordinance from 2014 on pay. The backup from the 2014 ordinance includes benefits that the Commission receives but there is no ordinance ratifying the benefits. He would like to clean up the benefits that the Commission does receive and ratify it via Ordnance as required.

City Attorney Horowitz advised the Charter was amended in 2002, and subsection 3.06 states that any benefit plans to be provided to the Mayor and Commission shall first be established by Ordinance. The prior section stating that the Commission may determine any change in the monthly salary of the Mayor and Commission by ordinance, no ordinance increasing salary shall become effective until the date of the commencement of the term of the next elected regular commission.

Mayor Ross asked how they legally move forward.

City Attorney Horowitz advised with reference to the lifetime health insurance benefits for the City's former elected officials that language is included in the 2006, 2008 and 2010 personnel manuals. It is not included in the 2012 personnel manual, and that 2012 personnel manual references a change stating that benefits are no longer conferred upon anybody who was elected for the first time after January 1st of 2012. The 2012 personnel manual was adopted by resolution by the City Commission. He would like to do some additional research into the City's records. There are some Commission meetings that may be worth listening to around that time to determine the intent of the Commission.

Commissioner Green said the lifetime insurance benefits were discussed by the Charter Review Board in 2010 and he believes the question did go to the ballot.

Commissioner Shrouder said he did not find any referendum questions from 2010 regarding the benefits. His opinion is that for years the Commissions benefits were ratified in the personnel manual and when that change was made they never ratified those benefits. He wants to ratify the benefits.

Commissioner Green recalls there was a Charter Review Board convened in 2010 and one of the items discussed was the health insurance for life.

Commissioner Shrouder said there was conversations in the minutes of 2010 and the item was tabled.

Mayor Ross would like to have City Attorney Horowitz research the item.

City Attorney Horowitz said the charter speaks for itself, as it relates to benefits being provided to the Commission. They need to be first established by ordinance.

Commissioner Shrouder would like City Attorney Horowitz to come back with an ordinance codifying the benefits.

City Attorney Horowitz would like the opportunity to meet with HR to confirm what benefits the Commission does receive.

Commissioner Shrouder said the Commission is in a 457 but had questions as to the FRS.

Commissioner Green said the 401k is a voluntary benefit. He did not take the City's health insurance and instead took a stipend.

Mayor Ross said the City could have saved more money by not voting on lifetime benefits.

Commissioner Green said he voted against leaving the lifetime benefits open.

City Attorney Horowitz said he would work with the City Manager and the HR Department to get a full accounting on what the Commission's benefits are and then retrace the steps to the origin of those benefits and find out how they were initially conferred.

Commissioner Shrouder would like to codify the benefits the Commission is currently receiving.

Commissioner Green would like the research to go back to 2010.

City Manager Rey said an elected official has the chance to enroll in the health insurance for themselves or their family at a certain rate. Commissioner Shrouder's benefits were never set up correctly. We can bring back a basic ordinance with the current benefits for consideration.

Commissioner Katzman asked if the elected official's benefits are comparable to other municipalities. City Manager Rey said he believes we are in the middle.

Commissioner Shrouder said it is hard to compare to other municipalities. He has not found any ordinance adopting the elected official's benefits. He would like to ratify the benefits that were passed by resolution previously.

Commissioner Green asked how this affects the previous elected official's benefits. City Attorney Horowitz said he is not suggesting any changes.

Commissioner Katzman asked if previous elected officials do not pay for benefits for themselves and families. Commissioner Shrouder responded previous elected officials do not pay for themselves or their spouse.

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, DESIGNATING THE PROPERTY IDENTIFIED ON EXHIBIT "A," ATTACHED HERETO AND INCORPORATED HEREIN, AS SURPLUS PROPERTY PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-202 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY; DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE ANY AND ALL ACTION NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

MOTION: Commissioner moved to approve Resolution 24-18. Commissioner seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

25. Resolution 24-20 (Finance)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, RELATING TO THE PROVISION OF FIRE SERVICES, FACILITIES, AND PROGRAMS IN THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA; DESCRIBING THE METHOD OF ANNUALLY ASSESSING FIRE SERVICES COSTS AGAINST ASSESSED PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY OF COOPER CITY; DIRECTING THE PREPARATION OF AN ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ASSESSED COSTS AND ASSESSMENT RATES FOR FIRE SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025; AUTHORIZING A PUBLIC HEARING AND DIRECTING THE PROVISION OF NOTICE THEREOF; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Katzman asked City Manager Rey to walk through the change and the need. City Manager Rey said the current recovery fee for the fire assessment is 81%. The current recommendation is 100% recovery to upgrade or rebuild the fire station. The condition of the station is not what it needs to be.

This option will generate in excess \$1.1 million dollars in additional revenue that can be earmarked for the facility. The budget is balanced at the 81% so this money will not be used in operations.

Commissioner Katzman said we are currently offsetting the costs with property tax.

Commissioner Shrouder asked how this impacts the nonprofit organizations. City Manager Rey said the non-profits will not be accessed. Commissioner Green asked the increase per household. City Manager Rey said \$75 dollars annually.

Mayor Ross would be in favor of the increase with the hope and understanding that they look into reducing the millage.

Commissioner Shrouder would like people to see what they are paying for fire protection.

Mayor Ross said there has not been a decision made on whether or not they are rebuilding the fire station or building a new one. City Manager Rey said later on tonight he is recommending a study that can show what steps with the station is needed.

MOTION: Commissioner moved to approve Resolution 24-20 at 100%. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

26. Resolution 24-21 (Finance)

City Attorney Horowitz read "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, ADOPTING A PROPOSED OPERATING MILLAGE RATE OF 5.865 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2024, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; SETTING A DATE AND TIME FOR THE FIRST PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE TENTATIVE MILLAGE RATE AND TENTATIVE BUDGET AND A DATE AND TIME FOR THE FINAL PUBLIC HEARING TO ADOPT THE FINAL MILLAGE RATE AND BUDGET; PROVIDING FOR DIRECTIONS TO THE CITY MANAGER; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Commissioner Katzman moved to approve a rate of 5.8.

City Manager Rey said staff recommends 5.865 which will be about \$115,000 dollars in revenue.

Commissioner Green seconded the motion.

Commissioner Green removed the second.

Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve 5.865. Commissioner Green seconded the motion.

Commissioner Shrouder said he would like to go to 5.855 if possible.

Commissioner Green said that would be a savings of not even \$5 dollars a year.

Commissioner Katzman asked the decrease in revenue at 5.8. City Manager Rey answered \$292,000. Commissioner Katzman said we have reserve. City Manager Rey stated we have capital projects that need completed.

Mayor Ross asked for the revenue amount with a 5.8 millage.

Mayor Ross said the millage can always be reduced.

Commissioner Green said they should approve the 5.865 and CFO Williams can come back with figures.

Commissioner Shrouder said earlier tonight Commissioner Katzman spoke on the need to upgrade the playgrounds. He would like to use the additional revenue generated to upgrade the playgrounds.

Mayor Ross asked that when the playgrounds are upgraded they be handicap accessible.

Commissioner Shrouder mentioned upgrading fencing to keep the children in the playground area.

City Manager Rey said the current budget does not include the merger of departments that were recommended today at the Budget Workshops. He would like direction from the Commission so staff can include the changes in the budget.

CFO Williams said a 5.8 decrease for the millage would be about \$275,000 dollars.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Resolution 24-21. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the reorganization of the Parks and Recreation Department as proposed at the Budget Workshop at 2:30 PM.

Commissioner Green asked if this will be the last chance to speak on the merger as he was not present earlier today.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the reorganization of the Parks and Recreation Department as proposed at the Budget Workshop at 2:30 PM. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by the following roll call vote. (3-1)

Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve the reorganization of Public Works and Utilities as proposed at the Budget Workshop at 2:30 PM.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 24-16. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

28. Ordinance 24-17 (Utilities)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 8 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "GARBAGE, TRASH, AND VEGETATIVE GROWTH;" AMENDING ARTICLE II, ENTITLED "COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE AND TRASH;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 8-23, ENTITLED "COST MAY BE ADDED TO BILL FOR WATER AND SEWER SERVICE; EXEMPTION FOR PART-TIME RESIDENTS;" AMENDING CHAPTER 19 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "UTILITIES;" AMENDING ARTICLE III, ENTITLED "WATER AND WASTEWATER SYSTEMS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 19-72, ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS;" AMENDING SECTION 19-74, ENTITLED "APPLICATION FOR SERVICE;" FURTHER ARTICLE IV, ENTITLED "STORMWATER MANAGEMENT UTILITY;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 19-155, ENTITLED "STORMWATER MANAGEMENT UTILITY FEE CREATED;" AMENDING SECTION 19-157, ENTITLED "BILLING, PAYMENT, PENALTIES, AND ENFORCEMENT;" AND AMENDING SECTION 19-158, ENTITLED "ADJUSTMENT OF FEES;" PROVIDING FOR EACH OWNER OF RESIDENTIAL REAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PAYMENT OF ALL APPLICABLE UTILITY FEES INCLUDING SOLID WASTE, WATER, SEWER, AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FEES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

City Manager Rey said we are currently losing money from unpaid bills. There are a few options that the City can exercise. We can have the homeowner give their social security number so that the unpaid bill can affect credit scores or increasing the deposit.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 24-17. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

29. Ordinance 24-19 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA; AMENDING CHAPTER 12 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED, "PARKS AND RECREATION;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 12-43 ENTITLED "PARK PROPERTY;" PROHIBITING THE HOLDING OF ANY EVENT WITHIN A PUBLIC PARK WHICH CHARGES ADMISSION OR OTHERWISE PROHIBITS THE PUBLIC FROM PARTICIPATING WITHOUT AN APPROVED SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT OR AGREEMENT; PROVIDING

FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title. – Commissioner Katzman

Commissioner Katzman would like to remove the word passive in the first whereas clause of the ordinance.

City Manager Rey said when this code change is implemented any for-profit organization that is going to be used in our parks must be approved by a separate permit.

Commissioner Shrouder said this ordinance should state you cannot use the facility and charge money.

Commissioner Green said he sees private companies using courts and charging individuals. Commissioner Katzman said a permit should be required.

Commissioner Green asked if we will be policing the parks.

City Manager Rey said this change is not for revenue but for safety and compliance.

Mayor Ross wants to assure the residents are not being charged to enter the parks. In the past the Optimist tackle football program was charging individuals to attend an event at Flamingo West Park.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Ordinance 24-19 removing the word passive in the first whereas clause of the ordinance. Commissioner Shrouder seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

30. Ordinance 24-20 (Commission)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 19 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "UTILITIES;" AMENDING ARTICLE III, ENTITLED "WATER AND WASTEWATER SYSTEMS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 19-142, ENTITLED "EXTENSIONS OUTSIDE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES;" PROVIDING FOR THE CONDITIONAL APPROVAL OF CERTAIN PROSPECTIVE UTILITY CUSTOMERS LOCATED OUTSIDE OF THE CITY'S BOUNDARIES SEEKING WATER OR WASTEWATER SERVICES FROM THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title. – **Commissioner Shrouder**

Commissioner Green asked if this will address some commercial properties in the Town of Davie. City Attorney Horowitz said that is not the intent of this ordinance and there are some legal precedent issues under the case law that suggests if a municipality has a history of providing service or an intention to provide service to a particular area there's a legal duty, a legal obligation to continue providing service. So it may be difficult to limit any retroactive accounts that have been receiving service over the years but that is an open issue.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Ordinance 24-20. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

31. Ordinance 24-12 (Community Development)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "BUILDING AND BUILDING REGULATIONS;" AMENDING ARTICLE V, ENTITLED "FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION," BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 6-69, ENTITLED "APPLICABILITY;" PROVIDING FOR AN UPDATE TO THE DATE OF THE FLOOD INSURANCE STUDY AND FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAPS; PROVIDING FOR APPLICABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Ordinance 24-12. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

32. Ordinance 24-15 (Administration)

City Attorney Horowitz read "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COOPER CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE VI OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "EMPLOYEE BENEFITS;" BY SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 2-156, ENTITLED "GENERAL EMPLOYEES PENSION PLAN;" REQUIRE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE CITY'S GENERAL EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT PLAN TO BE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" by title.

Mayor Ross opened the public hearing with no one wishing to speak. Mayor Ross closed the public hearing.

MOTION: Commissioner Katzman moved to approve Ordinance 24-15. Commissioner Green seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Rey advised they have received a proposal from SCSI that can conduct a location analysis for the fire station at \$18,000 that will take about eight months. He would also like to bring the employee personnel manual to the August Commission Meeting. He would like receive some feedback from the employees in the form of a committee similar to what the City has had in the past. He also advised he will be bringing forth a recommendation for Richard Brown for District Fire Chief.

Richard Brown advised he currently works in the BSO District of Dania Beach in the Prevention Bureau. His experience with BSO has been in fire prevention and prior to that he worked for the City of Fort Lauderdale. He was also in the training bureau for three years.

Mayor Ross asked Mr. Brown his rank now. Mr. Brown answered Lieutenant.

Mayor Ross said this would be a jump over the Captain rank. Mr. Brown answered yes depending on the organization the progression of rank is slightly different. Mayor Ross asked how long he has been 12

with BSO. Mr. Brown answered nine years next month. Mayor Ross asked Mr. Brown his experience with CERT. Mr. Brown said he ran CERT for the City of Fort Lauderdale for three years and was the liaison for CERT in Deerfield Beach.

Commissioner Green asked Mr. Brown how many total years of experience he has in firefighter EMS training. Mr. Brown answered since 1986.

MOTION: Commissioner Shrouder moved to approve Richard Brown as District Fire Chief. Commissioner Katzman seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote. (4-0)

City Manager Rey said prior to his employment he scheduled travel abroad. He will in return miss the September 10th Commission Meeting. He asked for Commission direction as whether to they would like to reschedule the meeting to September 17th or have someone sit in for him.

Consensus was reached to reschedule the September 10th Commission Meeting to September 17th.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Horowitz asked for the Commission's direction to the extent that our special counsel wanted to file a bill of discovery to seek further inquiry from some of our former staff regarding the water meter issues. He also had the opportunity to speak briefly with the Finance Director following the workshop and prior to filing anything through the court system he would like special counsel to work with the Finance Department to do a cost benefit analysis to determine what the City's potential recovery might be in a best case scenario. This can evaluate whether the value was there in pursuing a lawsuit rather than spending unnecessary legal fees if there was not an opportunity to recover.

Mayor Ross asked who contacted the individuals and received word they wouldn't speak without a subpoena. City Attorney Horowitz answered he did.

Consensus was reached to file a bill of discovery.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

33. Police Chief's Report

Captain De Giovanni advised District 16 sworn personnel has walked through all of our public and charter schools with the exception of Franklin Academy which is scheduled this week. The SRO'S and SRO Supervisors did attend the NASRO School Safety Conference as well as the FASRO Conference. He also asked for the Commission's support on a Citywide School Traffic Management Plan. Since July 2022 he has been working with his team methodically going through each of the schools to implement short term solutions to positively impact the traffic flow and the safety of the schools. He would like to work now on long-term strategies. Embassy Creek Elementary has significant infrastructure challenges. He does believe the FDOT Safe Route to School grant would be a very prudent item for us to proactively pursue. He has met with BSO's grant team and has been regularly contacting FDOT. The success of the grant would require the City to have engineered plans demonstrating how we would go about improving SE Lake Boulevard. He is asking for consensus on engaging with a traffic consultant and applying for the grant through FDOT.

City Manager Rey said in his experience the grant money does take approximately four years to obtain.

Mayor Ross asked the last time BSO Police wrote and received a grant on behalf of Cooper City. Captain De Giovanni answered they have worked on and received many grants including the grant for narcan, the base grant for additional traffic enforcement, the mental health responder and the crime prevention fund.

Consensus was reached on engaging with a traffic consultant and applying for the FDOT Safe Route to School grant.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if they can potentially widen SE Lake Blvd with that grant. Captain De Giovanni said they will recommend the widening of the street.

Captain De Giovanni advised with regard to code compliance the monthly gate inspections were conducted with Kingfisher found in noncompliance but since has rectify the issue. Millcreek is still having noncompliance issues and is scheduled to appear at the August 7th Special Magistrate Hearing.

Commissioner Shrouder asked why we are not asking Mill Creek to leave their gates open or leave the community as there is a safety issue where first responders may have difficulty entering the community. Captain De Giovanni answered if he did not access the community he would definitely take those steps. He would like to receive the Special Magistrates ruling first.

Commissioner Katzman suggested also asking the community to leave the gate open if there is a safety issue. That may also compel them to fix the issue.

Captain De Giovanni said currently he can access the community so he would like to follow the Special Magistrate process.

City Manager Rey said he does not believe the Building Official can deem a community uninhabitable.

Captain De Giovanni will look into the options available but the monthly inspections are working. The last Code Enforcement sweep resulted in 119 total open cases. Out of those cases 75% were found compliant upon reinspection with 25% in noncompliance resulting in citations. If any residents have questions about the current codes they can contact Code Enforcement directly or research the code online at Coopercity.gov. On June 26th the Priority Service Unit was patrolling the Walmart Plaza and apprehended a suspect that was actively looking into vehicles and detained him for a warrant arrest. The STARS grant program did officially close on June 30th with Rock Creek and Sienna going online. Embassy Lakes, Diamond Head, Country Glen and Temple Beth Emit will be integrated shortly. He also thanked the Commission and Mayor for providing the funding to equip each of the Deputies with an AED machine that helped save a gentleman's life recently. He thanked Deputy Hernandez, Deputy Martinez and Deputy Williams who were also selected as the Employees of the month of June. The Police Explorers attended the FSEA Conference last month and took third place in building searches and tactics. National Night Out will be held on August 5th and Crafting with a Cop will be held on August 6th. On August 7th District 16 will be hosting an Escape Room where 64 Cooper City residents will have 45 minutes to escape from jail. On August 9th in conjunction with the City District 16 will host an event with demonstrations and apparatuses for the public.

Commissioner Shrouder previously asked Captain De Giovanni and the City Attorney to look into some of the statutory changes to code enforcement and associations. City Attorney Horowitz advised his office is preparing some legal memorandums on the updates. Commissioner Shrouder would like to do certain code enforcement in certain associations. If these additional enforcements require more manpower he would support that.

Commissioner Katzman said he would like to enforce the street parking update that was just passed to help emergency vehicles pass.

Captain De Giovanni said if swale parking is not permitted in certain HOA's this pushes vehicles into roadways that are not wide enough for double parking. He believes there needs to be an open conversation with HOA's on the conflicts with city code.

Commissioner Shrouder said Code Enforcement can only fine up to \$1,000 dollars. He spoke on community's double parking. He believes there are some issues that are worth having our Code Enforcement Officers pursue. He spoke on lose dogs in one association in Rock Creek and how the HOA does not have the power to enforce anything. Captain De Giovanni advised they encourage the HOA'S to contact District 16 and also encourage them to send a notification to the homeowner and then Code Enforcement can work with the HOA. If the Commission wants him to change that approach he would like the opportunity to do a cost analysis as it will be very labor intensive.

City Manager Rey said they would need to work with legal as the property inside the HOA's are private but we need to work with the HOA's to address certain parking issues.

Commissioner Shrouder said there are certain items that just passed including HOA's not citing for commercial vehicles.

Commissioner Katzman asked that the Police Explorers attend the next Commission meeting if they are available to honor their achievements. He also asked if the National Night Out requires registration. Captain De Giovanni answered no.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

34. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Harrington advised the Cooper City CERT Program Manager Donna Waskiewicz is being recognized as the Broward Sheriff's Office Citizen of the Year. Ms. Waskiewicz works tirelessly to obtain new CERT members, providing training and conducting hands on CPR classes. Ms. Waskiewicz will recognized at an awards ceremony on August 6th at 1:30 PM at Bailey Hall at Broward College. Ms. Waskiewicz said it is an honor to volunteer for the City and thanked Chief Harrington for nominating her for the award as there are others out there far more deserving. On June 15th thanks to the AEDS in Deputy's vehicles proved to be lifesaving. Deputies Demetris Williams, Christopher Gonzalez, and Deputy Jerry Martinez used the AED on a cardiac arrest incident. The patient was transported to the hospital and is recovering in ICU. He thanked the Commission for providing the AED's in the police vehicles as it was a great collaboration between Police and Fire.

Commissioner Shrouder asked if this meeting will be Chief Harrington's last meeting. City Manager Rey answered it is very likely and thanked Chief Harrington for his constant professionalism.

Commissioner Shrouder said as Fire Chief, he has acquired more resources and apparatuses than any of his predecessors combined. He believes he has done a tremendous amount for fire safety in the City and appreciates his work.

Commissioner Katzman thanked Chief Harrington for his help and kindness. Allowing him to join in on ride alongs and being a major part of the community. He thanked him for his service and his efforts on helping the City obtain the fire apparatuses.

Commissioner Green thanked Chief Harrington for his professionalism at every Commission meeting as well as his service and all he has represented in the City.

Mayor Ross asked that the information for the award ceremony honoring Ms. Waskiewicz be sent to the Commission. He asked the response time on the AED call. Chief Harrington will relay the information to the Mayor. Mayor Ross asked the last time BSO Fire applied and received a grant on behalf of Cooper City. Chief Harrington said the grants BSO Fire pursues are regional asset grants that Cooper City benefits from. Mayor Ross is not asking about regional grants. Chief Harrington said that BSO cannot write a grant for the City.

Commissioner Shrouder said Chief Harrington just attended a seminar for appropriations.

Mayor Ross said the contract with BSO requires BSO to write grants on our behalf. Mayor Ross asked if Chief Harrington has personally applied for grants on behalf of the City. Chief Harrington answered no.

Mayor Ross read a section of the BSO contract that states BSO shall cooperate with the City and aggressively pursue additional grant program funds as they become available. Mayor Ross thanked Chief Harrington for his service.

COMMISSIONERS' CONCERNS/REPORTS/ITEMS TO BE PLACED ON NEXT AGENDA

Commissioner Green spoke on the manner in which the Commission speaks to individuals on the dais. He thanked Chief Harrington for his service and congratulated Ms. Waskiewicz for her award and work on behalf of the City.

Commissioner Shrouder thanked Chief Harrington for his service.

Commissioner Katzman welcomed new Fire Chief Brown and thanked Chief Harrington. He thanked BSO Law Enforcement for the last Crafting with a Cop event. His family had a great time. He also thanked the City Manager and staff for a wonderful job on the budget preparation. He also congratulated Ms. Waskiewicz and all the CERT members for all their hard work.

Mayor Ross congratulated Ms. Waskiewicz and is very proud of her hard work. He also spoke on the importance of response times listed on the Fire Chiefs report. He thanked Chief Harrington for his work on behalf of the City.
