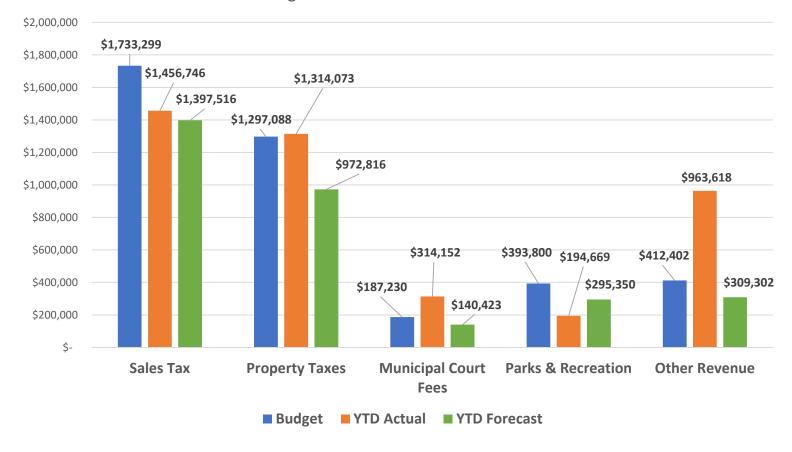

Budget to Actual Revenues - June 2025



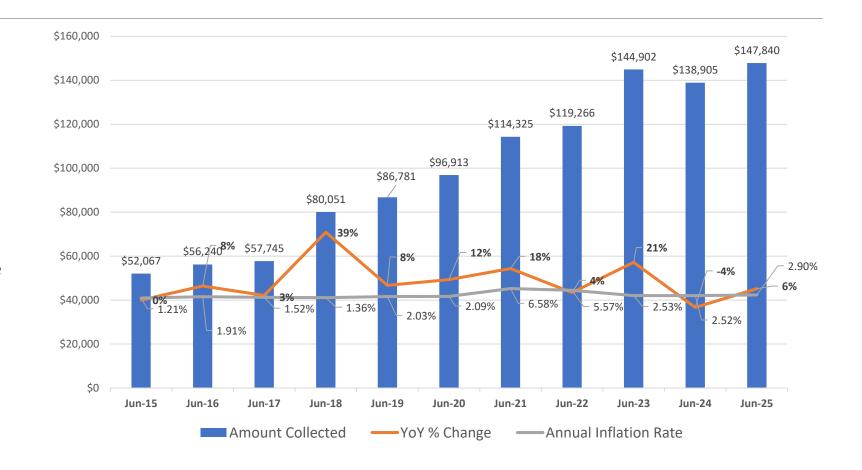
General Fund YTD Comparison

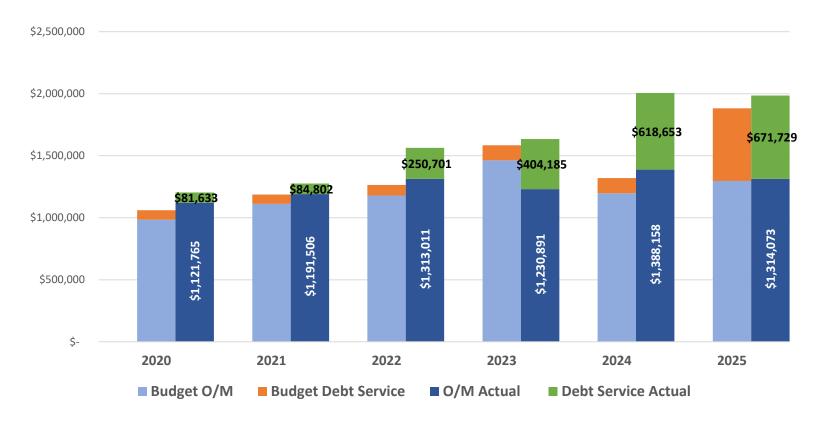
- **Blue** = Total amount budgeted for the year

- Sales tax collections for the month of June totaled \$154,628 (includes sales and liquor tax) compared to last year, total collected for the month of June 2024 was \$145,899.
- Property tax collections for the month of June totaled \$4,389 compared to last June 2024, total collected was \$5,954
- Other Revenue includes municipal court, parks and recreation and other misc. revenue. Court Collection Fees for the month of June totaled \$39,132 compared to last June 2024, total collected was \$13,770

Comparison of Annual Collections for the Month of June.

Sales taxes up 6.4% in June.

- Sales tax collection for the month of June totaled \$147,839.52. This represents an increase of 6.43%, or \$8,935, compared to last year.
- Through June, sales tax collections are up \$74,020, or 5.58%, from the prior year.
- Collections for this month represent sales that took place in April.





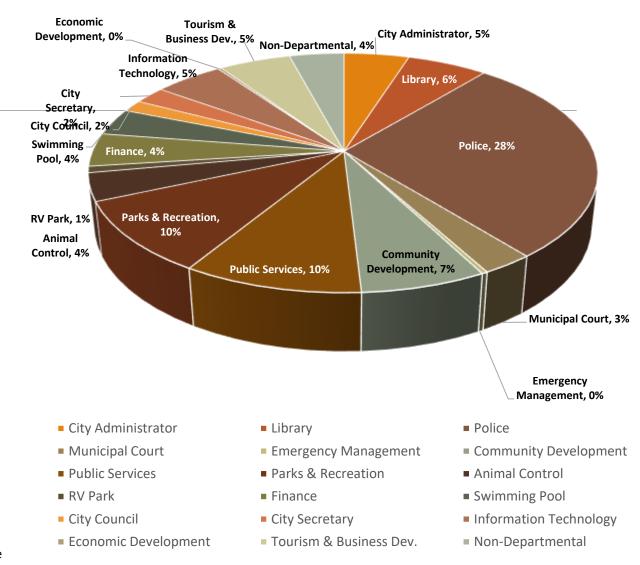
Property Tax Collections

- Current property tax collections are 101.31% of the original budget at this point of the fiscal year. This includes ad valorem, delinquent and penalties and interest. We have collected 98.35% of the total tax levy.
- Taxes become delinquent on February 1st.
 January is the last month to pay without penalties.
- Delinquent property taxes represent collections on prior year levies. Penalty and interest are being collected on prior year taxes.
- Total property tax collections year to date including prior year collections, as well as penalties and interest for June are \$1,314,073.

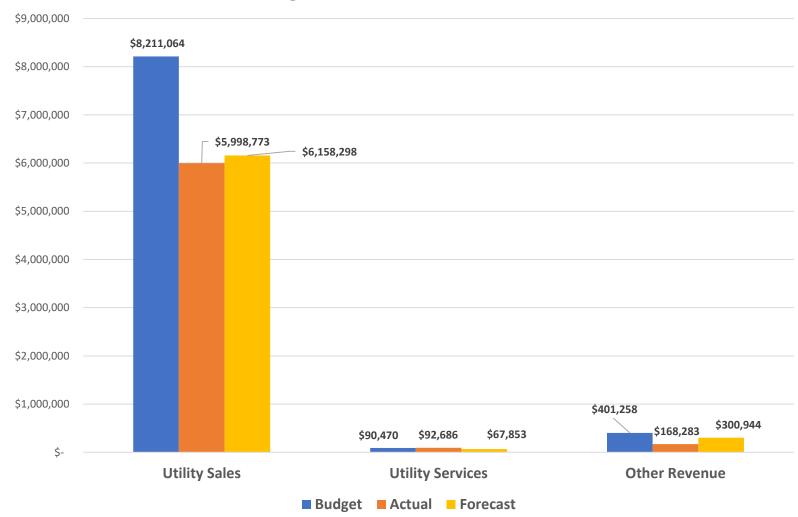

Utility Fund Revenues (June 2025)

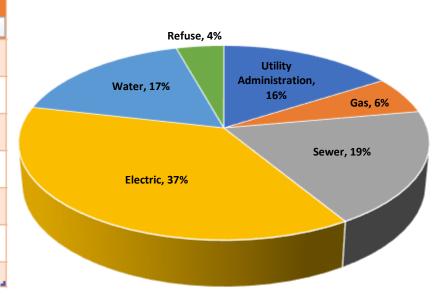
- Currently collected \$703,274 in utility revenues for the month of June 2025.

Budget to Actual Revenues - June 2025

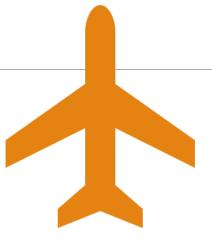

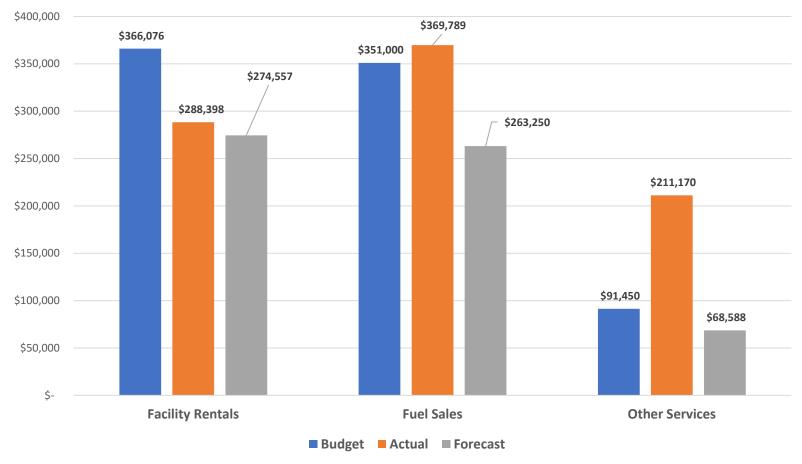


- The above graph represents YTD actual expenditures by department.

Airport Fund

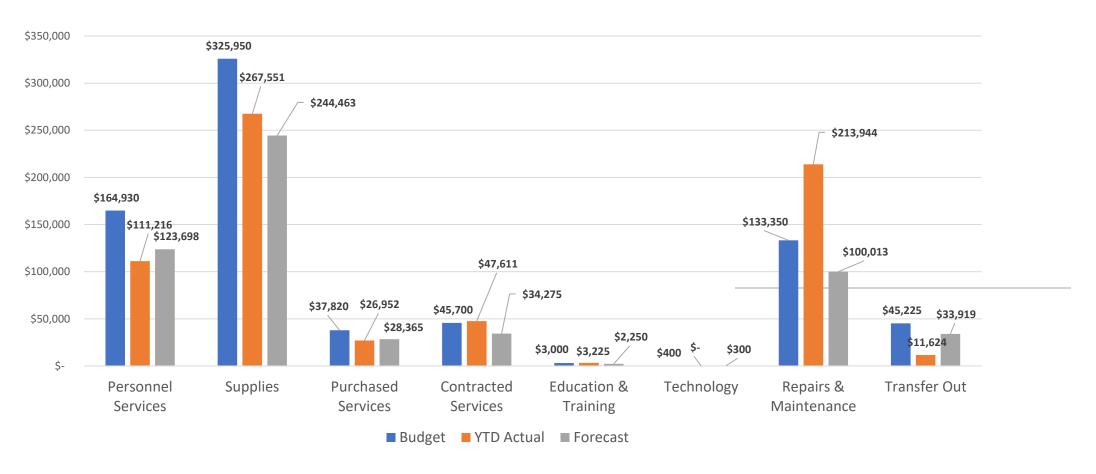
Budget to Actual Revenues - June 2025

Municipal Court Report

Key Findings:

- The above data represents the number of ticket violations for the month of June 2021-2025.
- 467 Traffic Violation in 2025 a 577% increase over 2024 (69 cases).
- This is the largest single-year increase and the highest traffic case count in the five-year span.
- State Law Violations remain stable.
- City Ordinance Violations are growing. Increased from 0 cases in 2021-2022 to 6 cases in 2025.
- Parking Violations show minimal change.
- 2025 overall represents a shift in enforcement patterns.
